On June 13, 2022, Victoria Schiller, a Wisconsin resident, filed an administrative rule petition asking the court to amend Wis. Stat. §§ 757.48 (1) (b), 767.407 (1) (am), 767.407 (4), 767.407 (4m), 767.407 (5), 767.406 (6), and 814.615 "in order to shift the generally perceived responsibilities of a guardian ad litem to reflect the legal impacts of the 'ENDING QUALIFIED IMMUNITY ACT.'" She states the petition will improve the lives of the people in the State of Wisconsin affected by guardian ad litem practice.

The court considered the rule petition and determined that it would not exercise its rule-making authority or further consider this petition due to procedural shortcomings with the petition. See Wis. Stat. § 751.12; see S. Ct. Order 03-07, In the matter of Amendment of SCR 40.05 and the Bar Application of Samuel Mostkoff (issued Oct. 13, 2003) (dismissing administrative rule petition pertaining to petitioner's pending legal challenges).
