2007 SENATE BILL 90

March 13, 2007 – Introduced by Senators HARSDORF, KREITLOW, OLSEN and SCHULTZ, cosponsored by Representatives HAHN, RHOADES, GRONEMUS, LOTHIAN, WOOD, CULLEN, MURSAU, MUSSER and GUNDERSON. Referred to Committee on Environment and Natural Resources.

AN ACT to amend 71.05 (6) (a) 15., 71.21 (4), 71.26 (2) (a), 71.34 (1) (g), 71.45 (2) (a) 10. and 77.92 (4); and to create 71.07 (5k), 71.10 (4) (gn), 71.28 (5k), 71.30 (3) (dq), 71.47 (5k) and 71.49 (1) (dq) of the statutes; relating to: creating an income and franchise tax credit for motor vehicles that use gasoline and ethanol mixtures as fuel and for fuel efficient hybrid motor vehicles.

Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

This bill creates an income and franchise tax credit that is equal to the amount of sales and use taxes a person paid in the taxable year on the purchase or lease of any new motor vehicle that is licensed for highway use and capable of using both gasoline and a mixture of gasoline and at least 85 percent ethanol as a fuel to propel the motor vehicle or is a hybrid motor vehicle with a federal Environmental Protection Agency rating that is greater than 40 miles per gallon. The amount of the credit that a person may claim may not exceed an amount equal to \$1,000 in the taxable year for each motor vehicle purchased in that year or \$1,000 for all taxable years combined with respect to the lease of any single motor vehicle.

Subject to the limitations provided under this subsection, a 11 claimant may claim as a credit against the taxes imposed under ss. 71.02 and 71.08, up to the amount of the taxes, an amount that is equal to the amount of the taxes 1213 imposed under subch. III of ch. 77 that the claimant paid in the taxable year on the 14purchase or lease of any new motor vehicle, licensed for highway use, that is capable 15of using both gasoline and a mixture of gasoline and at least 85 percent ethanol as 16 a fuel to propel the motor vehicle or that is a hybrid motor vehicle with a federal 17environmental protection agency rating that is greater than 40 miles per gallon.

(c) *Limitations.* 1. The maximum amount of the credit that a claimant may
claim under this subsection in a taxable year is an amount equal to \$1,000,
multiplied by the number of motor vehicles described under par. (b) that the claimant
purchased or leased in the taxable year, except that the total amount that a claimant
may claim for all taxable years combined with respect to the lease of any single motor
vehicle may not exceed \$1,000.

Partnerships, limited liability companies, and tax-option corporations may
 not claim the credit under this subsection, but the eligibility for, and the amount of,

1	the credit are based on their payment of amounts described under par. (b). A
2	partnership, limited liability company, or tax-option corporation shall compute the
3	amount of credit that each of its partners, members, or shareholders may claim and
4	shall provide that information to each of them. Partners, members of limited liability
5	companies, and shareholders of tax-option corporations may claim the credit in
6	proportion to their ownership interests.
7	(d) Administration. Section 71.28 (4) (e) to (h), as it applies to the credit under
8	s. 71.28 (4), applies to the credit under this subsection.
9	SECTION 3. 71.10 (4) (gn) of the statutes is created to read:

tax-option corporation's income under s. 71.21 (4) or 71.34 (1) (g) plus the amount 1 of losses from the sale or other disposition of assets the gain from which would be $\mathbf{2}$ 3 wholly exempt income, as defined in sub. (3) (L), if the assets were sold or otherwise 4 disposed of at a gain and minus deductions, as computed under the Internal Revenue 5 Code as modified under sub. (3), plus or minus, as appropriate, an amount equal to 6 the difference between the federal basis and Wisconsin basis of any asset sold, 7 exchanged, abandoned, or otherwise disposed of in a taxable transaction during the 8 taxable year, except as provided in par. SECTION 6. 71.28 (5k) of the statutes is created to read:

III of ch. 77 that the claimant paid in the taxable year on the purchase or lease of any new motor vehicle, licensed for highway use, that is capable of using 16 17both gasoline and a mixture of gasoline and at least 85 percent ethanol as a fuel to 18 propel the motor vehicle or that is a hybrid motor vehicle with a federal 19 environmental protection agency rating that is greater than 40 miles per gallon.

(c) *Limitations.* 1. The maximum amount of the credit that a claimant may
claim under this subsection in a taxable year is an amount equal to \$1,000,
multiplied by the number of motor vehicles described under par. (b) that the claimant
purchased or leased in the taxable year, except that the total amount that a claimant
may claim for all taxable years combined with respect to the lease of any single motor
vehicle may not exceed \$1,000.

3 (b) *Filing claims*. Subject to the limitations provided under this subsection, a claimant may claim as a credit against the taxes imposed under s. 71.43, up to the 4 5 amount of the taxes, an amount that is equal to the amount of the taxes imposed 6 under subch. III of ch. 77 that the claimant paid in the taxable year on the purchase 7 or lease of any new motor vehicle, licensed for highway use, that is capable of using 8 both gasoline and a mixture of gasoline and at least 85 percent ethanol as a fuel to 9 propel the motor vehicle or that is a hybrid motor vehicle with a federal 10 environmental protection agency rating that is greater than 40 miles per gallon.

(c) Limitations. 1. The maximum amount of the credit that a claimant may claim under this subsection in a taxable year is an amount equal to \$1,000, multiplied by the number of motor vehicles described under par. (b) that the claimant purchased or leased in the taxable year, except that the total amount that a claimant may claim for all taxable years combined with respect to the lease of any single motor vehicle may not exceed \$1,000.
