## 2005 ASSEMBLY BILL 273

March 28, 2005 – Introduced by Representatives BERCEAU, GUNDERSON, JENSEN, ALBERS, JESKEWITZ, LEHMAN, GRONEMUS, CULLEN, SHERIDAN, MUSSER, BLACK, MOLEPSKE, TRAVIS and SEIDEL. Referred to Committee on Education.

1 AN ACT to amend 118.12 (2) (a) of the statutes; relating to: chaperoning pupils

on school-sponsored trips.

## Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

Current law prohibits a school district employee from receiving for his or her personal benefit anything of value from any person other than the employing school district to sell, promote the sale of, or act as an agent for the sale of any goods or services to any pupil while on school property or at a school–sponsored activity.

This bill allows a school district employee to accept free or reduced-price travel or accommodations for the purpose of chaperoning pupils on a trip that is developed and sponsored by the school district.

## The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

- **SECTION 1.** 118.12 (2) (a) of the statutes is amended to read:
- 4 118.12 (2) (a) No school district employee may receive for his or her personal

5 benefit anything of value from any person other than his or her employing school

- 6 district to sell, promote the sale of, or act as an agent or solicitor for the sale of any
- 7 goods or services to any public school pupil while on the property of his or her

1 employing school district or at an activity of his or her employing school district. <u>This</u>

2 paragraph does not prohibit a school district employee from accepting free or

3 reduced-price travel or accommodations for the purpose of chaperoning pupils on a

- 4 <u>trip that is developed and sponsored by the school district.</u>
