2011 SENATE BILL 567

March 15, 2012 – Introduced by Senators Lassa and Vinehout, cosponsored by Representative Radcliffe. Referred to Committee on Senate Organization.

- 1 AN ACT to create 20.255 (1) (fw) and 115.28 (56) of the statutes; relating to: pilot
- 2 farm to school programs and making an appropriation.

Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

This bill directs the Department of Public Instruction (DPI) to administer two pilot farm to school programs in rural school districts in which at least 65 percent of the pupils are eligible for a free or reduced-price lunch in the federal school lunch program. A farm to school program is a program that connects schools with nearby farms to provide children with locally produced fresh fruits and vegetables, dairy products, and other nutritious, locally produced foods in school breakfasts, lunches, and snacks; helps children develop healthy eating habits; provides nutritional and agricultural education; and improves farmers' incomes and direct access to markets.

The bill appropriates moneys to DPI to administer the programs and increases DPI's authorized positions by 2.0 GPR positions for that purpose.

17	the pilot farm to school programs under section 115.28 (56) of the statutes, as created
18	by this act.
19	Section 5. Fiscal changes.
20	(1) In the schedule under section $20.005(3)$ of the statutes for the appropriation
21	to the joint committee on finance under section 20.865 (4) (a) of the statutes, as

affected by the acts of 2011, the dollar amount is decreased by \$135,000 for the first

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- 1 fiscal year of the fiscal biennium in which this subsection takes effect to decrease
- funding for the purposes for which the appropriation is made.
