- 1 AN ACT to create 85.65 of the statutes; relating to: required inclusions in the
- 2 long-range statewide transportation plan.

Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

This bill provides that the long-range statewide transportation plan developed by the Department of Transportation must include a vision, or provide reference to another planning document that includes a vision, for the following: 1) low-carbon public transit; 2) electrification of the transportation sector; 3) cost-effective charging infrastructure; 4) incentives to develop equitable, clean transportation options; and 5) transportation solutions for underserved areas of the state. The bill requires DOT to prepare and submit a report to the governor and the legislature detailing how it has incorporated a vision for the required items into its current long-range transportation plan and, for any items for which a vision has not yet been incorporated, how DOT will incorporate a vision for those items into future plans.

Under current federal law, each state must have a comprehensive statewide multimodal transportation planning process, including the development of a long-range statewide transportation plan. The plan must provide for safe and efficient transportation systems that serve mobility needs and foster economic growth while minimizing transportation-related fuel consumption and air pollution.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

Section 1. 85.65 of the statutes is created to read:

85.65 Required inclusions in long-range statewide transportation plans. Each long-range statewide transportation plan developed by the department beginning on the effective date of this section [LRB inserts date], and required under 23 USC 135 shall include a vision, or provide reference to another planning document that includes a vision, for all of the following:

- (1) Low-carbon public transit.
- (2) Electrification of the transportation sector.
- (3) Cost-effective charging infrastructure.
- (4) Incentives to develop equitable, clean transportation options throughout the state.
- (5) Transportation solutions for underserved areas of the state, including rural communities, low-income communities, and communities where the majority of residents are members of a racial minority.

Section 2. Nonstatutory provisions.

(1) The department of transportation shall prepare a report detailing efforts the department has completed to incorporate a vision for the items required under s. 85.65 into the department's long-range statewide transportation plan or related planning documents. The department's report shall also identify items requiring a vision that have not yet been incorporated into the existing long-range transportation plan or related planning documents and shall include strategies the

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department plans to use to incorporate the items into a future long-range
transportation plan or related planning document. No later than 6 months after the
effective date of this subsection, the department of transportation shall submit its
report to the governor and to the relevant standing committees of the legislature.
