1995 SENATE BILL 83

February 23, 1995 – Introduced by Senator BRESKE, cosponsored by Representative HANDRICK. Referred to Committee on Health, Human Services and Aging.

1 AN ACT relating to: emergency youth aids and making an appropriation.

Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

Under current law relating to community youth and family aids (generally referred to as "youth aids"), the department of health and social services (DHSS) allocates various state and federal funds to counties to pay for state-provided juvenile correctional services and local delinquency-related services. Currently, a certain amount of youth aids funds is allocated specifically for emergencies related to youth aids in counties that have a population of not more than 45,000. This bill directs DHSS to distribute \$300,000 in emergency youth aids funds in fiscal year 1995–96 to a county that has a population of not more than 45,000 and that has wholly or partially within its boundaries a federally recognized Indian reservation to reimburse that county for expenses incurred in 1994 for emergencies related to youth aids.

SECTION 1. Nonstatutory provisions; health and social services.

(1) EMERGENCY YOUTH AIDS. Of the amounts appropriated to the department

4 of health and social services under section 20.435 (3) (cd) of the statutes, the

5 department shall distribute \$300,000 in fiscal year 1995–96 to a county that has a

6 population of not more than 45,000 and that has wholly or partially within its

boundaries a federally recognized Indian reservation in reimbursement of expenses
 incurred by that county in 1994 for emergencies related to community youth and
 family aids under section 46.26 of the statutes.

SECTION 2. Appropriation changes; health and social services.

5 (1) EMERGENCY YOUTH AIDS. In the schedule under section 20.005 (3) of the 6 statutes for the appropriation to the department of health and social services under 7 section 20.435 (3) (cd) of the statutes, as affected by the acts of 1995, the dollar 8 amount is increased by \$300,000 for fiscal year 1995-96 to increase funding for 9 emergencies related to community youth and family aids under section 46.26 of the 10 statutes in a county that has a population of not more than 45,000 and that has 11 wholly or partially within its boundaries a federally recognized Indian reservation.

SECTION 3. Effective date.

(1) EMERGENCY YOUTH AIDS. This act takes effect on July 1, 1995, or on the day
after publication, whichever is later.
