2019 ASSEMBLY BILL 35

February 22, 2019 - Introduced by Representatives Spiros, Kuglitsch, Murphy, Ramthun, Sanfelippo, Skowronski, Wichgers and Zimmerman, cosponsored by Senators Jacque, Wanggaard, Cowles, Marklein and Olsen. Referred to Committee on Judiciary.

- 1 AN ACT to amend 943.10 (1m) (intro.) of the statutes; relating to: entering
- 2 certain places with intent to commit battery and providing a penalty.

Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

Under current law, it is a Class F felony to enter a dwelling or certain other places with intent to steal or commit a felony therein. Under the bill, it is a Class F felony to enter one of those places with the intent to commit battery, regardless of whether the battery was a misdemeanor or felony battery.

Because this bill creates a new crime or revises a penalty for an existing crime, the Joint Review Committee on Criminal Penalties may be requested to prepare a report.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

- **SECTION 1.** 943.10 (1m) (intro.) of the statutes is amended to read:
- 4 943.10 (1m) (intro.) Whoever intentionally enters any of the following places
- 5 without the consent of the person in lawful possession and with intent to steal or
