2019 ASSEMBLY BILL 456

September 18, 2019 - Introduced by Representatives KITCHENS, ALLEN, DUCHOW, MACCO, KRUG, KULP, SPIROS, TUSLER and DITTRICH, cosponsored by Senators Olsen, Bernier and Feyen. Referred to Committee on Education.

- AN ACT *to create* 20.255 (2) (bt) and 115.448 of the statutes; **relating to:** grants for feasibility studies of school district consolidation or whole grade sharing and
- 3 making an appropriation.

Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

This bill requires the Department of Public Instruction to award grants of up to \$10,000 each to consortia of school districts to be used for a professional financial analysis of how school district consolidation or entering into a whole grade sharing agreement would affect the school districts.

16	consolidation or whole grade sharing agreements under s. 118.50. The department
17	may not award a grant to an eligible applicant in an amount exceeding \$10,000.
18	(b) An eligible applicant receiving a grant under this section shall use the gran
19	moneys for a professional financial analysis of how school district consolidation or
20	entering into a whole grade sharing agreement under s. 118.50 would affect the
21	school districts associated with the eligible applicant.
