## **2023 SENATE BILL 885**

January 5, 2024 – Introduced by Senators Feyen and Taylor, cosponsored by Representatives Palmeri, Baldeh, Conley, Drake, Joers, Maxey, Mursau, O'Connor, Ratcliff, Sinicki, Snodgrass and Subeck. Referred to Committee on Health.

- 1 AN ACT to create 20.435 (7) (bm) and 146.619 of the statutes; relating to: grants
- 2 for patient lift devices and making an appropriation.

#### Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

This bill requires the Department of Health Services to establish and administer a program to award grants to community-based residential facilities, hospices, nursing homes, and residential care apartment complexes for the purchase of patient lift devices. In order to receive a grant, an applicant must meet criteria established by DHS, including a requirement to report data as specified by DHS or a third party under contract with DHS. Grant recipients must spend grant moneys only on patient lift devices that 1) are approved by DHS, 2) can be operated independently by a patient or resident, 3) can be operated by or with the assistance of facility staff, and 4) aid in mechanically lifting a human.
