for participation in robotics competitions and making an appropriation.

Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

This bill authorizes the Department of Public Instruction to award grants to teams of pupils in the 9th through 12th grades in the 2016–17 and 2017–18 school years. The grants are to be used to facilitate participation in robotics competitions. For further information see the *state* fiscal estimate, which will be printed as an appendix to this bill.

19	nonstock, nonprofit corporation, described under section 501 (c) (3) of the Internal
20	Revenue Code and exempt from taxation under section 501 (a) of the Internal
21	Revenue Code, having as one of its organizational purposes encouraging young
22	people to develop an interest in science, engineering, technology, and math.
23	(2) (a) No later than April 1, 2016, and no later than April 1, 2017, the
24	department shall notify school boards, operators of charter schools under s. 118.40

(2r) and (2x), and administrators of home-based private educational programs that

(b) From the appropriation under s. 20.244 (2) (dr), the department shall award
a grant of up to \$5,000 to eligible teams selected from the applicants under par. (a).
Grant funds awarded under this section may be applied only towards allowable
expenses.
