## 2025 ASSEMBLY JOINT RESOLUTION 25

April 15, 2025 - Introduced by Representatives Penterman, Tusler, Subeck, Bare, Callahan, Clancy, Desmidt, Dittrich, Emerson, Franklin, Gundrum, Hong, Kaufert, Knodl, Kreibich, Madison, Miresse, Moses, Murphy, Mursau, O'Connor, Ortiz-Velez, Phelps, Rodriguez, Sinicki, Snodgrass, Steffen, Stubbs, Udell and Andraca, cosponsored by Senators Cabral-Guevara, Dassler-Alfheim, Jacque, Jagler, Marklein, Nass, Ratcliff, Roys and Tomczyk. Referred to Committee on Rules.

1 Relating to: proclaiming April 24, 2025, to be Holocaust Remembrance Day and 2 April 27, 2025, to May 4, 2025, as Holocaust Days of Remembrance in 3 Wisconsin. 4 Whereas, from 1933 to 1945, 6 million Jews were murdered by the Nazis and 5 their collaborators in the Holocaust as part of a systematic program of persecution 6 culminating in genocide, and millions of other people were targeted and killed; and 7 Whereas, Jews who fell under German control in Eastern and Central Europe 8 were quickly and cruelly stripped of their rights and property; and 9 Whereas, the Jews who were murdered by the Nazis and their collaborators 10 comprised two-thirds of the European Jewish population, and in Poland, which 11 before the second World War included parts of modern-day Ukraine and Belarus, 12 the Jewish death toll was 90 percent; and

Whereas, the Holocaust represents a dark period in the history of civilization

1	of mankind and must always be remembered in order to prevent its reoccurrence
2	and promote respect and common humanity; and
3	Whereas, Yom HaShoah, Holocaust Remembrance Day, which commemorates
4	the millions of Jewish victims of the Holocaust, was established by the Israeli
5	parliament, the Knesset, in 1951. It is observed on the 27th of Nisan in the Hebrew
6	calendar, which marks the anniversary of the Warsaw ghetto uprising; and
7	Whereas, the year 2025 marks the 80th Anniversary of the liberation of
8	Auschwitz-Birkenau; and
9	Whereas, remembrance ceremonies are held throughout the United States
10	and around the world to remember the tragedy of the Holocaust, including at the
11	Holocaust Museum in Washington, D.C., in the halls of the United Nations in New
12	York City, and here in Wisconsin; and
13	Whereas, following the recent acts of hatred and violence against the Jewish
14	Community, it is critical that we stand together to combat and educate about the
15	dangers of antisemitism and all forms of hate and bigotry in our communities and
16	across this State, so we ensure that suffering on the scale of the Holocaust truly
17	never does happen again; and
18	Whereas, knowing that the events and root causes of the Holocaust must not
19	be forgotten and that, particularly as survivors diminish in number, links must be
20	forged to educate future generations; now, therefore, be it
21	Resolved by the assembly, the senate concurring, That the Wisconsin
22	Legislature formally recognizes April 24, 2025, to be Holocaust Remembrance Day
23	and April 27, 2025, to May 4, 2025, as Holocaust Days of Remembrance in
