## **1997 SENATE BILL 152**

April 9, 1997 – Introduced by Senators Adelman, Clausing, C. Potter, Moen and Wirch, cosponsored by Representatives Notestein, Huber, Baldwin, Baumgart, Meyer, Black, Carpenter, R. Young, Riley, Bock, Boyle and Springer. Referred to Committee on Judiciary, Campaign Finance Reform and Consumer Affairs.

AN ACT to create 20.510 (1) (d) of the statutes; relating to: qualification of candidates for justice of the supreme court for grants from the Wisconsin election campaign fund and making an appropriation.

## Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

Currently, a candidate for the office of justice of the supreme court in the spring election may qualify for a grant from the Wisconsin election campaign fund to finance certain campaign expenses. The amount of the grant depends upon the balance in the supreme court account of the fund, which receives 8% of the total amount designated by taxpayers in the year preceding each election for the office of justice. If sufficient moneys are available in the account, a candidate for the office of justice may potentially qualify to receive a grant of \$97,031.

This bill appropriates a sum sufficient from general purpose revenue to enable all eligible candidates for the office of justice to receive the maximum grant to which they are entitled. The proposal is effective for grants made on or after January 1, 1999.

SECTION 1.	20.510	(1)(d)	of the	statutes is	created to	read:

20.510 (1) (d) *Grants for candidates for justice*. A sum sufficient to supplement the supreme court account of the Wisconsin election campaign fund for the purpose of enabling all eligible candidates for justice to receive the maximum grant for which the candidates qualify under s. 11.50 (9), to be transferred to the Wisconsin election campaign fund no later than the time specified in s. 11.50 (5).

## SECTION 2. Effective date.

(1) This act takes effect on January 1, 1999.
