1	Relating to: recognizing October 10, 2019, as World Mental Health Day.
2	Whereas, World Mental Health Day is observed by the World Health
3	Organization on October 10; and
4	Whereas, the objective of this day is to raise awareness for people all around the
5	world who are affected by mental health issues; and
6	Whereas, one in five U.S. adults experiences mental illness each year and one
7	in six U.S. youth experiences a mental health disorder each year; and
8	Whereas, suicide is the second leading cause of death among people aged 10 to
9	34 and the tenth leading cause of death in the United States; and
10	Whereas, only 43 percent of U.S. adults with a mental illness received
11	treatment in 2018; and
12	Whereas, people with depression have a 40 percent higher risk of developing
13	cardiovascular and metabolic diseases than the general population, and caregivers
14	of adults with a mental health issue spend an average of 32 hours per week providing
15	unpaid care; and

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Whereas, 8.4 million people in the United States provide care to an adult with
 a mental health issue; now, therefore, be it

 October 10, 2019, to be World Mental Health Day.
