1999 ASSEMBLY BILL 285

April 22, 1999 - Introduced by Representatives Plouff, J. Lehman, Gronemus, Kreuser and Wasserman. Referred to Committee on Ways and Means.

AN ACT to create 121.91 (4) (h) of the statutes; relating to: increasing a school district's revenue limit for expenditures related to participation of pupils in statewide tournaments and competitions.

Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

Current law limits the increase in the total amount of revenue that a school district may receive from general school aids and property taxes to approximately \$209 per pupil in the 1998–99 school year and, in subsequent school years, to the amount of revenue increase allowed per pupil in the previous school year increased by the percentage change in the consumer price index. Several exceptions exist. For example, if a school district increases the services that it provides by adding responsibility for providing a service transferred to it from another governmental unit, its revenue limit is increased by the cost of that service.

This bill increases a school district's revenue limit in any school year by the amount spent by the school district in the previous school year for participation of pupils in statewide tournaments and competitions.
