assistance to veterans. The mobile claims officers shall coordinate that claim and

d. The duty to submit the plans and specifications for all new buildings to the

specifications for all new buildings and all conveyances, leases, and subleases made
under this subsection to the department of administration and the governor for
written approval before they are finally adopted, executed, and delivered.

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e. The power to pledge and assign all or any part of the revenues derived from the operation of any land or new buildings as security for the payment of rentals due and to become due under any lease or sublease of new buildings under subd. 1. c.

f. The power to covenant and agree in any lease or sublease of any land or new
buildings made under subd. 1.c. to impose fees, rentals, or other charges for the use

and occupancy or other operation of new buildings in an amount calculated to
 produce net revenues sufficient to pay the rentals due and to become due under the
 lease or sublease.

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g. The power to apply all or any part of the revenues derived from the operation
of any land or existing buildings to the payment of rentals due and to become due
under any lease or sublease made under subd. 1.c.

h. The power to pledge and assign all or any part of the revenues derived from
the operation of any land or existing buildings to the payment of rentals due and to
become due under any lease or sublease made under subd. 1.c.

i. The power to covenant and agree in any lease or sublease made under subd.
1. c. to impose fees, rentals, or other charges for the use and occupancy or other
operation of any land or existing buildings in an amount calculated to produce net
revenues sufficient to pay the rentals due and to become due under the lease or
sublease.

j. The power and duty, upon receipt of notice of any assignment by any the nonprofit corporation of any lease or sublease made under subd. 1. c., or of any of its rights under any the sublease, to recognize and give effect to the assignment, and to pay to the assignee rentals or other payments then due or which may become due under any the lease or sublease which has been assigned by the nonprofit corporation.

2. The state shall be liable for accrued rentals and for any other default under
any lease or sublease made under subd. 1. c., and may be sued for the accrued rentals
or other default on contract as in other contract actions under ch. 775, except that
the lessor under the lease or sublease or any assignee of the lessor or any person or

1 other legal entity proceeding on behalf the lessor is not required to file any claim with 2 the legislature prior to the commencement of the action.

17	(12) GIFTS AND BEQUESTS. (a) The department may receive gifts and bequests

21	(b) The department may receive moneys or other gifts and bequests in its name

However, when funds 8 estimated to be received in the veterans mortgage loan repayment fund to pay debt 9 service on public debt contracted under s. 20.866 (2) (zn) and (zo) are less than the 10 funds estimated to be required for the payment of the debt service, the board may 11 grant deferral of payments and interest on loans provided under s. 45.37 only when 12 so required by federal law.

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(16) APPLICATION REQUIREMENTS AND PENALTIES. (a) If the department finds that an applicant for benefits from the department has willfully made or caused to be made, or conspired, assisted in, agreed to, arranged for, or in any way procured the making of a false or fraudulent affidavit, declaration, certificate, statement, or other writing, it may suspend all benefits available to the applicant from the department under this chapter.

(b) Any person who, with the intent to secure any benefits under this chapter
for personal benefit or for others, willfully makes or causes to be made, or conspires,
assists in, agrees to, arranges for, or in any way procures the making or presentation
of a false or fraudulent affidavit, declaration, certificate, statement, or other writing,
may be fined not more than \$500 or be imprisoned for not more than 6 months, or
both. The fine or imprisonment may be imposed in addition to the penalty provided
in par. (a).

The department may enter into contracts to collect 14 delinquent loan payments owed to the department. The department may allocate a 15 portion of the amounts collected under the contracts to pay contract costs. 16 Notwithstanding the provisions of s. 45.04, the department may release information 17 contained in its files pertaining to applications for benefits to contractors providing 18 collection services to the department. 19 (19) LOAN GUARANTEE. The department may provide a loan guarantee for 20 multifamily transitional housing for homeless veterans. 21 **45.04 Release of information and records. (1)** DEFINITIONS. In this section: 22 (a) "Duly authorized representative" means any person authorized in writing 23 by the veteran to act for the veteran, the veteran's guardian if the veteran is 24 adjudicated incompetent, or a legal representative if the veteran is deceased. Where

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25 for proper reason no representative has been or will be appointed, the veteran's

spouse, an adult child, or, if the veteran is unmarried, either parent of the veteran
 shall be recognized as the duly authorized representative.

(b) "Service office" means a county veterans service office.

4 (2) SEPARATION DOCUMENTS. Separation documents and copies of separation 5 documents evidencing service in the armed forces of the U.S. are confidential and 6 privileged. Examination of these records in the possession of the department or 7 service office is limited to authorized employees of the department or service office 8 and information entered in these records may be disclosed only to veterans and their 9 duly authorized representatives or to interested governmental agencies for the 10 purpose of assisting veterans and their dependents to obtain the rights and benefits 11 to which they may be entitled.

(3) U.S. DEPARTMENT OF VETERANS AFFAIRS RECORDS. Records and papers in the
 possession of the department or service office that are released to the department or
 service office by the U.S. department of veterans affairs or that contain information
 provided by the U.S. department of veterans affairs are confidential. Release of
 information from these records or papers may be made only under regulations of the
 U.S. department of veterans affairs.

(4) INVESTIGATION. All reports of investigation made by employees of the
 department or at the direction of the department for official departmental purposes
 are only for the use of the secretary and staff. Materials and information that
 disclose the investigative techniques of the department or the identity of confidential
 informants and material received in confidence by representatives of the department
 may not be released.

1 (5) VITAL RECORDS. The service office may obtain a copy of a vital record under 2 s. 69.30 (2) and may transmit the copy to the department or to the U.S. department 3 of veterans affairs to assist a veteran or his or her dependent in obtaining a benefit. 4 (6) DISCLOSURE OF MONETARY BENEFITS. The department shall disclose, to any 5 person who requests, the amount of any paynment, grant, or loan made by the 6 department to any applicant. A person seeking this information shall be required 7 to sign a statement setting forth the person's name and address and the reason for 8 making the request and certifying that the person will not use the information 9 obtained for commercial or political purposes.

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10 (7) DISCLOSURE OF LOAN STATUS INFORMATION. The department may disclose to 11 a consumer reporting agency, as defined in 15 USC 1681a (f), the current repayment 12 status of, the balances due on, and other relevant information pertaining to 13 department loans that is readily accessible on any loans on which balances are due 14 and owing the department. The department may charge consumer reporting 15 agencies an amount sufficient to cover all the costs of preparation and delivery of the 16 information.

17 (8) DISCLOSURE OF OTHER INFORMATION. Except as provided in subs. (2) to (6), 18 all files, records, reports, papers, and documents pertaining to applications for 19 benefits from the department, and information contained in them, may be released 20 by the department or service office only under rules of the department. The rules 21 shall provide for the furnishing of information required under sub. (7) and for official 22 purposes by any agency of the U.S. government, by any agency of this state, by any 23 law enforcement, social services, or human services agency of any Wisconsin county, 24 or by members of the state senate and assembly. The rules shall otherwise provide 25 for release of personal information pertaining to or contained in any application for benefits, whether pending or adjudicated, only when authorized in writing by the
 applicants or when necessary to assist applicants in securing veterans benefits that

9	11 semester or the equivalent trimester or quarter credits will be given upon
10	satisfactory completion.
11	d. Study during a summer semester or session.
12	3. "Tuition" means any of the following:
13	a. For the University of Wisconsin System, academic fees, as described in s.
14	36.27 (1), and segregated fees.
15	b. For technical colleges, program fees, as described in s. 38.24 (1m) (a) and (b)
16	and additional fees reported and assessed by the college for the course of study.
17	c. For a high school, a school that is approved under s. 45.03 (11), or a
18	proprietary school that is approved under s. 39.90, the charge for the courses for
19	which a person is enrolled.
20	d. For an institution from which a person receives a waiver of nonresident
21	tuition under s. 39.47, the amount of the reciprocal fee under s. 39.47 (2) and any fees
22	that are similar to segregated fees for the University of Wisconsin System.
23	(b) Income limit. 1. No veteran may receive reimbursement under this section
24	if the department determines that the income of the veteran and his or her spouse

- 1 (2) TUITION REIMBURSEMENT PROGRAM. (a) *Eligibility*. A veteran is eligible for 2 the tuition reimbursement program under this subsection if he or she meets all of the 3 following conditions: 4 1. The veteran applies for the tuition reimbursement program for courses 5 begun within 10 years after separation from the service. 6 2. The veteran is a resident at the time of application for the tuition 7 reimbursement program. 8 3. The veteran is enrolled for at least 12 credits during the semester for which 9 reimbursement is sought. 10 (b) *Program benefits.* 1. A veteran who meets the requirements under par. (a), 11 upon satisfactory completion of a full-time undergraduate semester in any 12 institution of higher education in this state, any school that is approved under s. 13 45.03 (11), any proprietary school that is approved under s. 39.90, or any institution 14 from which the veteran receives a waiver of nonresident tuition under s. 39.47, may 15 be reimbursed an amount not to exceed the total cost of the veteran's tuition minus 16 any grants or scholarships that the veteran receives specifically for the payment of 17 the tuition. Reimbursement is available only for tuition that is part of a curriculum 18 that is relevant to a degree in a particular course of study at the institution. 19 2. An application for reimbursement of tuition under this subsection shall meet 20 all of the following conditions: 21 a. Be completed and received by the department no later than 60 days after the 22 completion of the semester. The department may accept an application received
- 23 more than 60 days after the completion of the semester if the applicant shows good
 24 cause for the delayed receipt.

b. Contain the information necessary to establish eligibility as determined by
 the department.

c. Be on the application form approved by the department.

d. Contain the signatures of both the applicant and a representative of the
institution or school certifying that the applicant has satisfactorily completed the

Reimbursement provided under this subsection shall be paid from the

the department shall determine eligibility on the basis of the dates on which

15	be reimbursed in part for the cost of the course by the department. The person shall
16	present to the department a certificate from the school indicating that the person has

A person may not be reimbursed under this subsection more than 4 times 5 during any consecutive 12–month period. 6 45.21 Retraining grant program. (1) GRANT AMOUNT AND APPLICATION. The 7 department may grant a veteran not more than \$3,000 for retraining to enable the 8 veteran to obtain gainful employment. The department shall determine the amount 9 of the grant based on the veteran's financial need. A veteran may apply for a grant 10 to the county veterans service officer of the county in which the veteran is living. In 8 making its determination, the department shall consider whether the proposed 9 program provides adequate employment skills and is in an occupation for which 10 favorable employment opportunities are anticipated. 11 (3) RULES. This information may be based on a valid statistical
 sample.

SUBCHAPTER III

VETERANS HOUSING LOAN PROGRAM

5 **45.30 Purpose. (1)** LEGISLATIVE FINDINGS. It is determined that veterans, who 6 have sacrificed in the service of their country valuable years of their lives and 7 considerable earning potential, constitute a readily identifiable and particularly 8 deserving segment of this state's population. It is further determined that by making 9 additional housing funds available to eligible veterans, limited private home loan 10 funds will be more readily available to all. It is further determined that the loan 11 programs established under this subchapter are special purpose credit programs for 12 an economically disadvantaged class of persons for the purposes of 15 USC 13 1691–1691f.

14 (2) LEGISLATIVE INTENT. This subchapter is created principally to enable the 15 state and the authority to exercise their borrowing power to increase those funds 16 available for loans providing for the purchase or construction of private housing, 17 without requiring down payments beyond the reach of families of modest means. It 18 is the intent of the legislature that the department in its administration of this 19 subchapter avoid the duplication of those administrative services available through 20 private lending institutions, utilizing the administrative services of such 21 institutions to the maximum extent consistent with the purposes of this subchapter.

(11) GUARANTEED LOANS. (a) Upon any sale of the residence which secures a guaranteed loan made under this section after April 3, 1980, except for the purchase of the residence at the time the loan is initially made, the guaranteed loan may be assumed or continue to be paid in regular monthly installments if the person who assumes the mortgage loan payments or who will make the regular monthly installments agrees to all of the following:

To pay interest on the loan from the date of the assumption of the loan, if the
 loan is assumed, or from the date of the closing of the sale of the residence at the
 maximum rates of interest being charged on guaranteed loans on the date the loan
 was initially made.

23 2. To increase the amortization payments on the loan by an amount sufficient
24 to amortize the loan by the date the balance on the loan is payable in full according

1 (b) The department and authorized lenders shall increase the interest rates 2 and amortization payments on loans assumed under par. (a).

3 (c) After the assumption of a guaranteed loan funded under sub. (6) (c), if the 4 loan is assumed, or the closing of the sale of a residence on which a balance is owing 5 on a guaranteed loan funded under sub. (6) (c), the balance owing on the loan on the 6 date of the assumption of the loan, if the loan is assumed, or the closing of the sale 7 may be paid to the funds created under sub. (10) from available surpluses, if any, in 8 the veterans mortgage loan repayment fund under sub. (7) (d). The loan and the 9 mortgage and mortgage note pertaining to the loan may be purchased by the 10 veterans mortgage loan repayment fund under sub. (7).

11 (12) PRIOR PROGRAM LOANS. Subject to this section and ss. 45.33 to 45.35, neither 12 the department nor an authorized lender may deny a person a loan under this section 13 because of the reason the person sold any property previously mortgaged by the 14 person to the department or an authorized lender, if the person completely paid the 15 balance of any previous loan under this subchapter in accordance with the terms and 16 conditions of the promissory note and the mortgage or other agreement executed in 17 connection with the previous loan.

18 (13) REPAYMENT OF LOAN. Any money appropriated or transferred by law from 19 the veterans mortgage loan repayment fund for purposes other than those listed in 20 sub. (7), other than moneys made temporarily available to other funds under s. 21 20.002 (11), shall be repaid from the general fund with interest at a rate of 5% per 22 year from the the date of the appropriation or transfer to the date of repayment.

SUBCHAPTER IV

ASSISTANCE PROGRAMS

1 **45.40 Economic assistance.** (1) SUBSISTENCE AID. (a) The department may 2 provide subsistence aid to an incapacitated veteran or a dependent of a veteran in 3 an amount that the department determines advisable to prevent undue hardship. 4 The department may provide subsistence aid under this paragraph to a person 5 whose incapacitation is the result of alcohol or other drug abuse, if the person is 6 participating in an alcohol or other drug abuse treatment program approved by the 7 department. The department may provide subsistence aid on a month-to-month 8 basis or for a 3-month period. The department may provide the aid for a 3-month 9 period if the veteran or dependent whose incapacity is the basis for the aid will be 10 incapacitated for more than 3 months, as determined by a health care provider as 11 defined in s. 146.81 (1), and if earned or unearned income or aid from other sources 12 will not be available in the 3-month period. Subsistence aid shall be limited to a 13 maximum of 3 months in a 12–month period unless the department determines that 14 the need for subsistence aid in excess of this maximum time period is caused by the 15 person's relapse.

16 (b) The department may submit a request to the joint committee on finance for 17 supplemental funds from the veterans trust fund to be credited to the appropriation 18 account under s. 20.485 (2) (vm) to provide payments under this section. The joint committee on finance may, from the appropriation under s. 20.865 (4) (u), 19 20 supplement the appropriation under s. 20.485 (2) (vm) in an amount equal to the 21 amount that the department expects to expend under this section. Notwithstanding 22 s. 13.101 (3) (a), the committee is not required to find that an emergency exists. If 23 the cochairpersons of the committee do not notify the secretary within 14 working days after the date of the department's submittal that the committee intends to
schedule a meeting to review the request, the appropriation account shall be
supplemented as provided in the request. If, within 14 working days after the date
of the department's submittal, the cochairpersons of the committee notify the
secretary that the committee intends to schedule a meeting to review the request, the
appropriation account shall be supplemented only as approved by the committee.

7 HEALTH CARE AID. The department may provide to a veteran or the (2) 8 dependent of a veteran temporary health care aid if the department considers it advisable to prevent undue hardship. Health care aid to pay medical or hospital bills 9 10 under this subsection is limited to a payment of up to \$5,000 per veteran or 11 dependent for a 12–month period beginning on the first day of care for which the 12 person seeks reimbursement under this subsection. The department may issue a 13 certificate of entitlement stating that a veteran or dependent is eligible for health 14 care aid under this subsection if the treatment is received within a time period that 15 the department promulgates by rule. The department may not provide health care 16 aid to pay for care provided to the veteran or dependent before the time period 17 identified in the certificate of entitlement, except for emergency care, as determined 18 by the department, if the application for the health care aid is submitted within 90 19 days after the emergency care ends. Health care aid may be used to provide payment 20 for the treatment of alcoholism or other drug addiction or to provide payment for 21 health care required because of alcoholism or other drug addiction or alcohol or other 22 drug abuse. The department may not provide health care aid under this subsection 23 unless the person's health care provider agrees to accept, as full payment for the 24 medical treatment for which the aid is to be granted, the amount of the aid, the

1	amount of the person's health insurance or other 3rd–party payments, if any, and the
2	amount that the department determines the person is capable of paying. The
3	department may not provide health care aid under this subsection if the combined
4	liquid assets of the veteran and veteran's dependents who are living in the same

7 (3) A state veterans organization shall file an application annually with the 8 department for the previous 12–month period ending on March 31 of the year in 9 which it is filed. The application shall contain a statement of salaries and travel 10 expenses paid to employees of the organization engaged in veterans claims service 11 activities at the regional office by the state veterans organization covering the period 12 for which application for a payment is made. The statement shall be certified as 13 correct by a certified public accountant licensed or certified under ch. 442 and sworn 14 to as correct by the adjutant or principal officer of the state veterans organization. 15 The application shall include the state organization's financial statement for its 16 previous fiscal year and evidence of claims service activity that the department 17 requires. The state veterans organization shall submit with its initial application 18 sufficient evidence to establish that it or its national organization, or both, has 19 maintained a full-time service office at the regional office for 5 consecutive years out 20 of the 10-year period immediately preceding the application. 1 (4) From the appropriation under s. 20.485 (2) (s), the department shall 2 annually provide a payment of \$100,000 to the Wisconsin department of the Disabled 3 American Veterans for the provision of transportation services to veterans.

45.42 Veterans personal loans. (1) It is determined that the loan program 5 established under this section is a special purpose credit program for an economically 6 disadvantaged class of persons for purposes of 15 USC 1691-1691f.

7 (2) The department may lend a veteran, a veteran's unremarried surviving 8 spouse, or a deceased veteran's child not more than \$25,000, or a lesser amount 9 established by the department under sub. (9). The department may prescribe loan 10 conditions, but the term of the loan may not exceed 10 years. The department shall 11 ensure that the proceeds of any loan made under this section shall first be applied 12 to pay any delinquent child support or maintenance payments owed by the person 13 receiving the loan and then to pay any past support, medical expenses, or birth 14 expenses owed by the person receiving the loan.

15 (3) The department may lend to the remarried surviving spouse of a deceased 16 veteran or to the parent of a deceased veteran's child not more than \$25,000, or a 17 lesser amount established by the department under sub. (9), for the education of the 18 deceased veteran's child.

19 (4) The department may execute necessary instruments, collect interest and 20 principal, compromise indebtedness, sue and be sued, post bonds, and write off 21 indebtedness that it considers uncollectible. If a loan under this section is secured 22 by a real estate mortgage, the department may exercise the rights of owners and 23 mortgagees generally and the rights and powers set forth in s. 45.32. The 24 department shall pay all interest and principal repaid on the loan into the veterans 25 trust fund.

1 (5) The department may charge loan expenses incurred under this section to 2 the loan applicant. The department shall pay all expenses received under this 3 subsection into the veterans trust fund.

(6) The department may provide a loan under this section to an applicant 5 whose name appears on the statewide support lien docket under s. 49.854 (2) (b) only 6 if the applicant does one of the following:

7 (a) Provides to the department a repayment agreement that the applicant has 8 entered into, that has been accepted by the county child support agency under s. 9 59.53 (5), and that has been kept current for the 6-month period immediately 10 preceding the date of the application.

11 (b) Provides to the department a statement that the applicant is not delinquent 12 in child support or maintenance payments and does not owe past support, medical 13 expenses, or birth expenses, signed by the department of workforce development or 14 its designee within 7 working days before the date of the application.

15 (c) Agrees to use the loan proceeds to pay any delinquent child support or 16 maintenance payments and to pay any past support, medical expenses, or birth 17 expenses if the applicant fails to meet the requirements under par. (a) or (b).

18 (7) No person may receive a loan under this section in an amount that, when 19 added to the balance outstanding on the person's existing loans under s. 45.351 (2), 20 1995 stats., and s. 45.356, 1995 stats., would result in a total indebtedness to the 21 department of more than \$25,000.

22 The department may borrow from the veterans mortgage loan (8) (a) 23 repayment fund under s. 45.37 (7) (a) to obtain money to make loans under this 24 section.

1 (b) The department may enter into transactions with the state investment 2 board to obtain money to make loans under this section. Transactions authorized 3 under this paragraph may include the sale of loans.

4 (9) Subject to the limit established in subs. (2) and (3), the department may 5 periodically adjust the maximum loan amount based upon financial market 6 conditions, funds available, needs of the veterans trust funds, or other factors that 7 the department considers relevant.

8

(10) The department may periodically adjust the interest rates for loans made 9 under this section, which may vary based upon the term of the loan, the type of 10 security offered, the method of payment, or other factors that the department 11 considers relevant.

12 (11) If an applicant's total indebtedness for loans made under this section is 13 more than \$5,000, the loan shall be evidenced by a promissory note and secured by 14 a mortgage on real estate located in this state. A loan of \$5,000 or less made to an 15 applicant whose total indebtedness for loans made under this section is \$5,000 or less 16 shall be evidenced by a promissory note and secured by a guarantor or by a mortgage 17 on real estate located in this state. A mortgage securing a loan made under this 18 section is acceptable if the applicant has equity in the property subject to the 19 mortgage equal to or exceeding a minimum amount that the department establishes 20 by rule.

21 **45.43 Veterans assistance program. (1)** The department shall administer 22 a program to provide assistance to persons who served in the U.S. armed forces or 23 in forces incorporated as part of the U.S. armed forces and who were discharged 24 under conditions other than dishonorable. The department shall provide assistance 25 to persons whose need for services is based upon homelessness, incarceration, or other circumstances designated by the department by rule. The department shall
designate the assistance available under this section, which may include assistance
in receiving medical care, dental care, education, employment, and transitional
housing. The department may provide payments to facilitate the provision of
services under this section.

- 6 (2) The department may charge fees for transitional housing and for other 7 assistance provided under this section that the department designates. The 8 department shall promulgate rules establishing the fee schedule and the manner of 9 implementation of that schedule.

SUBCHAPTER V

VETERANS HOMES

12 **45.50 Veterans homes; management. (1)** (a) The department shall operate 13 the Wisconsin Veterans Home at King and employ a commandant for the home. The 14 department may employ a commandant for the Wisconsin Veterans Home at Union 15 Grove or the Wisconsin Veterans Home at Chippewa Falls. The department may 16 employ any personnel that are necessary for the proper management and operation 17 of veterans homes. In compliance with the compensation plan established pursuant 18 to s. 230.12 (3), a commandant may recommend to the director of personnel charges 19 for meals, living quarters, laundry, and other services furnished to employees and 20 members of the employees' family maintained at veterans homes. The department 21 shall provide complete personal maintenance and medical care, including programs 22 and facilities that promote comfort, recreation, well-being, or rehabilitation shall be 23 furnished to all members of veterans homes under policies established of the 24 department.

1	(b) All money received in reimbursement for services to veterans homes
2	employees or in payment for meals served to guests at veterans homes shall be
3	accumulated in an account named "employee maintenance credits" and shall be paid
4	into the general fund within one week after receipt and credited to the appropriation
5	under s. 20.485 (1) (gk).
6	(c) Veterans homes with a skilled nursing facility shall include a geriatric
7	evaluation, research and education program. The program staff shall be funded from
8	the appropriations under s. 20.485 (1) (hm), (j) and (mj).
9	(2) (a) Subject to authorization under ss. 13.48 (10) and 20.924 (1), the
10	department may construct or renovate and operate residential, treatment, and
11	nursing care facilities, including a community–based residential facility, to be known
12	as the Wisconsin Veterans Home at Union Grove.
13	(b) Subject to authorization under ss. 13.48 (10) and 20.924 (1), the department
14	may develop, construct or renovate, and operate residential, treatment, and nursing
15	care facilities and programs for veterans in northwestern Wisconsin, on the property
16	of the Northern Wisconsin Center for the Developmentally Disabled in Chippewa
17	Falls to be known as the Wisconsin Veterans Home at Chippewa Falls. The programs
18	and facilities may include an assisted living facility, a skilled nursing facility, a
19	medical clinic, an adult day health care center, an activities center, and a veterans
20	assistance program.
21	(3) The department may acquire, by gift, purchase, or condemnation, lands
22	necessary for the purposes of the Wisconsin Veterans Home at Union Grove and the
23	Wisconsin Veterans Home at King. Title to the lands shall be taken in the name of
0.4	

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this state and shall be held by and for the uses and purposes of the homes. Nopayment may be made out of the state treasury or otherwise for the land until the

title has been examined and approved by the attorney general. Every such deed of
 conveyance shall be immediately recorded in the office of the proper register of deeds
 and filed with the secretary of state.

4 (4) The department may use moneys appropriated under s. 20.485 (1) (h) to
5 purchase, erect, construct, or remodel buildings, to provide additions and
6 improvements, to provide equipment, materials, supplies, and services necessary for
7 the purposes of veterans homes, and for expenses that are necessary and incidental
8 to acquisition of property under s. 45.51 (10) and (11).

9 (5) The department may accept gifts, bequests, grants, or donations of money 10 or of property from private sources to be administered by the department for the 11 purposes of veterans homes. All moneys received shall be paid into the general fund 12 and appropriated as provided in s. 20.485 (1) (h), except that gifts or grants received 13 specifically for the purposes of the geriatric program at veterans homes are 14 appropriated as provided in s. 20.485 (1) (hm). The department may not apply to the 15 gifts and bequests fund interest on certificate of savings deposits for those members 16 who do not receive maximum monthly retained income. The department shall 17 establish for those persons upon their request individual accounts with savings and 18 interest applied as the member requests.

(6) (a) The department may enter into agreements for furnishing and charging
for water and sewer service from facilities constructed at and for veterans homes to
public and private properties lying in the immediate vicinity of veterans homes.

(b) Agreements under this section shall be drafted to hold harmless the
department, to require all expense to be paid by the applicant, and to be terminable
by the department when other water and sewer services become available to the
applicant.

1 (7) A commandant and employees designated by the commandant may 2 summarily arrest all persons within or upon the grounds of veterans homes who are 3 guilty of any offense against the laws of this state or the rules governing veterans 4 homes. For this purpose, a commandant and deputies have the power of constables.

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5 (8) A fire department at a veterans home in response to emergency fire calls
6 may make runs and render fire fighting service beyond the confines of a veterans
7 home.

8 (9) The department may develop a program to provide stipends to individuals 9 to attend school and receive the necessary credentials to become employed at 10 veterans homes. If the department develops a stipend program under this 11 subsection, the department shall promulgate rules related to the program, including 12 the application process, eligibility criteria, stipend amount, repayment provisions, 13 and other provisions that the department determines are necessary to administer 14 the program.

(10) The department may establish a hospital at the veterans homes. All hospitals established under this subsection may not have a total approved bed capacity, as defined in s. 150.01 (4m), greater than 16 beds. The approved bed capacity of a skilled nursing facility operated at a veterans home is reduced by one bed for each approved bed at the hospital established under this subsection at that home.

45.51 Eligibility for membership. (1) GENERAL STATEMENT. Within the
limitations of veterans homes, the department may admit to membership in veterans
homes persons who meet the qualifications set forth in this section.

(2) ELIGIBILITY. (a) The following persons are eligible for benefits under this
 subchapter if they meet the applicable requirements of this subchapter:

13	2. Is permanently incapacitated due to physical disability or age from any
14	substantially gainful occupation.
15	3. Has not been convicted of a felony or of a crime involving moral turpitude
16	or, if so, has produced sufficient evidence of subsequent good conduct and
17	reformation of character as to be satisfactory to the department.
18	4. Provides a complete financial statement containing information that the
19	department determines is necessary to evaluate the financial circumstances of the
20	person. The department may require a member of a veterans home to provide the
21	department with information necessary for the department to determine the
22	financial circumstances of the person. If a person fails to provide the additional
23	information, the department may discharge the person from the veterans home.

 allocated for the care of members of the veterans home, including chronic alcoholism,
 drug addition, psychosis, or active tuberculosis.

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- 4 (3) ADMISSION PRIORITIES. (a) Except in cases where there is an immediate need 5 for physical care or economic assistance, the department shall act on applications 6 based upon the date of receipt of the application by the veterans home. The 7 department may defer establishment of the priority date of the application to the 8 date that the veterans home is able to verify its ability to provide appropriate care 9 to the applicant or to assure that the appropriate care setting is available within the 10 home.
- (b) Spouses, surviving spouses and parents derive their eligibility from the
 eligibility of the person under sub. (2) (a) 1. or 2. Surviving spouses and parents of
 eligible persons under sub. (2) (a) 1. or 2. are eligible for admission only to a skilled
 nursing facility at a veterans home.
- 15 (c) 1. The order of priority for admission to a veterans home shall be as follows:
 a. Eligible persons under sub. (2) (a) 1. or 2. have 1st priority.
- b. Spouses of eligible persons under sub. (2) (a) 1. or 2. have 2nd priority.
- c. Surviving spouses of eligible persons under sub. (2) (a) 1. or 2. have 3rd
 priority for admission.
- d. Parents of eligible persons under sub. (2) (a) 1. or 2. have 4th priority for
 admission.
- 22 2. The department may deviate from this sequence upon order of the board in23 order to prevent the separation of a husband and wife.

1 (4) ADDITIONAL ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS OF A SPOUSE OF A VETERAN. A spouse 2 of an eligible person under sub. (2) (a) 1. or 2. is eligible only if the spouse meets the 3 requirements of sub. (2) (b) 3. to 5. and if all of the following apply: 4 (a) The person under sub. (2) (a) 1. or 2. is a member, or if not a member is 5 institutionalized elsewhere because of physical or mental disability, and the spouse 6 had lived with the person for not less than 6 months immediately before making 7 application for membership. 8 Separation from the spouse necessitated by reason of employment, (b) 9 hospitalization, or because of a physical or mental disability of either spouse shall 10 not be taken to constitute an interruption of the 6-month period. 11 (c) A spouse of an eligible person under sub. (2) (a) 1. or 2. by virtue of a marriage 12 that was void when entered into but validated under s. 765.21 before applying for 13 admission shall, for the purpose of this subsection and sub. (6), be considered 14 married to the eligible person under sub. (2) (a) 1. or 2. from the date the marriage 15 was entered into. 16 (5) ADDITIONAL ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS OF A SURVIVING SPOUSE. The surviving spouse of a person under sub. (2) (a) 1. or 2. who was a resident of this state at the 17 18 time of the veteran's death is eligible if the surviving spouse meets the requirements 19 of sub. (2) (b) 3. to 5. and if the surviving spouse satisfies all of the following 20 conditions: 21 (a) 1. The surviving spouse satisfies any of the following conditions:

a. Was married to and living with the deceased person under sub. (2) (a) 1. or
2. not less than 6 months immediately prior to the death of the person.

b. Was married to the person under sub. (2) (a) 1. or 2. at the time the person
entered the service and who became a widow or widower by the death of the person

1	while in the service or as a result of physical disability of the person incurred during
2	the service.
3	c. The period during which the surviving spouse was married to and lived with
4	the deceased person under sub. (2) (a) 1. or 2. plus the period of widowhood or
5	widowerhood is 6 months or more.
6	d. Was married to and living with the person under sub. (2) (a) 1. or 2. less than
7	6 months and a child was born of the marriage.
8	(b) Has not remarried.
9	(c) Is 45 years of age or over on the date of application.
10	(d) Is physically disabled.
11	(e) Is unable adequately to care for himself or herself and lacks adequate means
12	of support.
13	(f) Has been a resident of this state for the 12 months immediately preceding
14	the date of application for membership.
15	(6) Additional eligibility requirements of parents. The parent of a person
16	under sub. (2) (a) 1. or 2. who was a resident of this state at the time of the person's
17	death or, the parent of a living person under sub. (2) (a) 1. or 2. who is eligible for
18	membership, is eligible if the parent meets the requirements of sub. (2) (b) 3. to 5.
19	and if the parent satisfies all of the following conditions:
20	(a) Has reached 60 years of age.
21	(b) Has been a resident of this state for the 12–months preceding the date of
22	application for membership.
23	(c) Is physically disabled, unable adequately to care for himself or herself, and
24	lacks adequate means of support.

(7) MEMBER INCOME RETENTION AND PAYMENT. (a) The board shall establish a pay
 plan for compensation of members for services rendered to a veterans home under
 its work therapy program.

(b) Members shall pay the amount due the state for care and maintenance of
the member within 30 days after the receipt of the veterans home's billing statement
by the member or by the member's personal representative. The department may
subject any bill not paid within 30 days after receipt of the billing statement to an
interest assessment of 1% per month or fraction of a month. If payment is not made
within 60 days after the receipt of the billing statement, the department may
discharge the member from the veterans home.

(c) Payment of amounts due the state for care and maintenance of a member
shall be made to the fullest extent possible from sources of income other than pension
or compensation paid by the U.S. department of veterans affairs.

(d) A member is not required to use income received from services rendered to
the veterans home under its work therapy program or from the sale of products or
services through the hobby shop as payment for the care or maintenance of the
member at the veterans home.

(e) The department shall supervise the operation of a veterans home exchange,
including the operation of the hobby shop for the sale of products made by all
members.

(8) PERSONAL FUNDS OF MEMBER. A member may, in writing, authorize a
veterans home to receive, hold, and account for his or her personal funds. Section
49.498 (8) and the rules promulgated under that subsection apply to the funds of a
member held by the veterans home under this subsection. The department may
transfer the personal funds of a member received under this subsection to the

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Wisconsin veterans facilities members fund under s. 25.37. Upon request of the
 member, the department shall pay the member the amount the member requests
 from his or her personal account.

4 (9) MEDICAL ASSISTANCE PAYMENTS. All moneys received under medical
5 assistance, as defined in s. 49.43 (8), for the care of members shall be transferred to
6 the appropriation under s. 20.485 (1) (gk).

7 (10) CONVEYANCE OF PROPERTY; DESCENT. (a) Except as otherwise provided in 8 this subsection, the application and admission of any applicant admitted under this 9 section shall constitute a valid and binding contract between a member and the 10 department. If a member dies leaving a relative that is entitled to an interest in the 11 property of the member under the rules of intestate succession or a will the existence 12 of which is made known to the commandant of the veterans home within 60 days of 13 the member's death, the member's property shall constitute a part of the member's 14 estate, except that personal effects of nominal monetary value of a deceased member 15 who is not survived by a member spouse may be distributed by the commandant of 16 to surviving relatives of the member who request the personal effects within a 17 reasonable time after the member's death.

(b) The department may manage, sell, lease, or transfer property passing to
the state pursuant to this section or conveyed to it by members, defend and prosecute
all actions concerning it, pay all just claims against it, and do all other things
necessary for the protection, preservation, and management of the property. All
expenditures necessary for the execution of functions under this paragraph or sub.
(14) shall be made from the appropriation in s. 20.485 (1) (h).

(c) A person who at the time of death is a member of a veterans home is aresident of the county in which the veterans home is located for the probate of the

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1 2 person's will, issuance of letters testamentary or other letters authorizing the administration of the decedent's estate, and the administration of the estate.

3 (11) DISPOSITION OF PROPERTY PASSING TO STATE. If a member dies without a 4 relative who is entitled to an interest in the property of the member under the rules 5 of intestate succession and without leaving a will the existence of which is made 6 known to the commandant of the home within 60 days of the member's death, the 7 member's property shall be converted to cash, without administration. The 8 commandant of a veterans home shall submit that converted sum to the secretary 9 of administration to be paid into the appropriation under s. 20.485 (1) (h). The 10 amount paid to the secretary of administration is subject to refund within 6 years to 11 the estate of a member if it is subsequently discovered that the member left a will 12 or a relative that is entitled to an interest in the property of the member under the 13 rules of intestate succession or to any creditor of the member who establishes right 14 to the funds or property or any portion of the funds or property. The department of 15 administration, upon being satisfied that a claim out of the funds or property is legal 16 and valid, shall pay the claim out of the funds or property, except that payment of 17 claims for a member's funeral and burial expenses may not exceed a total of \$1,500 18 including any amount allowed by the United States for the member's funeral and 19 burial and the right for burial and interment provided in s. 45.61 (3).

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(12) POWERS OF COMMANDANT OVER PERSONAL FUNDS OF MEMBERS. A commandant may receive, disburse, and account for funds of members.

(13) ADDITIONAL ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS FOR SKILLED NURSING FACILITIES. Any
 person admitted to a skilled nursing facility at a veterans home shall meet the
 eligibility requirements under ss. 49.45 and 49.46 and rules promulgated under

those sections during residence at the skilled nursing facility except if any of the
 following apply:

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3 (a) Persons with sufficient income and resources to meet the expenses of care
4 for one or more months may be admitted to the skilled nursing facility but shall apply
5 income and resources to costs to the extent required by ss. 49.45 and 49.46 and rules
6 promulgated under those sections.

7 (b) Persons who meet all the requirements of this section but whose degree of 8 physical disability does not meet the minimum requirements in ss. 49.45 and 49.46 9 and rules promulgated under those sections may be admitted to the skilled nursing 10 facility but shall apply income and resources to costs to the extent required by ss. 11 49.45 and 49.46 and rules promulgated under those sections.

(14) ADDITIONAL ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENT FOR OTHER CARE FACILITIES AT VETERANS
HOMES. An otherwise eligible person may be admitted to or remain in residency at
a community-based residential facility, as defined in s. 50.01 (1g) or a residential
care apartment complex, as defined in s. 50.01 (1d) at a veterans home only if the
person has sufficient income and resources, and applies the income and resources to
fully reimburse the department for the cost of providing care to the person.

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SUBCHAPTER VI

FUNERALS, BURIALS AND CEMETERIES

45.60 Military funeral honors (1) PROGRAM. (a) The department shall
administer a program to coordinate the provision of military funeral honors to
deceased veterans.

(b) Military funeral honors may be provided by local units of member
organizations of the council on veterans programs, by local units of veterans
organizations certified by the department to provide military funeral honors, by

members of the Wisconsin national guard activated under s. 21.11 (3), or by staff of
 the department.

3 (2) STIPENDS From the appropriation under s. 20.485 (2) (q), the department
4 shall reimburse a local unit of a member organization of the council on veterans
5 programs or a local unit of a veterans organization certified by the department to
6 provide military funeral honors for the costs of providing a military funeral honors
7 to a deceased veteran. The reimbursement may not exceed \$50 for each funeral for
8 which military honors are provided.

9 (3) TUITION VOUCHER (a) The department shall create a tuition voucher form 10 to be used by funeral directors under par. (b). The department shall distribute copies 11 of the tuition voucher form, plus an explanation of the form's use, to every operator 12 of a funeral establishment. The department may not charge a fee for the tuition 13 voucher form or for the distribution of the form.

14 (b) A funeral director may issue a tuition voucher in the amount of \$25 to an 15 individual who sounds "Taps" on a bugle, trumpet, or cornet during each funeral for 16 which military honors are held in this state for a deceased veteran and who is a 17 student in grades 6 to 12 or at an institution of higher education, as defined under 18 s. 895.515 (1) (b). The tuition voucher may be used at any time for the payment of 19 tuition and required program activity fees at a University of Wisconsin System 20 institution as provided under s. 36.27 (3r) or a technical college as provided under 21 s. 38.24 (6). The department shall encourage private institutions of higher education 22 to accept the vouchers. The vouchers are not transferable.

45.61 Wisconsin veterans cemeteries. (1) DEFINITION. In this section,
"dependent child" means any biological or adoptive child under 18 years of age, or
under the age of 26 if in full-time attendance at a recognized school of instruction

1 of of any age if the child is unmarried and incapable of self-support by reason of 2 mental or physical disability.

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****NOTE: Another definition that includes "dependent".

3 (2) CONSTRUCTION AND OPERATION OF CEMETERIES. Subject to authorization 4 under ss. 13.48 (10) and 20.924 (1), the department may construct and operate 5 veterans cemeteries in central, northwestern, and southeastern Wisconsin and may 6 employ any personnel that are necessary for the proper management of the 7 cemeteries. The cemetery in central Wisconsin is the Central Wisconsin Veterans 8 Memorial Cemetery. The cemetery in southeastern Wisconsin is the Southern 9 Wisconsin Veterans Memorial Cemetery. The cemetery in northwestern Wisconsin 10 is the Northern Wisconsin Veterans Memorial Cemetery. The department may 11 acquire, by gift, purchase, or condemnation, lands necessary for the purposes of the 12 cemeteries. Title to the properties shall be taken in the name of this state. Every 13 deed of conveyance shall be immediately recorded in the office of the proper register of deeds and thereafter filed with the secretary of state. The department may accept 14 15 for the state all gifts, grants, and bequests for the purposes of maintenance, 16 restoration, preservation, and rehabilitation of the veterans cemeteries constructed 17 under this subsection. All cemeteries operated by the department are exempt from 18 the requirements of ss. 157.061 to 157.70 and 440.90 to 440.95.

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(3) ELIGIBILITY. The following persons are eligible for burial at a cemetery 20 constructed and operated under sub. (1):

21 (a) A person who died while on active duty or who was discharged or released 22 from active duty in the U.S. armed forces under honorable conditions and who was 23 a resident of this state at the time of his or her entry or reentry into active service 24 and his or her dependent children and surviving spouse.

1 (b) A person who was discharged or released from active duty in the U.S. armed 2 forces under honorable conditions and who was a resident of this state at the time 3 of his or her death and his or her dependent children and surviving spouse. 4 (c) The spouse or dependent child of a person who is serving on active duty at 5 the time of the spouse's or dependent child's death if the person was a resident of this 6 state at the time of his or her entry or reentry into active service. 7 (d) The spouse or dependent child of a person if the person was a resident of this 8 state at the time of his or her entry or reentry into active service and was discharged 9 or released from active duty in the U.S. armed forces under honorable conditions. 10 (e) The spouse or dependent child of a person who was discharged or released 11 from active duty in the U.S. armed forces under honorable conditions if the person 12 and spouse or dependent child were residents of this state at the time of the spouse's 13 or dependent child's death. 14 (f) A person who was a resident of this state at the time of his or her entry or 15 reentry into service in any national guard or a reserve component of the U.S. armed 16 forces or who was a resident of this state for at least 12 consecutive months 17 immediately preceding his or her death, and the person's spouse, surviving spouse 18 and dependent children, if the person is eligible for burial in a national cemetery 19 under 38 USC 2402.

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(g) A person who was discharged or released from active duty in the U.S. armed 21 forces under honorable conditions and who was a resident of the state for at least 12 22 consecutive months after entering or reentering service on active duty.

23 (4) FEES AND COSTS. The department may charge a fee for burials under this 24 section and may promulgate rules for the assessment of any fee. The cost of 1

preparing the grave and the erection of a marker for a person described under par. (a), (b), (f), or (g) shall be paid from the appropriation under 20.485 (1) (gk).

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(5) APPLICATION Application for burial shall be made to the department. The surviving spouse of the person described under par. (a), (b), (f), or (g), if that person is interred at the Central Wisconsin Veterans Memorial Cemetery, shall have the privilege of selecting a lot next to that person if available. The department shall hold the plot for the surviving spouse for a period of one year from date of granting the privilege, but may extend the hold, on request, for additional one-year periods.

9 (6) EXPENSES Expenses incident to the burial under this section shall be paid 10 from the estate of the decedent, except that if there is no estate or the estate is 11 insufficient, the expense of burial, or necessary part of the burial, shall be paid from 12 the appropriation under s. 20.485 (1) (gk) and the amount expended for those 13 expenses shall not exceed the amount established for funeral and burial expenses 14 under s. 49.785 (1) (b).

45.62 Burial places compiled. (1) The department may compile a record
of veteran's burial places located within the state that may, so far as practicable,
indicate all of the following information:

- 18 (a) The deceased veteran's name.
- 19 (b) The service in which the deceased veteran was engaged.
- 20 (c) The appropriate designation of the deceased veteran's armed forces unit.
- 21 (d) The deceased veteran's rank and period of service.

(e) The name and location of the cemetery or other place in which the deceasedveteran's body is interred.

(f) The location of the deceased veteran's grave in the cemetery or other placeof interment.

(g) The character of the headstone or other marker, if any, at the deceased
 veteran's grave.

3 (2) The department may prepare blank forms for the transmission to the 4 department of the information required for the record under sub. (1). The 5 department may distribute the forms to county veterans service officers. A county 6 veterans service officer within whose county any cemetery or other burial place is 7 located in which deceased veteran's bodies are interred shall submit the facts 8 required for the record under sub. (1) to the department on the forms provided by the 9 department, if so requested by the department.

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SUBCHAPTER VII

MEMORIALS

12 45.70 Veterans memorial. (1) PERSIAN GULF MEMORIAL From the 13 appropriation under s. 20.485 (2) (d), the department shall provide funding to the 14 Wisconsin Vietnam Veterans Memorial Project, Inc., for the construction of a 15 memorial for the veterans of the Persian Gulf war. The memorial shall be 16 constructed at the veterans memorial site located at The Highground in Clark 17 County. The department may expend up to \$60,000 for the memorial for the veterans of the Persian Gulf war. 18

(2) CAMP RANDALL MEMORIAL. (a) The board may approve, recommend and veto
 any proposed plans, modifications and changes or policies with respect to established
 state memorials, including the Camp Randall Memorial Park, Madison, Wisconsin,
 as described in par. (c), and any future veterans state memorials; and recommend the
 creation and establishment of veterans state memorials.

(b) No structures other than memorials approved by the board and walks, roadsand subterranean footings may be placed or erected upon Camp Randall Memorial

Park unless authorized by the legislature; nor shall the park be used for any purpose
 other than a memorial park.

3 (c) Camp Randall Memorial Park, Madison, Wisconsin, is established and 4 described as follows: beginning on the west line of Randall Avenue 96.6 feet north 5 of the center line of Dayton Street extended; thence west at right angles to Randall 6 Avenue 370 feet; thence south parallel to Randall Avenue 722 feet; thence west at 7 right angles to Randall Avenue 235 feet; thence south parallel to Randall Avenue 205 8 feet to the north line of Monroe Street; thence north 50 degrees 14 minutes east along 9 the north line of Monroe Street approximately 780 feet to the west line of Randall 10 Avenue; thence north along the west line of Randall Avenue 429 feet to the place of 11 beginning.

- 45.71 Catalog of memorials. The department shall prepare a catalog of
 memorials, describing each memorial and giving its location and condition. The
 department shall periodically update that catalog.
- 45.72 County and municipal memorials. (1) In this section and s. 45.73,
 "local unit of government" means a city, village, town, or county.

17 (2) Any local unit of government may by gift, purchase, contract, or 18 condemnation acquire property, real or personal, for the purpose of providing, 19 furnishing, constructing, erecting, repairing, maintaining, or conducting a suitable 20 memorial to the memory of former residents thereof who lost their lives in the 21 military or naval service of the state or of the United States, or to commemorate and 22 honor the deeds of persons, residents thereof, or of the state or United States, who 23 served the nation in any war, or other persons who rendered great state or national 24 service, or to the memory of any president of the United States, or for a combination 25 of any those purposes, which are declared to be public purposes.

(3) The local unit of government shall determine the character of the memorial,
 and without limitation because of enumeration, the memorial may comprise a public
 building, hospital, sanatorium, home for the aged or indigent, park, recreation
 facility, community forest, or other suitable object having a public purpose.

5 (4) Any local unit of government may appropriate money and may levy a tax 6 in order to acquire, pay for, construct, erect, furnish, equip, operate, repair, maintain, 7 or reconstruct a suitable memorial for the purpose or purposes provided in this 8 section.

9 (5) Any local unit of government may authorize the use of any public property 10 respectively of such city, village, town, or county as a site for a memorial, and any 11 county may authorize its public property to be so used by any city, village, or town 12 in the county.

(6) Any local unit of government may by ordinance or contract provide for the management, control, or operation of any memorial, and it may enter into a written lease, for a term not exceeding 25 years, with any duly chartered and incorporated veterans organization established in the local unit of government, such lease to include provisions for the amount of rental and such conditions of public use as it may determine.

(7) Any local unit of government may contract with or make an appropriation, or both, to any other unit of government or to any nonprofit corporation without capital stock organized expressly for any of the purposes of this section or to any duly chartered and incorporated veterans organization established in any such city, village, town, or county, and for the purpose of raising funds for such memorial purposes or contributions, may levy taxes upon the taxable property located in the county or municipality, or borrow money and issue the bonds of the respective

1 municipalities therefor in the manner and under the regulations provided by ch. 67; 2 provided that the facilities of such memorial are made available to the residents of 3 the governmental unit making such appropriation to the extent that the governing 4 body of the governmental unit may require.

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45.73 Sites for veterans memorial halls. (1) Any local unit of government 6 may donate to any organization specified in s. 70.11 (9) land upon which is to be 7 erected a memorial hall to contain the memorial tablet specified in said section.

The action of any local unit of government, in granting veterans 8 (2) 9 organizations or any other civic, patriotic, educational or historical society, rooms 10 and space within public buildings for the establishment of memorial halls and 11 museums, and occupancy thereof by its members, is authorized and confirmed. The 12 local unit of government may permit the use and occupancy of such rooms and space 13 for such term and subject to conditions and provisions as may be imposed by them. 14 Any contract, lien, or agreement between the local unit of government and any 15 organization now in force shall continue in force according to the terms of the 16 contract, lien, or agreement.

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45.74 Memorial corporations organized under 1919 act. Any commission 18 or board of trustees which governs a corporation organized to construct a memorial under s. 45.057 (5), statutes of 1919 to 1943 (created by chapter 598, laws of 1919, and repealed by chapter 301, laws of 1945), shall have the following powers in addition to those it now has:

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(a) All powers vested in the members of such corporation by the articles of incorporation or bylaws, including the power to amend the articles of incorporation. (b) The powers set forth in s. 181.0302 and all other applicable provisions of ch.

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181.

(c) It may convey any property under its control to any municipality and lease
 it back under terms agreed upon by the commission or board of trustees and the
 municipality.

4 (d) It shall have a membership composed of 5 residents of the city, village, or 5 town in which the memorial is located, one appointed by the common council, village 6 board, or town board of the city, village, or town, and 4 by the circuit judge of the 7 county in which the memorial is located. The commission or board may appoint 4 8 additional members who are residents of this state. The terms of all members shall 9 be 5 years. In order that terms of members may expire at different times, not more 10 than 2 members shall be appointed in any one year in addition to appointments made 11 to fill vacancies occurring by resignation or death. Members shall hold office until 12 their successors are appointed and qualify.

(e) It may dissolve the corporation and dispose of the real and personal property
of the corporation in a manner which it deems will best serve the purposes for which
it was organized and the interests of the community.

16 (2) Notwithstanding the repeal of s. 45.057, 1943 stats., by chapter 301, laws
17 of 1945, the continuing existence of all commissions, boards, and corporations
18 organized under s. 45.057 (5), statutes of 1919 to 1943, is affirmed, and the
19 continuing operation of such commissions, boards and corporations is ratified as to
20 the past and authorized in the future.

45.75 Memorials in populous counties. (1) Any county having a population
of 500,000 or more may establish and maintain a memorial or memorials under s.
45.72 by agreement between the county board of the county and any nonprofit
private corporation without capital stock organized under the laws of this state,

1	except as provided in this section, expressly for any of the purposes of s. 45.72 located
2	in the county.
3	(2) The board of directors of the corporation shall be designated as the
4	"memorial board", and its members shall be called "trustees". The membership of
5	the memorial board may include special members, who need not be members of the
6	corporation.
7	(3) The memorial board shall consist of 15 members; of whom 8 may be special
8	members to be elected as provided in this section; and the remaining members shall
9	be elected from the membership of the corporation.
10	(4) Special members of the memorial board shall be elected by the county board
11	of such county and consist of the following:
12	(a) Four members from the county board.
13	(b) Four members elected from among the residents of the county.
14	(5) Terms of members of the memorial board shall be as follows:
15	(a) For special members:

Members elected from the county board shall be elected at the first meeting
 of the county board following each county board general election and their terms
 shall commence on that date. They shall hold office during their terms on the county
 board and until their successors are elected and qualified.

- 20 2. Members elected from among the residents shall hold office for 4 years and 21 until their successors are elected, except that the first 4 such members shall be 22 chosen for 1, 2, 3, and 4 years, respectively.
- 3. Any vacancy in such special membership shall be filled by the county board
 for the unexpired term, and until a successor is elected and qualified.

1 (b) For elected members from the corporate membership: The terms of the 2 trustees shall be for such numbers of years that those of an equal number, as nearly 3 as may be, shall expire in 2, 3, and 4 years, and successive terms of 4 years each 4 thereafter and until their successors are elected and qualified.

5 (6) The articles of incorporation of the corporation shall provide originally or 6 by amendment, in addition to other necessary provisions, and as permitted by this 7 section, for the classification of the members of the corporation, for the election of 8 trustees proportionately from and by those classifications, for the terms of the 9 members of the corporation and for the officers, their duties, and the terms thereof 10 to be elected from the membership.

(7) The war memorial may be constructed upon any land ceded before July 15,
12 1953 by this state to any municipality in this state notwithstanding any restrictions,
13 limitations or conditions as to the nature of the use of any the land contained in the
14 legislative act, granting the land to the municipality, and notwithstanding the
15 restrictions, limitations or conditions incorporated in any subsequent conveyance of
16 the lands by the municipality.

17 (8) The war memorial may be constructed in any public park and the use of 18 those park lands as a location for a war memorial shall not be considered inconsistent 19 with the use of the same for park purposes. No war memorial shall be constructed 20 in a public park until the park commission, general manager appointed under s. 21 27.03 (2) or park board having jurisdiction of the park shall approve the construction. 22 The county board of any county may authorize the construction of a war memorial 23 at different intervals of time if the proposed memorial consists of more than one 24 building or structure and any county board subsequently elected shall carry into 25 effect any contract authorized by s. 45.72 entered into on behalf of the county for the

4	(3) SALARY. The salary of the county veterans service officer shall be fixed by

9	(5) DUTIES. The county veterans service officer shall do all of the following:

11	armed forces regarding any benefits to which they may be entitled or any complaint
12	or problem arising out of such service and render to them and their dependents all
13	possible assistance.
14	(b) Make such reports to the county board as the county board requires.
15	(c) Cooperate with federal and state agencies which serve or grant aids or
16	benefits to former military personnel and their dependents.
17	(d) Furnish information about veterans burial places within the county as
18	required by s. 45.62 (2).
19	(e) Perform the duties prescribed by law, including those duties under pars. (a)
20	to (d), separately and distinctly from any other county department.
21	(6) PERMITTED ACTIVITIES. The county veterans service officer may do any of the
22	following:
23	(a) Inform persons living in the service officer's county who are members of the
24	national guard or of a reserve unit of the U.S. armed forces or dependents of those
25	persons regarding potential benefits to which they may be or may become entitled

and regarding all necessary military points of contact and general deployment
 information for activated and deployed members of the national guard or reserve
 units of the U.S. armed forces.

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4 (b) Cooperate with federal and state agencies that serve or grant aids or
5 benefits to members of the national guard or reserve units of the U.S. armed forces
6 and their dependents.

7 (7) OFFICE SPACE AND ASSISTANTS. (a) The county board shall provide the county
8 veterans service officer with office space, clerical assistance and any other needs
9 which will enable the officer to perform the duties under sub. (5).

10 (b) Except as provided under par. (c), the county board may appoint assistant 11 county veterans service officers who shall be Wisconsin residents who served on 12 active duty under honorable conditions in the U.S. armed forces or in forces 13 incorporated as part of the U.S. armed forces for 2 consecutive years. An individual 14 who is discharged for reasons of hardship or a service-connected disability or 15 released due to a reduction in the U.S. armed forces or for the good of the service prior 16 to the completion of the required period of service is eligible for appointment to the 17 office, regardless of the actual time served.

(c) In any county with a county executive or county administrator, the county
veterans service officer may appoint assistant county veterans service officers who
shall have the qualifications prescribed under par. (b).

(8) GRANTS TO COUNTIES AND TRIBES FOR IMPROVEMENT OF SERVICES. (a) Each
county may annually apply to the department for a grant for the improvement of
service to former military personnel of the county through the county veterans
service office. A county may not allocate any portion of a grant for use by another
county department nor may the county reduce funding to a county veterans service

1 office based upon receipt of a grant. The county veterans service officer of any county 2 applying for the grant shall enter into an agreement with the department. The 3 agreement shall state the goals and objectives to be attained by the county veterans 4 service office during the remainder of the year covered by the grant application. The 5 department shall prepare the basic form of this agreement in consultation with the 6 county veterans service officers association and provide a copy and an explanation 7 of that agreement to each county veterans service officer. The department shall 8 develop reasonable budget and operating standards to assure improved services, but 9 full operating control of the county office shall be left to each county.

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10 (b) The department shall award a grant annually to a county that meets the 11 standards developed under this subsection and employs a county veterans service 12 officer who, if chosen after August 9, 1989, is chosen from a list of candidates who 13 have taken a civil service examination for the position of county veterans service 14 officer developed and administered by the division of merit recruitment and selection 15 in the office of state employment relations, or is appointed under a civil service 16 competitive examination procedure under ch. 63 or s. 59.52 (8). The grant shall be 17 \$8,500 for a county with a population of less than 20,000, \$10,000 for a county with 18 a population of 20,000 to 45,499, \$11,500 for a county with a population of 45,500 to 19 74,999, and \$13,000 for a county with a population of 75,000 or more. The 20 department shall use the most recent Wisconsin official population estimates 21 prepared by the demographic services center when making grants under this 22 paragraph.

(c) Notwithstanding par. (b), an eligible county with a part-time county
veterans service officer shall be eligible for an annual grant not exceeding \$500.

1 (d) The department shall provide grants to the governing bodies of federally 2 recognized American Indian tribes and bands from the appropriation under s. 20.485 3 (2) (vz) if that governing body enters into an agreement with the department 4 regarding the creation, goals and objectives of a tribal veterans service officer, 5 appoints a veteran to act as a tribal veterans service officer and gives that veteran 6 duties similar to the duties described in s. 45.80 (5), except that the veteran shall 7 report to the governing body of the tribe or band. The department may make annual 8 grants of up to \$2,500 under this paragraph and shall promulgate rules to implement 9 this paragraph.

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10 (9) TRANSPORTATION SERVICES GRANTS TO COUNTIES. (a) Annually, from the 11 appropriation under s. 20.485 (2) (s), the department shall award grants to counties 12 that are not served by transportation services provided by the Wisconsin department 13 of Disabled American Veterans to develop, maintain, and expand transportation 14 services for veterans. The grants may be used to support multicounty cooperative 15 transportation services.

- (b) The department shall promulgate rules specifying the application
 procedures and eligibility criteria for grants under this subsection.
- 18 (c) A county may not reduce funding to a county veterans service office based19 upon receipt of a grant.

(10) QUALIFICATIONS APPLICATION. The qualifications necessary to be a county
veterans service officer or assistant county veterans service officer under subs. (1)
(a) and (6) (b) apply only to persons elected to serve as county veterans service officers
or assistant county veterans service officers on or after June 1, 1996, and who have
not served as county veterans service officers or assistant county veterans service
officers before June 1, 1996.

45.81 County veterans service commission. (1) There is created in each
 county a county veterans service commission consisting of 3 residents of the county
 who are veterans appointed for staggered 3-year terms by the county executive or
 county board chairperson in a county that does not have a county executive.

be signed by the chairperson and secretary of the commission.

(c) The total disbursements made by the commission under this subsection may
not exceed the amount collected from the tax levied, except when specifically
authorized by the county board. The commission shall provide the county treasurer
with sufficient information to deliver the specified aid to the person entitled to that
aid.

1 (d) The commission may furnish aid in a different manner than by supplying 2 money. The commission may request the county treasurer to pay a purveyor of 3 services or commodities for the purchase of services or commodities, or the 4 commission may furnish supplies, as it considers appropriate.

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(e) The commission shall make a detailed report to the county board annually
showing the amount expended under this subsection. The report may not include
any personal identifying information regarding the persons that received aid under
this subsection.

9 (4) A county veterans service officer appointed under s. 45.80 (1) (b) or (4) shall
10 have the administrative powers and duties prescribed for the county veterans service
11 commission under sub. (2).

(5) The county board shall allow the members of the commission a reasonable
rate of compensation for services and actual expenses incurred in the performance
of their duties to be determined under s. 59.22. The county board may provide for
the employment of clerical assistance to the commission.

45.82 Records of meetings and investigations kept by service officer.
The county veterans service officer shall serve as executive secretary of the county
veterans service commission and shall make or direct all necessary investigations to
determine eligibility for aid under s. 45.85 when so requested by the commission.
The county service officer, in making an investigation, may use the facilities for
investigating that are made available by the county board.

45.83 Burial allowance. (1) Each county veterans service officer shall cause
to be interred in a decent and respectable manner in any cemetery in this state, other
than those used exclusively for the burial of paupers, the body of any veteran, spouse,
or surviving spouse who was living in the county at the time of death and who dies

not leaving sufficient means to defray the necessary expenses of a decent burial, or
under circumstances that would cause financial distress to the person's family. The
cost of this internment shall be the responsibility of the county, but may not exceed
\$300, and shall be in addition to the burial allowance payable under laws
administered by the U.S. department of veterans affairs.

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6 (2) Before assuming the burial expense, the county veterans service officer 7 shall exercise due diligence in attempting to determine the financial condition 8 required by sub. (1). The county veterans service officer, in making the inquiry, may 9 use the facilities for investigation that are made available by the county board. The 10 county veterans service officer shall report the results of that determination to the 11 appropriate authorities designated by the county.

12 (3) The chairperson of the county board and the clerk of the county on the 13 receipt of the report under sub. (2) shall draw an order on the county treasurer for 14 the amount of expenses so incurred, payable to the person designated in the report 15 as being entitled to that payment. The county veterans service officer of each county 16 shall, upon the death and burial of a veteran described under sub. (1) who was living 17 in the county at the time of death, make application to the proper authorities for a 18 suitable headstone as provided for by act of congress, and at the expense of the county 19 cause the same to be placed at the head of the deceased's grave.

45.84 Care of graves. (1) Every town board, village board, or common council of every city shall at all times see that the graves and tombstones of all veterans, including women's auxiliary organizations created by act of congress, who shall at any time have served in any branch of the armed forces of the United States, and of the spouses or surviving spouses of all those veterans, receive proper and decent care, and may employ all necessary assistance to carry out this section. The expense of

the care of the graves and tombstones shall be borne by the county where the graves
 are located, except where suitable care is otherwise provided. The amount of expense
 charged the county for the care may not exceed the charge made for the care of other
 graves in the same cemetery.

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5 (2) The governing body specified in sub. (1) shall report to the county clerk of 6 its county, on or before September 1 of each year, the locations of the graves cared for 7 by them under sub. (1), together with the names of the deceased and the amount 8 claimed for care of the graves for the fiscal year from the previous July 1 to June 30.

9 (3) The chairperson of the county board and the county clerk, upon receipt of 10 the report under sub. (2), shall draw an order on the county treasurer for the amount 11 of the expenses incurred in caring for the graves, payable to the person or persons 12 designated in the report as being entitled to the payment.

13 **45.85** County tax for needy veterans. (1) Every county board shall 14 annually levy, in addition to all other taxes, a tax sufficient to carry out the purposes 15 of this section. The tax shall be levied and collected as other county taxes for the 16 purpose of providing aid to needy veterans, the needy spouses, surviving spouses, 17 minor and dependent children of the veterans and the needy parents of veterans 18 entitled to aid under ss. 45.81 to 45.83, and to carry out the purposes of s. 45.84. Aid 19 may not be denied solely on the basis that a person otherwise eligible for aid owns 20 a homestead that the person occupies.

(2) The county veterans service commission or county veterans service officer
