1	Relating to: designating the first week in October as Mental Illness Awareness
2	Week in Wisconsin.
3	Whereas, mental health is part of overall health; and
4	Whereas, one in five adults experience a mental health problem in any given
5	year; and
6	Whereas, approximately one-half of chronic mental illness begins by the age
7	of 14 and three-quarters begins by age 24; and
8	Whereas, suicide is the tenth leading cause of death in the United States and
9	the second leading cause of death among young adults, and 90 percent of people who
10	die by suicide have an underlying mental illness; and
11	Whereas, long delays, sometimes decades, can occur between the time
12	symptoms of mental illness first appear and when an individual gets help; and
13	Whereas, early identification and treatment can make a difference in the

successful management of mental illness and recovery; and

1	Whereas, it is important to maintain mental health and learn the symptoms of
2	mental illness in order to get help when it is needed; and
3	Whereas, every citizen and community can make a difference in helping end the
4	silence and stigma that, for too long, has surrounded mental illness and discouraged
5	people from getting help; and
6	Whereas, public education and civic activities can encourage mental health and
7	help improve the lives of individuals and families affected by mental illness; and
8	Whereas, in observance of Mental Illness Awareness Week, the legislature
9	encourages citizens, businesses, schools, and community organizations to learn more
10	about eliminating the stigma of mental illness; now, therefore, be it
11	Resolved by the assembly, the senate concurring, That the Wisconsin
12	Legislature designates October 1 through October 7, 2017, as Mental Illness
13	Awareness Week in Wisconsin to shine a light on mental illness, fight stigma, provide
14	support, educate the public, and advocate for equal care.
