4	Whereas, Professor Welty received his Ph.D. from the University of Chicago
5	and was a distinguished professor of biology at Beloit College for over 30 years,
6	retiring in 1966; and
7	Whereas, he became a world-renowned ornithologist and wrote an outstanding
8	textbook, The Life of Birds, which was widely used by colleges and universities for
9	many years; and
10	Whereas, Professor Welty was a great humanitarian, spending nearly a year,
11	in 1947, as team leader of a group helping to rebuild Koblenz, Germany, helping
12	thousands of desperate children and adults, and risking his life against rampant
13	disease and a brutally cold winter with no heat or electricity; and
14	Whereas, the city of Koblenz honored Professor Welty by naming a street after

5	center after him; and
