- AN ACT to amend 144.942 (4) of the statutes; relating to: drilling beneath the
- 2 beds of the Great Lakes and other waters to explore for or produce oil or gas.

Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

Under current law, no person may drill to explore for or produce oil or gas from beneath the beds of the Great Lakes or bays or harbors that are adjacent to the Great Lakes unless that drilling is conducted from the shore and pursuant to a written lease from the department of natural resources.

Under this bill, no person may drill to explore for or produce oil or gas from beneath the beds of the Great Lakes or bays or harbors that are adjacent to the Great Lakes.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

- **Section 1.** 144.942 (4) of the statutes is amended to read:
- 4 144.942 (4) No person may conduct drilling operations for the exploration for or production of oil or gas from beneath the beds of the Great Lakes or bays or harbors
- 6 that are adjacent to the Great Lakes, unless all drilling operations originate from
- 7 locations above and on the landward side of the ordinary high-water mark and are
