## 2011 SENATE JOINT RESOLUTION 62

February 10, 2012 – Introduced by Senators Lazich and Taylor, cosponsored by Representative Kuglitsch. Referred to Committee on Senate Organization.

1	Relating to: Turner syndrome awareness month.
2	Whereas, Turner syndrome is a noninheritable chromosomal disorder that
3	affects one in 2,500 live female births; and
4	Whereas, earlier diagnosis will help these girls and women get a complete
5	cardiac screening; and
6	Whereas, risk for acute aortic dissection is increased by more than 100-fold in
7	young and middle-aged women with Turner syndrome; and
8	Whereas, early diagnosis facilitates prevention or remediation of growth
9	failure, hearing problems, and learning difficulties; and
10	Whereas, individuals with Turner syndrome have an increased risk of
11	nonverbal learning disorder, which can cause problems in math, visual-spatial
12	skills, executive-function skills, and job retention; and
13	Whereas, a disproportionately small amount of funding is available for Turner

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Whereas, with the help of medical specialists and a good social support system, a woman with Turner syndrome can live a happy, healthy life; and

Whereas, the establishment of Turner syndrome awareness month will provide the opportunity to share experience and information and raise public awareness about Turner syndrome; now, therefore, be it

Resolved by the senate, the assembly concurring, That the legislature proclaims February 2012 to be Turner syndrome awareness month and encourages all residents to increase awareness of, education about, and services for Turner syndrome, which each year affects hundreds of female babies in Wisconsin; and, be it further
