Senate Substitute Amendment 1

2019 SENATE BILL 163

2019 Senate Bill 163 provides felony penalties for intentionally causing bodily harm to a nurse or to an individual acting under the supervision of a nurse. Under the bill, a person is guilty of a Class H felony if all of the following apply:

- The person intentionally causes bodily harm to a nurse, or to an individual acting under the supervision of a nurse.
- The nurse, or person acting under the nurse's supervision, is acting in his or her professional capacity.
- The person knows or has reason to know that the victim is a nurse or an individual acting under the supervision of a nurse.

SENATE SUBSTITUTE AMENDMENT 1

Senate Substitute Amendment 1 to Senate Bill 163 contains the provisions providing felony penalties for intentionally causing bodily harm to a nurse or to an individual acting under the supervision of a nurse under the circumstances described above. In addition, the substitute amendment expands the scope of a provision that provides enhanced penalties for intentionally causing bodily harm to an emergency department worker under current law, to also include intentionally causing bodily harm to a health care provider who works in a hospital.

BILL HISTORY

Senator Kooyenga offered Senate Substitute Amendment 1 to 2019 Senate Bill 163 on October 17, 2019.¹ On November 5, 2019, the Senate adopted Senate Substitute Amendment 1 and passed the bill, as amended, both on voice votes.
