2021 SENATE BILL 527

August 26, 2021 – Introduced by Senators Larson, Carpenter, Roys, Agard and Johnson, cosponsored by Representatives Anderson, Brostoff, Sinicki, Subeck, Hebl, Shankland, Ohnstad, Baldeh, Neubauer, Snodgrass, Cabrera, Milroy, Considine, Pope, Spreitzer, Conley, Shelton and Andraca. Referred to Committee on Elections, Election Process Reform and Ethics.

Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

Under this bill, for campaign finance purposes, a political action committee includes a person, other than an individual, that spends more than \$1,000 in a 12-month period on expenditures for express advocacy, expenditures made to support or defeat a referendum, and contributions made to a candidate committee, legislative campaign committee, or political party.

Current law provides that a political action committee is a person, other than an individual, that either has express advocacy as its major purpose or spends more than 50 percent of its total spending in a 12-month period on expenditures for express advocacy, expenditures made to support or defeat a referendum, and contributions made to a candidate committee, legislative campaign committee, or political party.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

- **Section 1.** 11.0101 (25) (a) 3. of the statutes is created to read:
