2017 ASSEMBLY JOINT RESOLUTION 48

May 4, 2017 – Introduced by Representatives Kulp, Tranel, Thiesfeldt, Gannon, Kerkman, Steffen, Macco, Ripp, E. Brooks, Krug, Knodl, VanderMeer and Tusler, cosponsored by Senators Marklein and Lasee. Referred to Committee on Rules.

1	Relating to: supporting Taiwan's signing of the Free Trade Agreement (FTA) and
2	Bilateral Investment Agreement (BIA) with the United States and reaffirming
3	support for increasing Taiwan's international profile and for strengthening and
4	expanding sister-state ties between Wisconsin and Taiwan.
5	Whereas, the state of Wisconsin is proud of the sister-state relationship it has
6	enjoyed with the Republic of China (Taiwan) since 1986, which is marked by strong
7	bilateral trade, educational and cultural exchange, and tourism; and
8	Whereas, Taiwan shares the same values of freedom, democracy, human rights,
9	the rule of law, peace, and prosperity with the United States and the state of
10	Wisconsin; and
11	Whereas, the United States ranks as Taiwan's second-largest trading partner,
12	Taiwan ranks as the ninth-largest trading partner of the United States, and
13	bilateral trade reached \$66.6 billion in 2015; and
14	Whereas, Taiwan and the state of Wisconsin have enjoyed a long and mutually
15	beneficial relationship with the prospect of future growth, and Taiwan was

Wisconsin's seventh-largest export market in 2015, with \$184 million worth of
 Wisconsin goods exported to Taiwan; and

Whereas, negotiations for a Bilateral Investment Agreement (BIA) between Taiwan and the United States are an important step toward further strengthening bilateral trade and paving the way for entering into a Free Trade Agreement (FTA) between our countries, thereby increasing Wisconsin's exports to Taiwan and creating bilateral investment and technical collaboration through tariff reduction and other trade facilitation measures; and

9 Whereas, Taiwan has undertaken a policy of "steadfast diplomacy" in its 10 international relations and is capable of and willing to fulfill its responsibilities and 11 collaborate with the world to deal with the challenges of humanitarian aids, disease 12 control, and so forth; now, therefore, be it

13 **Resolved by the assembly, the senate concurring, That** the Wisconsin 14 legislature reaffirms its commitment to the strengthening and deepening of the 15 sister-state relationship between Taiwan and the state of Wisconsin; and, be it 16 further

17 *Resolved, That* Wisconsin endorses Taiwan's efforts to secure the signing of
18 the FTA and the BIA with the United States; and, be it further

19 **Resolved, That** Wisconsin continues to support Taiwan's appropriate 20 participation in international organizations that impact the health, safety, and 21 well-being of the people of Taiwan and supports Taiwan's aspiration to make more 22 contributions in international societies; and, be it further

Resolved, That the chief clerk of the assembly is hereby directed to transmit 1 $\mathbf{2}$ copies of this resolution to the members of the Wisconsin Congressional delegation 3 and the Taipei Economic and Cultural Office in Chicago, Illinois. 4
