## **1997 SENATE BILL 185**

April 30, 1997 – Introduced by Senators JAUCH, CLAUSING, WINEKE, BRESKE, MOEN, SCHULTZ, ROESSLER, PANZER and DECKER, cosponsored by Representatives HARSDORF, HASENOHRL, KRUG, M. LEHMAN, LADWIG, ALBERS, POWERS, FREESE, PLOUFF, SYKORA, WOOD, OTT, SERATTI, PORTER, HANSON, SKINDRUD, GRONEMUS, SCHAFER, LA FAVE, VRAKAS and J. LEHMAN. Referred to Committee on Judiciary, Campaign Finance Reform and Consumer Affairs.

1 AN ACT to create 100.18 (10r) and 100.26 (4m) of the statutes; relating to:

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misrepresentations of the locations of businesses and providing a penalty.

## Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

The current fraudulent representations law prohibits untrue, deceptive or misleading representations that relate to the purchase, sale, hire, use or lease of real estate, merchandise, securities, employment or services.

Under this bill, it is deceptive and misleading for a person that is not conducting business in a region or location to use the name or description of the community or region in its corporate or trade name or in other information given to the public if the use of the name or description is to create the misrepresentation that the business is located in the community or region.

## The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

- **SECTION 1.** 100.18 (10r) of the statutes is created to read:
- 4 100.18 (10r) It is deceptive and misleading for a person who is conducting
- 5 business in a community or region from a location outside that community or region

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1	to use the name of the community or region, or other description of the community
2	or region, in the corporate or trade name of the business or in any other information
3	that is published if the the use of the name or description of the location creates the
4	misrepresentation that the business is located in the community or region.
5	<b>SECTION 2.</b> 100.26 (4m) of the statutes is created to read:
6	100.26 (4m) Any person who violates s. 100.18 (10r) is subject to a civil
7	forfeiture of not less than \$100 nor more than \$10,000 for each violation
