



1995 ASSEMBLY BILL 856

February 5, 1996 - Introduced by Representatives ROBSON, WIRCH, BLACK, L. YOUNG, HUBER, BAUMGART, BOYLE, PLOMBON, SCHNEIDER, MORRIS-TATUM, BALDWIN, TRAVIS and R. YOUNG, cosponsored by Senators CHVALA and DECKER. Referred to Special committee on State-Federal Relations.

1 **AN ACT to repeal** 16.548, 20.923 (4) (c) 1., 20.923 (6) (ah) and 230.08 (2) (y); and
2 **to amend** 16.003 (2) of the statutes; **relating to:** the elimination of the
3 federal-state relations office.

Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

Under current law, the department of administration (DOA) is authorized to maintain a federal-state relations office in Washington, D.C., for the purpose of promoting federal-state cooperation. This bill eliminates DOA's authority to maintain a federal-state relations office in Washington, D.C.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

4 **SECTION 1.** 16.003 (2) of the statutes is amended to read:
5 16.003 (2) STAFF. Except as provided in ss. ~~16.548~~, 16.57, 978.03 (1), (1m) and
6 (2), 978.04 and 978.05 (8) (b), the secretary shall appoint the staff necessary for
7 performing the duties of the department. All staff shall be appointed under the
8 classified service except as otherwise provided by law.
9 **SECTION 2.** 16.548 of the statutes is repealed.
10 **SECTION 3.** 20.923 (4) (c) 1. of the statutes is repealed.
