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## **2001 SENATE BILL 420**

AN ACT to create 146.10 of the statutes; relating to: authorizing a retail establishment to adopt a policy permitting exclusion of a customer who is not properly attired.

## Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

This bill authorizes the owner or operator of a retail establishment to adopt a policy that may require that a customer be excluded from the establishment if the customer is not properly attired.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

**Section 1.** 146.10 of the statutes is created to read:

146.10 Policy of a retail establishment concerning proper attire. (1) In this section, "retail establishment" means any store or shop in which retail sales is the principal business conducted and includes a restaurant, as defined in s. 254.61 (5).

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(2) The owner or operator of a retail establishment may adopt a policy for the
retail establishment under which a customer may be excluded from the retail
establishment if the customer is not properly attired.
(3) Section 939.61 does not apply to a violation of a policy adopted under sub
(2).
