

State of Misconsin 2007 - 2008 LEGISLATURE

2007 ASSEMBLY BILL 169

March 12, 2007 – Introduced by Representatives NERISON, VAN ROY, SHERIDAN, A. OTT, HAHN, BALLWEG, FRISKE, GRONEMUS, HINES, JESKEWITZ, MURSAU, MUSSER, OWENS, SINICKI, STONE and TOWNSEND, cosponsored by Senators LASSA, ROESSLER and SCHULTZ. Referred to Committee on Transportation.

AN ACT to amend 341.14 (1a), 341.14 (1e) (a), 341.14 (1m), 341.14 (1q) and 343.51 (1) of the statutes; relating to: obtaining a special registration plate for disabled persons.

Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

Under current law, a person may obtain a special registration plate or temporary certification that allows the person to park in spaces reserved for disabled drivers if the person provides the Department of Transportation with certification from a physician, an advanced practice nurse licensed to practice nursing in any state, a physician assistant licensed or certified to practice in any state, a chiropractor licensed to practice chiropractic in any state, or a Christian Science practitioner stating that the person has a disability that limits his or her ability to walk. This bill allows a public health nurse to provide the necessary certification to enable a person to obtain a special registration plate or temporary certification for disabled drivers.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

- 4 **SECTION 1.** 341.14 (1a) of the statutes is amended to read:
- 5 341.14 (1a) If any resident of this state, who is registering or has registered an
- 6 automobile, or a motor truck, dual purpose motor home or dual purpose farm truck

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which has a gross weight of not more than 8,000 pounds, a farm truck which has a 1 $\mathbf{2}$ gross weight of not more than 12,000 pounds or a motor home, submits a statement 3 once every 4 years, as determined by the department, from a physician licensed to 4 practice medicine in any state, from an advanced practice nurse licensed to practice 5 nursing in any state, from a public health nurse certified or licensed to practice in any state, from a physician assistant licensed or certified to practice in any state. 6 7 from a chiropractor licensed to practice chiropractic in any state, or from a Christian 8 Science practitioner residing in this state and listed in the Christian Science journal 9 certifying to the department that the resident is a person with a disability that limits 10 or impairs the ability to walk, the department shall procure, issue and deliver to the 11 disabled person plates of a special design in lieu of plates which ordinarily would be 12issued for the vehicle, and shall renew the plates. The plates shall be so designed as 13to readily apprise law enforcement officers of the fact that the vehicle is owned by a 14nonveteran disabled person and is entitled to the parking privileges specified in s. 15346.50 (2a). No charge in addition to the registration fee shall be made for the 16 issuance or renewal of such plates.

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SECTION 2. 341.14 (1e) (a) of the statutes is amended to read:

18 341.14 (1e) (a) If any resident of this state, who is registering or has registered 19 a motorcycle, submits a statement once every 4 years, as determined by the 20department, from a physician licensed to practice medicine in any state, from an 21advanced practice nurse licensed to practice nursing in any state, from a public 22health nurse certified or licensed to practice in any state, from a physician assistant 23licensed or certified to practice in any state, from a chiropractor licensed to practice $\mathbf{24}$ chiropractic in any state, from a Christian Science practitioner residing in this state and listed in the Christian Science journal, or from the U.S. department of veterans 25

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affairs certifying to the department that the resident is a person with a disability 1 2 that limits or impairs the ability to walk, the department shall procure, issue and 3 deliver to the disabled person a plate of a special design in lieu of the plate which 4 ordinarily would be issued for the motorcycle, and shall renew the plate. The $\mathbf{5}$ statement shall state whether the disability is permanent or temporary and, if 6 temporary, the opinion of the physician, advanced practice nurse, public health 7 nurse, physician assistant, chiropractor, practitioner, or U.S. department of veterans 8 affairs as to the duration of the disability. The plate shall be so designed as to readily 9 apprise law enforcement officers of the fact that the motorcycle is owned by a 10 disabled person and is entitled to the parking privileges specified in s. 346.50 (2a). 11 No charge in addition to the registration fee may be made for the issuance or renewal 12of the plate.

13 **SECTION 3.** 341.14 (1m) of the statutes is amended to read:

14 341.14 (1m) If any licensed driver submits to the department a statement once 15every 4 years, as determined by the department, from a physician licensed to practice medicine in any state, from a public health nurse certified or licensed to practice in 16 17any state, from an advanced practice nurse licensed to practice nursing in any state, 18 from a physician assistant licensed or certified to practice in any state, from a chiropractor licensed to practice chiropractic in any state, or from a Christian 19 20 Science practitioner residing in this state and listed in the Christian Science journal 21certifying that another person who is regularly dependent on the licensed driver for 22transportation is a person with a disability that limits or impairs the ability to walk, 23the department shall issue and deliver to the licensed driver plates of a special design 24in lieu of the plates which ordinarily would be issued for the automobile or motor truck, dual purpose motor home or dual purpose farm truck having a gross weight 25

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of not more than 8,000 pounds, farm truck having a gross weight of not more than 12,000 pounds or motor home, and shall renew the plates. The plates shall be so designed as to readily apprise law enforcement officers of the fact that the vehicle is operated by a licensed driver on whom a disabled person is regularly dependent and is entitled to the parking privileges specified in s. 346.50 (2a). No charge in addition to the registration fee may be made for the issuance or renewal of the plates. The plates shall conform to the plates required in sub. (1a).

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SECTION 4. 341.14 (1q) of the statutes is amended to read:

9 341.14 (1q) If any employer who provides an automobile, or a motor truck, dual 10 purpose motor home or dual purpose farm truck which has a gross weight of not more 11 than 8,000 pounds, a farm truck which has a gross weight of not more than 12,000 12pounds or a motor home, for an employee's use submits to the department a 13statement once every 4 years, as determined by the department, from a physician 14 licensed to practice medicine in any state, from an advanced practice nurse licensed 15to practice nursing in any state, from a public health nurse certified or licensed to 16 practice in any state, from a physician assistant licensed or certified to practice in 17any state, from a chiropractor licensed to practice chiropractic in any state, or from 18 a Christian Science practitioner residing in this state and listed in the Christian 19 Science journal certifying that the employee is a person with a disability that limits 20or impairs the ability to walk, the department shall issue and deliver to such 21employer plates of a special design in lieu of the plates which ordinarily would be 22issued for the vehicle, and shall renew the plates. The plates shall be so designed as 23to readily apprise law enforcement officers of the fact that the vehicle is operated by $\mathbf{24}$ a disabled person and is entitled to the parking privileges specified in s. 346.50 (2a).

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No charge in addition to the registration fee may be made for the issuance or renewal of the plates. The plates shall conform to the plates required in sub. (1a).

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SECTION 5. 343.51 (1) of the statutes is amended to read:

4 343.51 (1) Any person who qualifies for registration plates of a special design 5 under s. 341.14 (1), (1a), (1m) or (1q) or any other person with a disability that limits 6 or impairs the ability to walk may request from the department a special 7 identification card that will entitle any motor vehicle, other than a motorcycle, 8 parked by, or under the direction of, the person, or a motor vehicle, other than a 9 motorcycle, operated by or on behalf of the organization when used to transport such 10 a person, to parking privileges under s. 346.50 (2), (2a) and (3). The department shall 11 issue the card at a fee to be determined by the department, upon submission by the 12applicant, if the applicant is an individual rather than an organization, of a 13statement from a physician licensed to practice medicine in any state, from an 14 advanced practice nurse licensed to practice nursing in any state, from a public 15health nurse certified or licensed to practice in any state, from a physician assistant 16 licensed or certified to practice in any state, from a chiropractor licensed to practice 17chiropractic in any state, or from a Christian Science practitioner residing in this 18 state and listed in the Christian Science journal that the person is a person with a 19 disability that limits or impairs the ability to walk. The statement shall state 20whether the disability is permanent or temporary and, if temporary, the opinion of 21the physician, advanced practice nurse, public health nurse, physician assistant, 22chiropractor or practitioner as to the duration of the disability. The department shall 23issue the card upon application by an organization on a form prescribed by the

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1 department if the department believes that the organization meets the requirements

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2 under this subsection.
