| 4  | Whereas, Glen received a bachelor of science degree in 1950 and a bachelor of |
| 5  | law degree in 1953 from the University of Wisconsin; and                      |
| 6  | Whereas, Glen was on the board of directors for the Wisconsin 4-H Foundation  |
| 7  | and the Milwaukee Rescue Mission; and   |
| 8  | Whereas, Glen was elected to the Wisconsin Assembly in 1954 and served six    |
| 9  | terms; and  |
| 10 | Whereas, Glen became chair of the Joint Committee on Finance in 1963 and      |
| 11 | chair of the Republican Assembly Policy Committee in 1961; and                |
| 12 | Whereas, Glen also served as chair of the Assembly Commerce and               |
| 13 | Manufactures Committee, the Elections Committee, and the Taxation Committee;  |

| 3  | Whereas, Glen served on the committees of Tax Compromise, Claims,                     |
| 4  | Judgment Debtor Relief, and Legislative Organization and Procedure, and the           |
| 5  | Legislative Council and its "Committee of 25"; and                                    |
| 6  | Whereas, Glen served on the governor's Blue Ribbon Committee on Tax Policy,           |
| 7  | Tax Sources and Incidence Subcommittee and the Continuing Revenue Survey              |
| 8  | Committee; and  |
| 9  | Whereas, Glen was appointed deputy secretary of administration by Governor            |
| 10 | Warren Knowles in 1966; and   |
| 11 | Whereas, Glen moved to McLean, Virginia, and worked as deputy assistant               |
| 12 | attorney general for the United States Department of Justice; and                     |
| 13 | Whereas, Glen was transferred to the Federal Bureau of Prisons as the deputy          |
| 14 | assistant director until he retired in 1988; and                                      |
| 15 | Whereas, Glen raised four children: William, Philip, David, and Jean; and             |
| 16 | Whereas, Glen E. Pommerening Jr. passed away on September 10, 2013, at the            |
| 17 | age of 85 in his home in Alexandria, Virginia; now, therefore, be it                  |
| 18 | Resolved by the assembly, the senate concurring, That the Wisconsin                   |
| 19 | legislature honors the life and public service of Glen E. Pommerening Jr. and extends |
| 20 | condolences to his family and friends.  |
