 AN ACT to repeal 20.435 (5) (bc), 20.435 (5) (jz), 20.435 (5) (p) and 49.665; to

 to affect 1997 Wisconsin Act 27, section 9132 (7c); relating to: the elimination

 of the badger care program.

Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

1997 Wisconsin Act 27 (the budget act) created a health care program, known as the badger care program, for low-income families without access to employer subsidized health care coverage. Under that program, the department of health and family services is required to provide to eligible low-income families the same health services and benefits that are provided under the medical assistance program.

This bill eliminates the badger care program.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

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SECTION 1. 20.435 (1) (bm) of the statutes, as affected by 1997 Wisconsin Act

6 27, is amended to read:

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1	20.435 (1) (bm) Medical assistance administration. Biennially, the amounts
2	in the schedule to provide the state share of administrative contract costs for the
3	medical assistance program under ss. <u>s.</u> 49.45 and 49.665 and to reimburse insurers
4	for their costs under s. 49.475. No state positions may be funded in the department
5	of health and family services from this appropriation, except positions for the
6	performance of duties under a contract in effect before January 1, 1987, related to
7	the administration of the medical assistance program between the subunit of the
8	department primarily responsible for administering themedical assistance program
9	and another subunit of the department. Total administrative funding authorized for
10	the program under s. 49.665 may not exceed 10% of the amounts budgeted under sub.
11	(5) (bc) and (p).
12	SECTION 2. 20.435 (5) (o) of the statutes, as affected by 1997 Wisconsin Act 27,
13	is amended to read:
14	20.435 (5) (o) Federal aid; medical assistance. All federal moneys received for
15	meeting costs of medical assistance administered under ss. <u>s.</u> 49.45 and 49.665 .
16	SECTION 3. 20.435 (5) (bc) of the statutes, as created by 1997 Wisconsin Act 27,
17	is repealed.
18	SECTION 4. 20.435 (5) (jz) of the statutes, as created by 1997 Wisconsin Act 27,
19	is repealed.
20	SECTION 5. 20.435 (5) (p) of the statutes, as created by 1997 Wisconsin Act 27,
21	594mm, is repealed.
22	SECTION 6. 49.46 (1) (a) 11. of the statutes, as affected by 1997 Wisconsin Act
23	27, is amended to read:
24	49.46 (1) (a) 11. If a waiver under s. 49.665 is granted and in effect, any child
25	not described under subd. 1. who has attained the age of 6 but has not attained the

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1	age of 19 and whose family income does not exceed 100% of the poverty line for a
2	family the size of the child's family. If a waiver under s. 49.665 is not granted or in
3	effect, any Any child not described in subd. 1. who was born after September 30,1983,
4	who has attained the age of 6 but has not attained the age of 19 and whose family
5	income does not exceed 100% of the poverty line for a family the size of the child's
6	family.
7	SECTION 7. 49.665 of the statutes, as created by 1997 Wisconsin Act 27, is
8	repealed.
9	SECTION 8. 1997 Wisconsin Act 27, section 9132 (7c) is repealed.
