2013 SENATE BILL 572

February 5, 2014 – Introduced by Senator PETROWSKI, cosponsored by Representative RIPP. Referred to Committee on Transportation, Public Safety, and Veterans and Military Affairs.

- 1 AN ACT to amend 343.20 (1) (a) of the statutes; relating to: expiration of motor
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vehicle operators' licenses issued after cancellation.

Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

Under current law, a person's operator's license may be cancelled for a variety of reasons. For example, a license may be cancelled if the Department of Transportation (DOT) finds that the application for the license contained a material false statement or if a license has been altered and returned to DOT for cancellation. In most cases where a person's license has been cancelled, the person may apply for a new license at any time. A new license issued after cancellation expires two years from the date of the applicant's next birthday.

Under this bill, a new license issued after cancellation expires on the expiration date of the prior license at the time of cancellation.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

- **SECTION 1.** 343.20 (1) (a) of the statutes is amended to read:
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343.20 (1) (a) Except as otherwise expressly provided in this chapter,

5 probationary licenses issued under s. 343.085, licenses issued after cancellation

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under s. 343.26 (1), and original licenses other than instruction permits shall expire 1 $\mathbf{2}$ 2 years from the date of the applicant's next birthday. Licenses issued after 3 cancellation shall expire on the expiration date for the prior license at the time of cancellation. Subject to s. 343.125 (3), all other licenses and license endorsements 4 shall expire 8 years after the date of issuance. The department may institute any $\mathbf{5}$ 6 system of initial license issuance which it deems advisable for the purpose of gaining 7 a uniform rate of renewals. In order to put such a system into operation, the 8 department may issue licenses which are valid for any period less than the ordinary 9 effective period of such license. If the department issues a license that is valid for less than the ordinary effective period as authorized by this paragraph, the fees due 10 11 under s. 343.21 (1) (b) and (d) shall be prorated accordingly.

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SECTION 2. Initial applicability.

(1) This act first applies to applications for operators' licenses received by the
department of transportation on the effective date of this subsection.
