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#### PART I

# KEY PROVISIONS OF COMMITTEE RECOMMENDATION

The Special Committee on Recodification of Chapter 45, Veterans recommends the following proposal to the Joint Legislative Council for introduction in the 2005-06 Session of the Legislature.

2005 Assembly Bill 210, Relating to the Powers and Duties of the Department of Veterans Affairs, Veterans Assistance, Educational Programs, Burials, Cemeteries, Homes, Housing Loans, Memorials, and Museums, the Employment Rights and Benefits Available to Persons Who Are in or Who Return From Military Service, the Educational Approval Board, Granting Rule-Making Authority, Requiring the Exercise of Rule-Making Authority, Making Appropriations, and Providing Penalties

2005 Assembly Bill 210 does the following:

- Reorganizes ch. 45, Stats., by subdividing it into eight subchapters instead of the current two subchapters.
- Makes nonsubstantive editorial changes to modernize language.
- Repeals several provisions considered no longer necessary.
- Moves to other statutory chapters provisions that do not relate directly to veterans.
- Simplifies confusing statutory language by drafting it in a format that is easier to understand.
- Makes minor substantive changes that the Special Committee concluded are relatively noncontroversial.

#### PART II

#### COMMITTEE ACTIVITY

# **Assignment**

The Joint Legislative Council established the Special Committee on Recodification of Ch. 45, Veterans, and appointed the chairperson by a May 21, 2004 mail ballot. The committee was directed to conduct a recodification of ch. 45, Stats., relating to veterans, to include reorganizing the chapter in a logical manner, renumbering and retitling sections, consolidating related provisions, modernizing language, resolving ambiguities in language, making other necessary organizational changes, and making minor substantive changes.

Membership of the Special Committee, appointed by July 21 and August 5, 2004 mail ballots, consisted of three Senators, five Representatives and six public members. A list of committee members is included as *Appendix 3* to this report.

# **Summary of Meetings**

The Special Committee held two meetings in Madison on the following dates:

September 30, 2004 February 1, 2005

At the <u>September 30, 2004</u> meeting of the Special Committee, staff reviewed for the committee the organization of the current ch. 45, Stats. Staff also suggested a table of contents for a revised ch. 45 that would divide the current chapter, consisting of two subchapters, into eight subchapters, with similar provisions being grouped together. One of the county veteran service officer (CVSO) members suggested a different order for the subchapters, with the provisions that are used most frequently by veterans and persons who assist veterans being placed in the beginning of the chapter. The committee concurred in this suggested reorganization.

At the meeting, the committee also heard a presentation by Public Member Anthony Hardie, Executive Assistant of the Department of Veterans Affairs (DVA). Mr. Hardie cited several examples of problems with the current chapter, including varying definitions of the term "veteran" in the chapter. He suggested defining the term in the beginning of the chapter and then using an eligibility provision for each veterans program, rather than defining "veteran" differently for each program. He also suggested modernizing the language of the chapter, including citing the three veterans homes in the statutes by the municipalities in which they are located, which is what DVA calls them, rather than by their geographic location in the state.

Because of the technical nature of much of the recodification, Chairperson Townsend appointed a Drafting Subcommittee in order to expedite the deliberations of the committee. The subcommittee consisted of Anthony Hardie from DVA and Larry Olson from the Department of Military Affairs. Although the subcommittee formally consisted of only those two members, Kenneth Brown and Tim Thiers, the CVSO members of the Special Committee, frequently attended and participated in the deliberations of the subcommittee. In addition, the subcommittee received a great deal of assistance from Robert Nelson, Senior Attorney with the Legislative Reference Bureau, and John Rosinski, Chief Legal Counsel at DVA.

The Drafting Subcommittee developed legislation by reviewing the statutes that were to be placed in a particular subchapter, suggesting changes in those statutes, and then reviewing an initial draft and a redraft of the new subchapter. Toward the end of its deliberations, all of the subchapter drafts were combined, together with cross-reference changes that were needed because of the renumbering of many of the provisions of the chapter.

Following the deliberations of the Drafting Subcommittee, the Special Committee met on February 1, 2005. At that meeting, the committee reviewed the composite draft that was recommended by the subcommittee. Legislative Council staff summarized for the committee the process used by the subcommittee and the organization of the revised ch. 45, Stats. Staff also highlighted the minor substantive changes that the subcommittee had suggested, to allow the committee to review them and make any changes that members considered appropriate. Following review of the draft, Chairperson Townsend stated that staff would revise the draft to make changes necessitated by the committee's recommendations, and then submit the draft to the Board of Veterans Affairs for its review. He indicated that the revised draft would be sent to members of the Special Committee for final approval by mail ballot. A mail ballot was sent on February 16, 2005.

## PART III

# RECOMMENDATION INTRODUCED BY THE JOINT LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL

This part of the report provides background information on, and a description of, the bill as recommended by the Special Committee on Recodification of Ch. 45, Veterans.

# Background

Chapter 45, Stats., is the chapter of the Wisconsin Statutes that governs the state DVA and the veterans benefits and programs administered by the department.

In its current form, Ch. 45 is disorganized and difficult to use. It has only two subchapters, one that pertains to the veterans housing loan program and the other containing all of the other provisions relating to veterans. In addition to being poorly organized, the current chapter contains some archaic language and some provisions that belong in other chapters of the statutes. A number of laws pertaining to veterans have been enacted in the previous two legislative sessions in response to the events of September 11, 2001. Those statutory changes have added to the disorganization and complexity of current ch. 45.

# **Description**

The bill does the following:

- 1. Reorganizes the entire chapter by subdividing it into eight subchapters. Currently, the chapter consists of two subchapters, one of which relates to housing programs, and the other of which includes all other veterans programs and services. A table of contents listing all section numbers of reorganized ch. 45 and the newly created subchapters is included in *Appendix 5* to this report.
- 2. Makes nonsubstantive editorial changes to modernize language so that the language is consistent with current drafting style.
- 3. Repeals several provisions considered no longer necessary. For example, language regarding construction of veterans memorials that have already been constructed is eliminated. As another example, language regarding employment of disabled veterans is eliminated in light of the state Fair Employment Act and the federal Americans with Disabilities Act.
- 4. Moves to other chapters of the statutes provisions from current ch. 45 that are not directly related to veterans. For example, provisions dealing with military service (ss. 45.50, 45.51, and 45.53) are moved to ch. 21, which relates to military affairs. As another example, the provision dealing with the educational approval board (s. 45.54) is moved to ch. 39, which relates to educational agencies.
- 5. Simplifies confusing statutory language by drafting it in a format that is easier to understand. For example, the formula for awarding grants to veterans organizations in current s. 45.353 (2) is simplified in the new s. 45.41 (2) by showing how much is received by the organization depending on the level of expenditure.

- 6. Makes minor substantive changes that the Special Committee concluded are relatively noncontroversial. These include the following:
  - a. Expanding the definition of "veteran" that is used in current ch. 45 to include persons who are missing in action, persons who died as the result of a service-connected disability, and persons who died in the line of duty while on inactive or active duty for training purposes.
  - b. Changing the names of the state veterans facilities in current statutes to the Wisconsin Veterans Home at Union Grove, the Wisconsin Veterans Home at King, and the Wisconsin Veterans Home at Chippewa Falls, and generally applying the laws that currently apply to just one or two of the homes to all three homes.
  - c. Expanding the definition of "war period" to include any period after the Iraq War that results in a person receiving an Expeditionary Medal and that the state DVA determines and designates by rule. In designating a war period, the department would be required to review the criteria used to establish the war periods currently listed in the statutes and consult with the U.S. Department of Defense.
  - d. Requiring that ch. 45 be construed as liberally as the language permits in favor of applicants for veterans benefits. Currently, the liberal construction provision applies to many, but not all, parts of the chapter.
  - e. Allowing deceased persons who served under honorable conditions in the National Guard or Reserves to receive military funeral honors. Currently, military funeral honors are limited to deceased persons who served in the U.S. Armed Forces.

# **Committee and Joint Legislative Council Votes**

LRB-0529/2 was recommended by the Special Committee on Recodification of Chapter 45, Veterans, to the Joint Legislative Council for introduction in the 2005-06 Session of the Legislature.

#### **Special Committee Votes**

By a mail ballot dated February 16, 2005, the Special Committee unanimously voted to recommend LRB-0529/2 to the Joint Legislative Council for introduction in the 2005-06 Session of the Legislature. The vote on the draft is as follows:

• LRB-0529/2, relating to the powers and duties of the Department of Veterans Affairs, veterans assistance, educational programs, burials, cemeteries, homes, housing loans, memorials, and museums, the employment rights and benefits available to persons who are in or who return from military service, the Educational Approval Board, granting rule-making authority, requiring the exercise of rule-making authority, making appropriations, and providing penalties: Ayes, 14 (Reps. Townsend, Krawczyk, Loeffelholz, Musser, and Schneider; Sens. Breske, Brown, and Fitzgerald; and Public Members Brown, Hardie, O'Brien, Olson, Thiers, and Wendt); and Noes, 0.

# **Joint Legislative Council Votes**

At its March 9, 2005 meeting, the Joint Legislative Council voted as follows on the recommendation of the Special Committee:

• Introduction by the Joint Legislative Council of LRB-0529/2 passed by a vote of Ayes, 19 (Reps. Wieckert, Ainsworth, Freese, Gard, Huebsch, Kaufert, Kreuser, Nischke, Pocan and Schneider; and Sens. Lasee, Brown, Decker, Grothman, Miller, Risser, Robson, Schultz and Zien); Noes, 0; and Excused, 3 (Rep. Travis; and Sens. Fitzgerald and Kapanke).

The proposal that the Joint Legislative Council voted to introduce was subsequently introduced as 2005 Assembly Bill 210.
