## **1997 SENATE BILL 319**

October 15, 1997 - Introduced by Senators Wirch, Schultz and Roessler, cosponsored by Representatives Ziegelbauer, Ott, Musser, Gronemus, Turner, F. Lasee, Goetsch, Sykora, Porter and Williams. Referred to Committee on Health, Human Services, Aging, Corrections, Veterans and Military Affairs.

- 1 AN ACT to amend 146.83 (4) (b); and to create 146.83 (1m) of the statutes;
- 2 **relating to:** release of patient health care records to the patient's health care
- 3 provider.

## Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

Under current law, no person may conceal or withhold a patient health care record with the intent to prevent its release to the patient, to the patient's guardian or to a person who has the informed consent of the patient.

This bill provides that no person may conceal or withhold a patient health care record with the intent to prevent its release to the patient's health care provider with the informed consent of the patient.

The bill also requires that a copy of a patient's health care records be released without charge to the patient's health care provider upon request with a statement of informed consent.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

**Section 1.** 146.83 (1m) of the statutes is created to read:

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| 146.83 (1m) Notwithstanding sub. (1) (b), a patient's health care records shall    |
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| be provided without charge to the patient's health care provider upon request with |
| a statement of informed consent.   |
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**Section 2.** 146.83 (4) (b) of the statutes is amended to read:

146.83 (4) (b) Conceal or withhold a patient health care record with intent to prevent or obstruct an investigation or prosecution or with intent to prevent its release to the patient, to his or her guardian appointed under ch. 880, to his or her health care provider with a statement of informed consent or to a person with the a statement of informed written consent of the patient or with intent to prevent or obstruct an investigation or prosecution.
