## 2019 ASSEMBLY BILL 156

April 9, 2019 - Introduced by Representatives Ott, Skowronski, Kolste, C. Taylor, Sinicki and Sargent, cosponsored by Senators Carpenter, Kooyenga, Bernier, Feyen, Risser, Jacque and L. Taylor. Referred to Committee on Medicaid Reform and Oversight.

- 1 AN ACT to amend 100.30 (6) (title); and to create 100.30 (6) (a) 10. and 100.30
- 2 (6) (e) of the statutes; **relating to:** regulating the sale of prescription drugs
- 3 below cost.

## Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

This bill exempts prescription drugs from the Unfair Sales Act. Under current law, the Unfair Sales Act, also known as the "minimum markup law," prohibits retailers and wholesalers from selling merchandise, including prescription drugs, for less than the cost of the merchandise to the seller. Under the bill, the prohibition on below-cost sales does not apply to prescription drugs.
