

2017 ASSEMBLY RESOLUTION 28

February 21, 2018 – Introduced by COMMITTEE ON RULES.

1 **Relating to:** establishing special orders of business for Thursday, February 22,

2 2018.

3 **Resolved by the assembly, That:**

SECTION 1. Special order scheduled. The following proposals shall be

special orders of business on Thursday, February 22, 2018, at the times shown:

- (1) At 1:57 p.m., 2017 Assembly Joint Resolution 93, relating to: eligibility and conditions for release prior to conviction of persons accused of certain crimes and considerations for imposing bail (first consideration).
- (2) At 1:58 p.m., 2017 Assembly Bill 40, relating to: entrepreneurial assistance grants and making an appropriation.
- (3) At 1:59 p.m., 2017 Assembly Bill 773, relating to: discovery of information in court proceedings; procedural requirements relating to class actions; consumer lawsuit lending; the statute of limitations for certain civil actions; agreements by the secretary of revenue to allow third-party audits related to unclaimed property; interest rates for overdue insurance claims; and providing a penalty.
- (4) At 2:00 p.m., 2017 Assembly Bill 823, relating to: entering certain places with intent to commit battery and providing a criminal penalty.

- (5) At 2:01 p.m., 2017 Assembly Bill 935, relating to: an exemption from permit requirements for certain riparian owners who remove material from the bed of a navigable water.
- (6) At 2:02 p.m., 2017 Senate Bill 61, relating to: forfeiture of property seized in relation to a crime.
- (7) At 2:03 p.m., 2017 Senate Bill 84, relating to: access to investigational drugs, devices, and biological products and limitations on liability related to their use.
- (8) At 2:04 p.m., 2017 Senate Bill 415, relating to: reporting on an operator license or identification card application the existence of a disability that is not immediately apparent to another.
- (9) At 2:05 p.m., 2017 Senate Bill 599, relating to: various changes to the Agricultural Producer Security Program, providing an exemption from emergency rule procedures, and granting rule-making authority.
