

Assembly Bill 2 March 5, 2019 Testimony from Rep. Spiros

Hello, and thank you Chairman Novak and members of the Assembly Committee on Local Government for allowing me to have the opportunity to share my testimony with you today regarding Assembly Bill 2, which would expand the definition of "immobilization device".

Last session, I authored a bill that unanimously passed both houses that expanded when municipalities were allowed to use immobilization devices, otherwise known as "boots". The bill allowed these devices to be used to enforce the nonpayment of parking tickets for habitual parking violators.

Current law requires that an immobilization device work by locking around the wheel of a vehicle, making the vehicle inoperable. Advancements in technology have led to the invention of other devices that could be used for the same purpose, but are currently prohibited by state law because they are placed on the windshield, rather than on the wheel.

These new devices are less of a hindrance to those who have had their car immobilized, because they have the potential to be unlocked remotely through telephone payment systems.

This legislation does not expand the scenarios in which a municipality can use an immobilization device, it simply allows them to employ a more user-friendly option in those cases where it is being used.

The original bill created a new definition of "immobilization device" that did not include a requirement that the device go around the wheel. Assembly Amendment 1, which was first passed in the Senate committee at the request of a member of the committee, changes the bill so it simply adds as an option those immobilization devices that can be place on the windshield.

This amendment will allow us to consider only the technology that is available right now, and gives us the opportunity to reevaluate down the road should new technology become available.

Assembly Bill 2 – Alternate Immobilization Devices Senator Robert Cowles- March 6, 2019

Thank you Chairman Novak and Committee Members for the opportunity to discuss Assembly Bill 2 relating to alternate immobilization devices for parking enforcement. On the heels of 2017 Act 286 that authorized any municipality to enact an ordinance for the immobilization of vehicles owned by "habitual parking violators", Assembly Bill 2 simply, as amended, adds a definition for an immobilization device to be affixed to the windshield. Currently, a statutory burden exists that has prevented municipalities from using new technology to deal with habitual parking violators in a cost effective, convenient, modern, and ultimately safer manner.

While unpaid parking tickets and "The Boot" have been in lockstep with each other for a generation, new parking enforcement products have entered the market to immobilize vehicles that provide flexibility and services to municipalities, law enforcement, and even parking violators. Under current law, there is a definition that requires that an immobilization device be affixed around a wheel. This prevents new products that can immobilize a vehicle on the windshield from being used.

Additionally, new products also have the potential to be unlocked remotely through automated or manned telephone payment systems that reduce the need for additional resources and personnel to conduct payment and device removal. Automated services like these also reduce potential safety concerns when municipal employees or law enforcement officers are required to confront irritated and potentially disgruntled parking violators. Assembly Bill 2 adds to antiquated statutory language to let Wisconsin municipalities utilize these new products to better administer their parking enforcement and make it more user-friendly for the parking violator. This legislation does nothing to change the manner in which parking enforcement operates nor does it require any changes by local governments, but instead is merely a new opportunity for municipalities and law enforcement agency to take advantage of new products.

This legislation is supported by the League of Wisconsin Municipalities, the City of Milwaukee, the Wisconsin Professional Police Association, and the Wisconsin Chiefs of Police Association. Thank you again for the opportunity to discuss 2019 Assembly Bill 2.

The motorist is then responsible for returning the device to a drop location within 24 hours. Because of the motorist's ability to regain the use of their car in as little as 15 minutes, **The Barnacle** is perceived as far less invasive and onerous than the boot.

One of the key benefits of The Barnacle for municipalities and the police is that there are virtually no upfront costs to acquire the Barnacle devices and software.

We are reimbursed through a small release fee that covers all of the devices, software and customer service support. With the number of scofflaws that most cities have on their collections list every year, **The Barnacle** offers a much more effective and efficient collection solution than the current towing and booting programs that most cities are using.

The Barnacle system also uses Open API Software, which allows it to interface with any current enforcement software.
