- 1 AN ACT to amend 121.004 (7) (c) 1. a. and 121.004 (7) (c) 2. of the statutes;
- 2 **relating to:** counting pupils enrolled in four-year-old kindergarten.

Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

This bill changes the manner in which a pupil enrolled in a four-year-old kindergarten program that requires full day attendance is counted by a school district for purposes of state aid from one-half pupil to one pupil.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

- 3 **Section 1.** 121.004 (7) (c) 1. a. of the statutes is amended to read:
- 121.004 (7) (c) 1. a. A pupil enrolled in a 5-year-old kindergarten program that requires full-day attendance by the pupil for 5 days a week, but not on any day of the week that pupils enrolled in other grades in the school do not attend school, for
- 7 an entire school term shall be counted as one pupil.
- **Section 2.** 121.004 (7) (c) 2. of the statutes is amended to read:
