## **2019 ASSEMBLY BILL 783**

January 22, 2020 - Introduced by Representatives Sortwell, Dittrich, Milroy, Pronschinske, Allen, Stubbs, Tusler, Kulp and Tittl, cosponsored by Senators Jacque and L. Taylor. Referred to Committee on Constitution and Ethics.

AN ACT to create 252.04 (3m) of the statutes; relating to: immunization-related mail.

#### Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

This bill requires a government entity; public or private elementary, middle, junior high, or senior high school; childcare center or nursery school; or health care provider who sends a piece of mail containing information that could disclose another person's immunization status to ensure that any information that could disclose a person's immunization status or otherwise allow someone to infer a person's immunization status is enclosed and sealed in the piece of mail and that no such information is visible on the outside of the piece of mail.

# The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

**Section 1.** 252.04 (3m) of the statutes is created to read:

252.04 (3m) Any government entity; public or private elementary, middle, junior high, or senior high school; childcare center or nursery school; or health care provider, as defined in s. 146.81 (1), who sends a piece of mail containing information that could disclose another person's immunization status, including immunization

SECTION 1
