2019 SENATE BILL 228

May 23, 2019 - Introduced by Senators TESTIN, TIFFANY, FEYEN, MARKLEIN, WIRCH and BERNIER, cosponsored by Representatives KURTZ, JAMES, EDMING, FELZKOWSKI, KRUG, KULP, MURSAU, OLDENBURG, PETRYK, PLUMER, QUINN, SNYDER, SPIROS, SUMMERFIELD, SWEARINGEN, TAUCHEN, TRANEL, TUSLER, VANDERMEER, ZIMMERMAN, NOVAK, KATSMAN, MILROY, FIELDS, DOYLE, SKOWRONSKI, BRANDTJEN, DITTRICH, OTT, RODRIGUEZ, THIESFELDT and BILLINGS. Referred to Committee on Universities, Technical Colleges, Children and Families.

- 1 **AN ACT to create** 20.235 (1) (dg), 20.235 (1) (dr) and 36.635 of the statutes;
2 **relating to:** Marquette University School of Dentistry rural scholarship
3 program and making an appropriation.

Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

This bill requires the Higher Educational Aids Board, in consultation with the Department of Health Services, to establish a program for awarding annual scholarships of \$75,000 to no more than five first-year students enrolled in the Marquette University School of Dentistry (school). The scholarships are awarded for each year of enrollment in the school, but not exceeding four years. To be eligible for a scholarship, a student must be a state resident and enter into an agreement with HEAB that he or she will practice dentistry upon graduation for a required number of months in an eligible area in this state, which is a federally designated dental health shortage area that is not located in Brown, Dane, Kenosha, Milwaukee, or Waukesha County. The number of months required is 18 months for each annual scholarship awarded to the student. In addition, the agreement must specify that if a student does not practice dentistry in an eligible area in this state for the required number of months, he or she is liable to the state for an amount that is based on the number of months he or she did not practice in an eligible area in this state. Also, the bill requires HEAB, in cooperation with the school, to make every effort to ensure that students in the program practice dentistry upon graduation in eligible areas in this state that are geographically diverse. Finally, the bill requires HEAB to make grants to the school to defray the school's administrative costs related to the program.

1 **SECTION 1.** 20.005 (3) (schedule) of the statutes: at the appropriate place, insert

13 **SECTION 3.** 20.235 (1) (dr) of the statutes is created to read:

14 20.235 (1) (dr) *Rural dentistry scholarship program; administration.*
15 Biennially, the amounts in the schedule for grants under s. 36.635 (5).

16 **SECTION 4.** 36.635 of the statutes is created to read:

17 **36.635 Rural dentistry scholarship program. (1) DEFINITIONS.** In this

1 (a) “Actual practice total” is the total number of months that a student upon
2 graduation practices dentistry in a dental health shortage area in this state. For
3 purposes of this paragraph, a fraction of a month is counted as one month.

4 (b) “Dental health shortage area” has the meaning given in s. 36.60 (1) (ad),
5 except that “dental health shortage area” does not include an area in the county of
6 Brown, Dane, Kenosha, Milwaukee, or Waukesha.

7 (c) “Repayment liability percentage” means the percentage that results from
8 dividing the difference between a student’s required practice total and the student’s
9 actual practice total by the student’s required practice total.

10 (d) “Required practice total” means the total number of months a student upon
11 graduation is required under sub. (3) to practice dentistry in a dental health shortage
12 area in this state.

13 (e) “School” means the Marquette University School of Dentistry.

14 **(2) SCHOLARSHIPS.** In consultation with the department of health services, the
15 board shall establish a program for awarding to no more than 5 first-year students
16 an annual scholarship, including a stipend, equal to \$75,000 for each year of a
17 student’s enrollment but not exceeding 4 years. The board shall pay the scholarships
18 from the appropriation account under s. 20.235 (1) (dg).

19 **(3) ELIGIBILITY; AGREEMENTS.** (a) A student is not eligible for a scholarship under
20 the program established under sub. (2) unless he or she is a resident of the state and
21 enters into an agreement with board in which he or she agrees upon graduation to
22 practice dentistry in a dental health shortage area in this state for a period equal to
23 18 months multiplied by the number of annual scholarships the board awards to the
24 student under the program.
