2003 SENATE BILL 502

February 26, 2004 – Introduced by Senators Lassa, Carpenter, Hansen and Wirch, cosponsored by Representatives Turner, Richards, Hebl, Taylor, Plouff, Morris, Kreuser, Shilling, Boyle, F. Lasee, Hubler, Pocan, Pope-Roberts, Vruwink, Musser, Miller, Molepske, Balow, Krug, Albers and Staskunas. Referred to Committee on Economic Development, Job Creation and Housing.

AN ACT relating to: requiring a study by the Legislative Audit Bureau.

Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

This bill requires the Legislative Audit Bureau to conduct a study of all economic development programs available in this state. The study must include an analysis of economic development needs as derived from official data and a list of deficient, outmoded, or redundant programs.

For further information see the *state* fiscal estimate, which will be printed as an appendix to this bill.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. Nonstatutory provisions.

(1) Economic development study. The joint legislative audit committee shall direct the legislative audit bureau, in consultation with the joint legislative council staff and a private consultant hired by the legislative audit bureau, to conduct a study of all economic development programs available in this state under state and federal law and municipal ordinances. The study shall include an analysis of

economic development needs as derived from official data and a list of deficient, outmoded, or redundant programs. The study shall identify the areas of the state where money for economic development is being spent and the areas of the state that have the greatest need for economic development. No later than September 1, 2004, the legislative audit bureau shall submit the results of the study to the chief clerk of each house of the legislature for distribution to the legislature under section 13.172 (2) of the statutes and shall publish the results to the general public, including publishing the results in an electronic format.
