2023 SENATE BILL 639

- AN ACT *to amend* 45.41 (5) of the statutes; **relating to:** funding for the Wisconsin department of the American legion for the operation of the Camp American Legion.
 - Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

Under current law, the Department of Veterans Affairs may annually grant up to \$75,000 to the Wisconsin department of the American Legion for the operation of Camp American Legion. This bill increases the amount the department may grant to up to \$120,000, and directs that the granted money be used to pay up to half of the annual wages and salaries associated with the operation of Camp American Legion, or \$120,000 for the annual wages and salaries associated with the operation of Camp American Legion, whichever is less.

- **SECTION 1.** 45.41 (5) of the statutes is amended to read:

- 6 annually grant up to \$75,000 \$120,000 to the Wisconsin department of the American

Legion for the annual wages and salaries associated with the operation of Camp
American Legion. The department shall issue a grant to the Wisconsin department
of the American Legion for the purposes stated under this subsection in an amount
not exceed one-half of the annual wages and salaries associated with the operation
of Camp American Legion, or \$120,000, whichever is less.
