1997 ASSEMBLY BILL 728

January 20, 1998 – Introduced by Representatives Hutchison, Jensen, F. Lasee, Grothman, Turner, Walker and Wasserman, cosponsored by Senators Huelsman and A. Lasee. Referred to Joint survey committee on Tax Exemptions.

AN ACT *to amend* 77.51 (21m) of the statutes; **relating to:** a sales tax and use tax exemption for providing access to, or use of, the internet.

Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

This bill creates a sales tax and use tax exemption for access to, and use of, the internet.

This bill will be referred to the joint survey committee on tax exemptions for a detailed analysis, which will be printed as an appendix to this bill.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

Section 1. 77.51 (21m) of the statutes is amended to read:

77.51 (21m) "Telecommunications services" means sending messages and information transmitted through the use of local, toll and wide-area telephone service; channel services; telegraph services; teletypewriter; computer exchange services; cellular mobile telecommunications service; specialized mobile radio;

stationary two-way radio; paging service; or any other form of mobile and portable one-way or two-way communications; or any other transmission of messages or information by electronic or similar means between or among points by wire, cable, fiber optics, laser, microwave, radio, satellite orsimilar facilities. "Telecommunications services" does not include sending collect telecommunications that are received outside of the state. In this subsection, "computer exchange services" does not include providing access to or use of the internet. In this subsection, "internet" means interconnecting networks that are connected to network access points by telecommunications services.

SECTION 2. Effective date.

(1) This act takes effect on the first day of the 2nd month beginning after publication.
