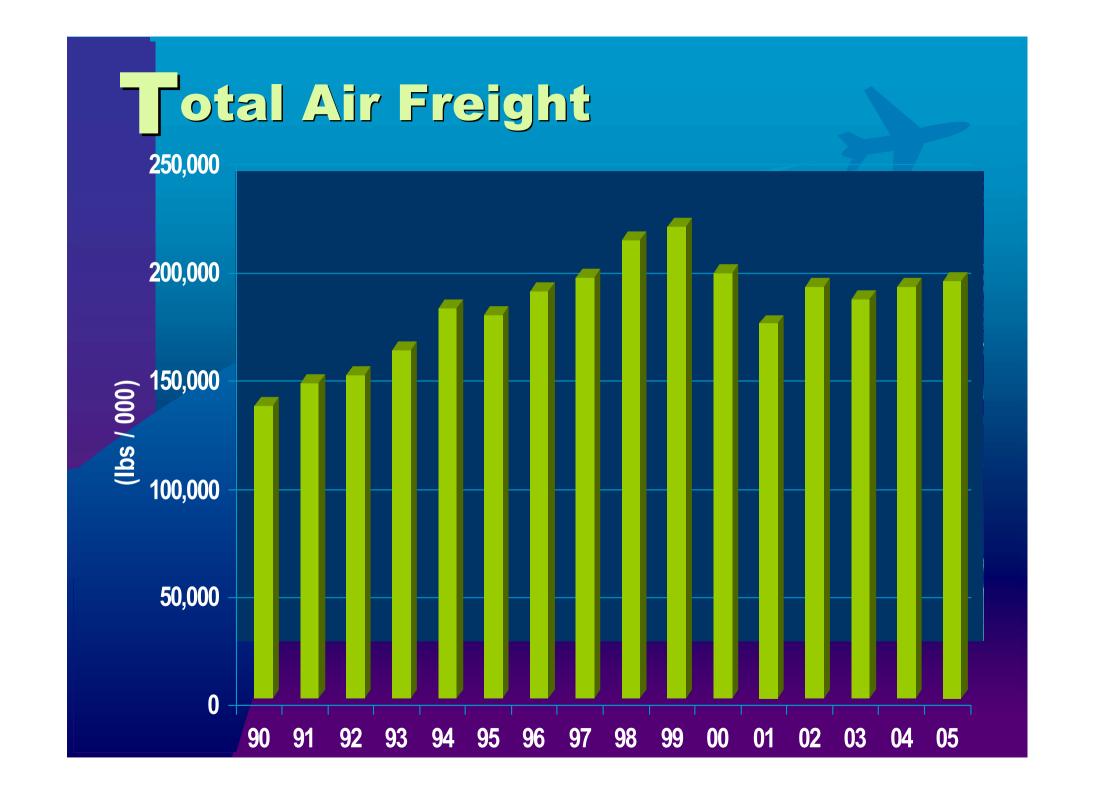




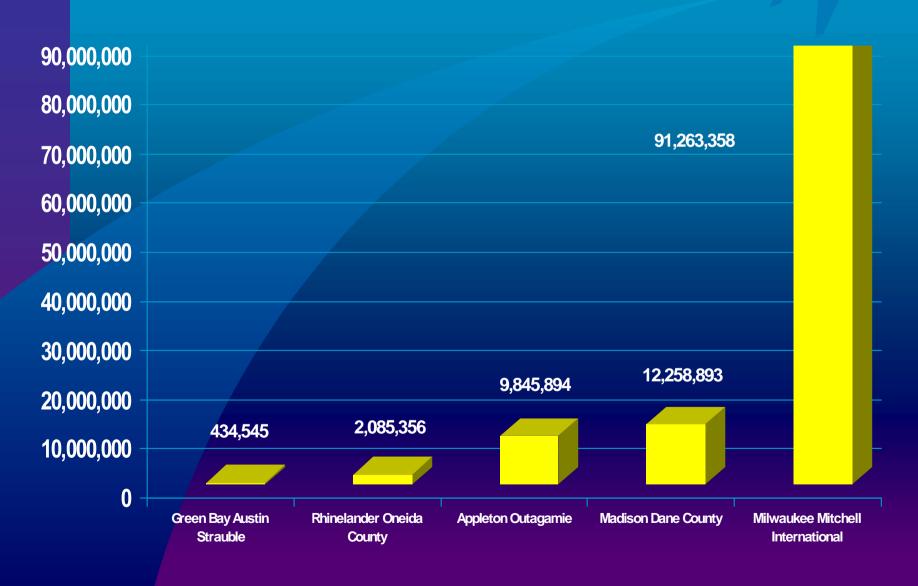


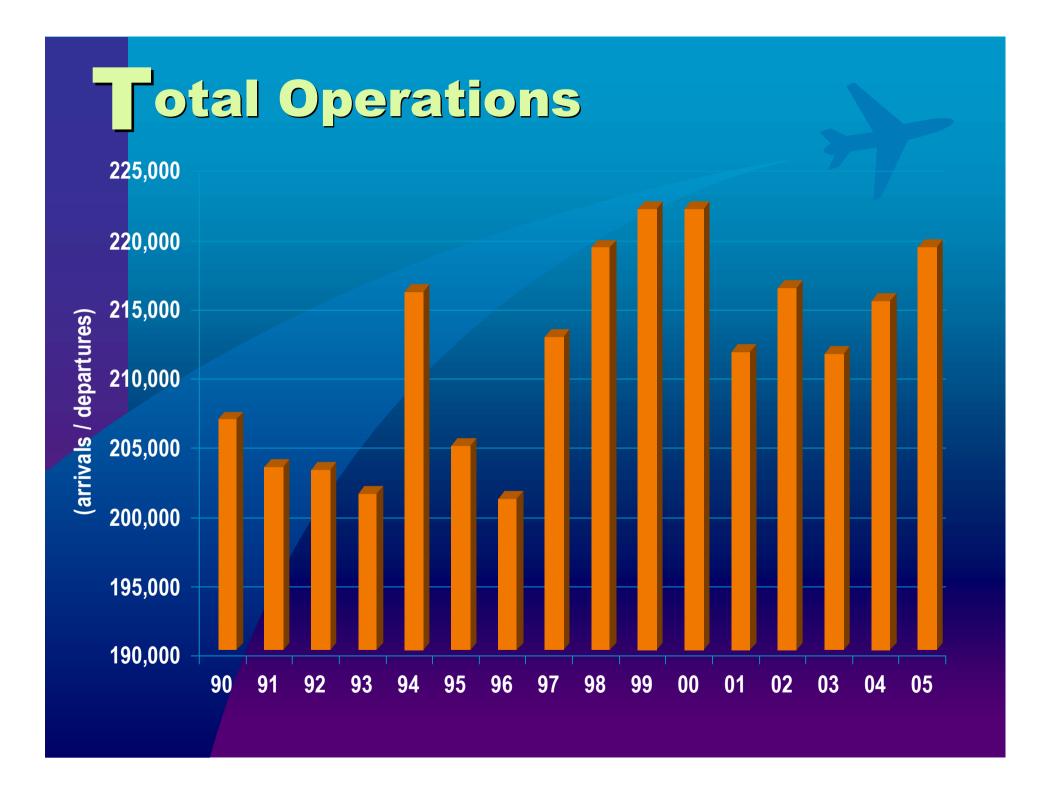
#### Wisconsin Airports 2005 Enplanements



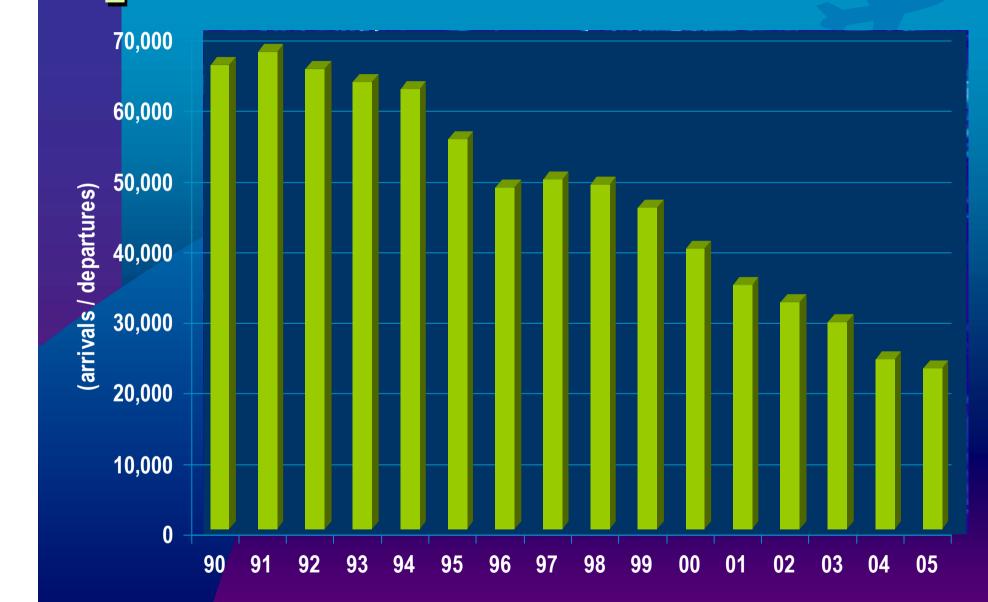


## Wisconsin Airports 2005 Enplaned Cargo (Lbs)

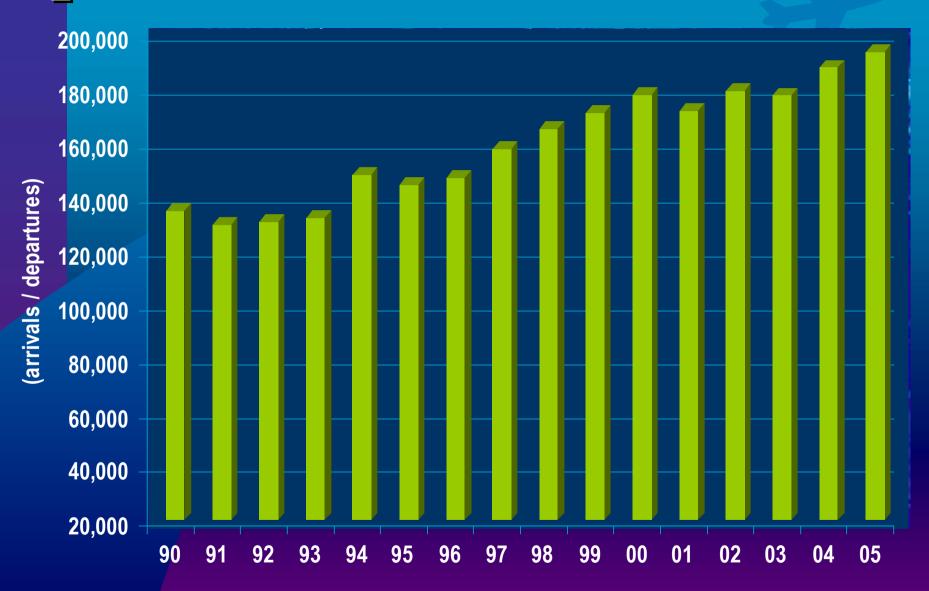


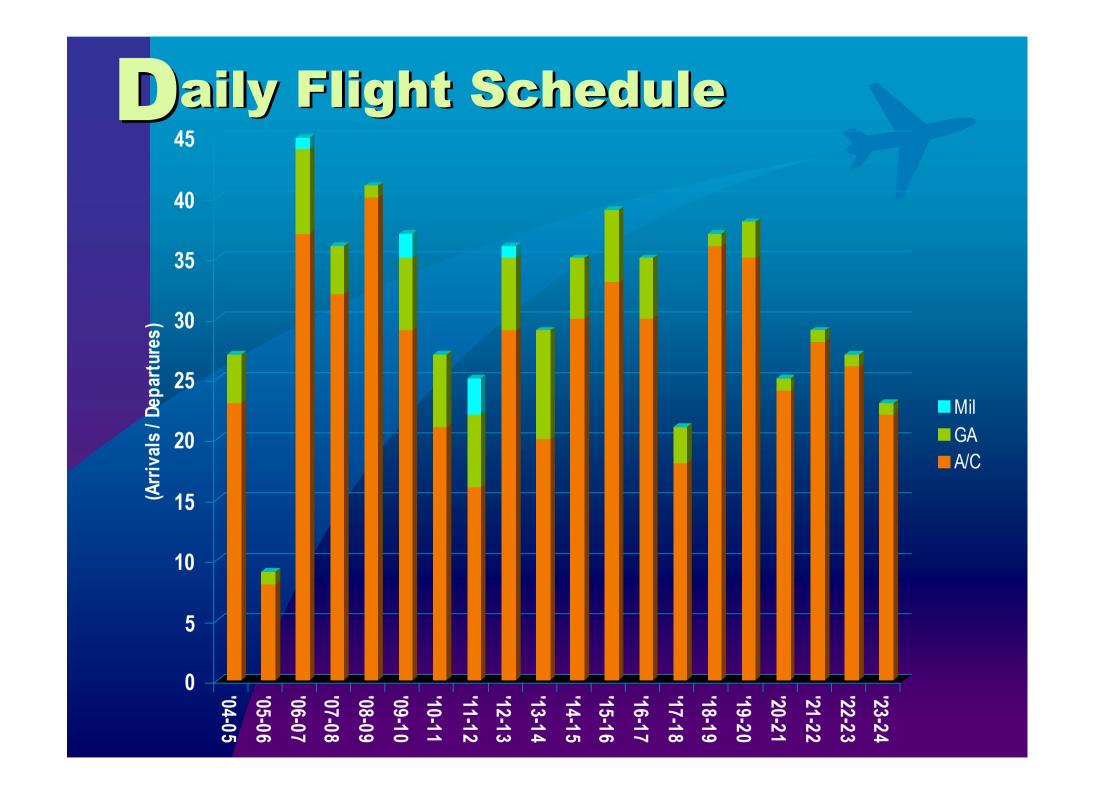

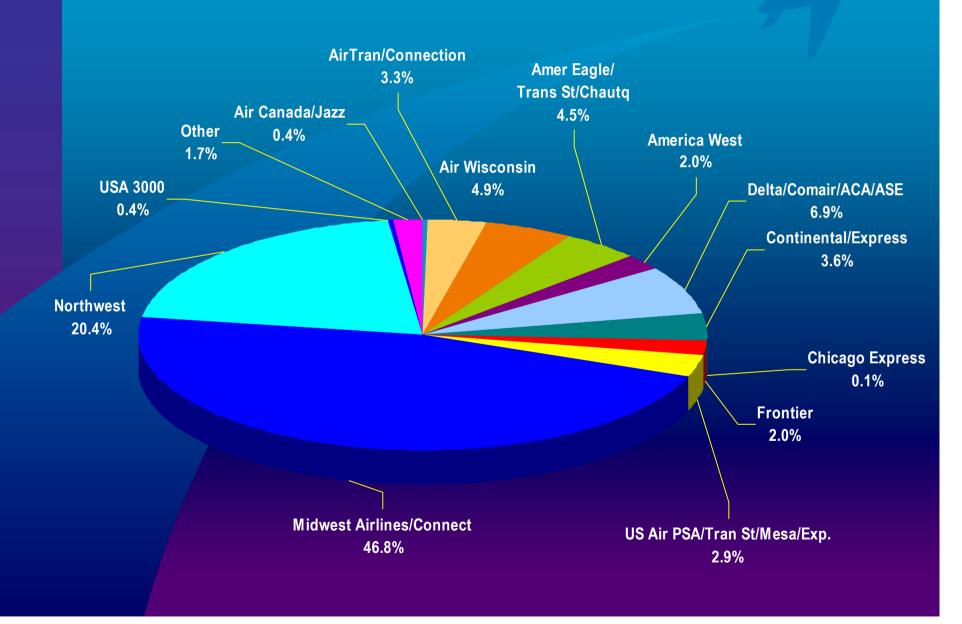

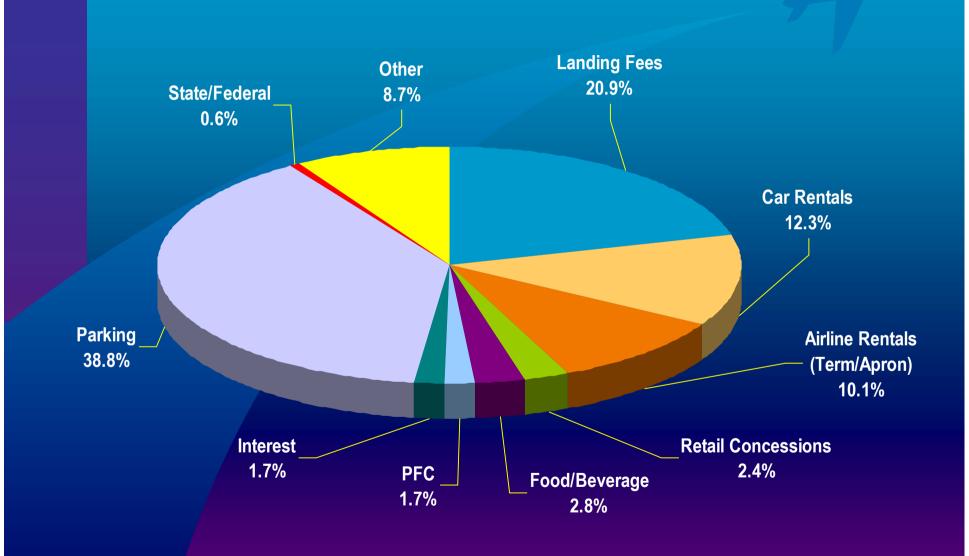

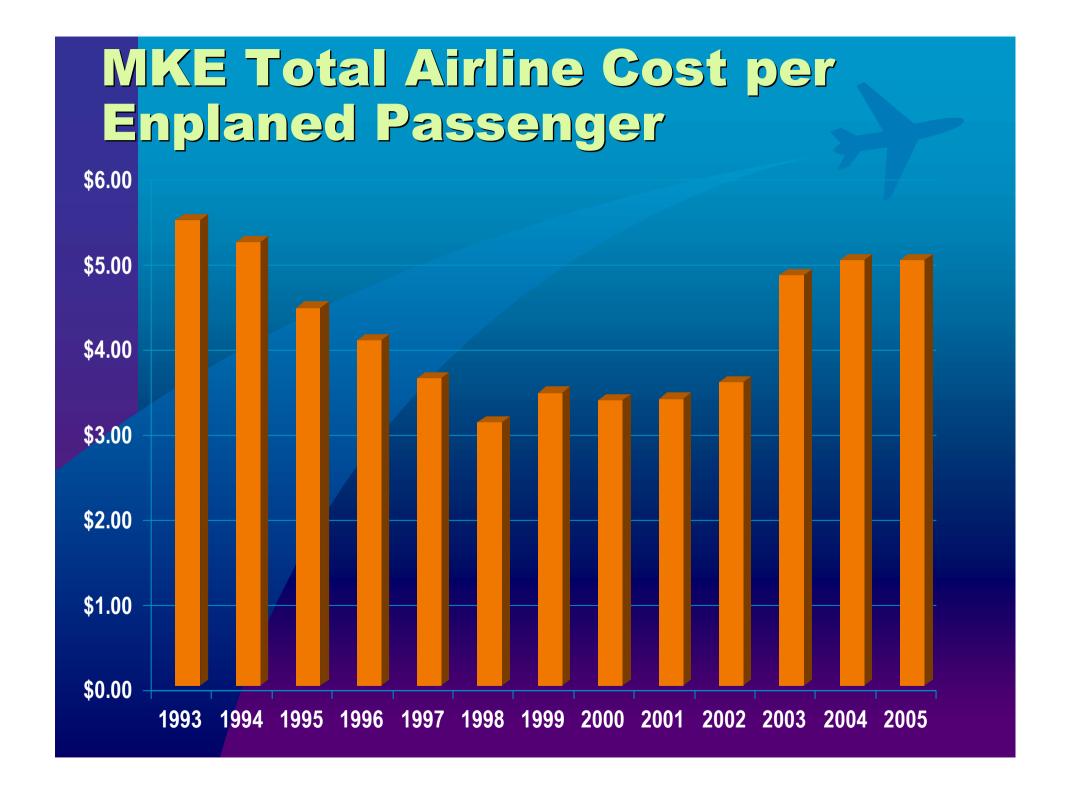


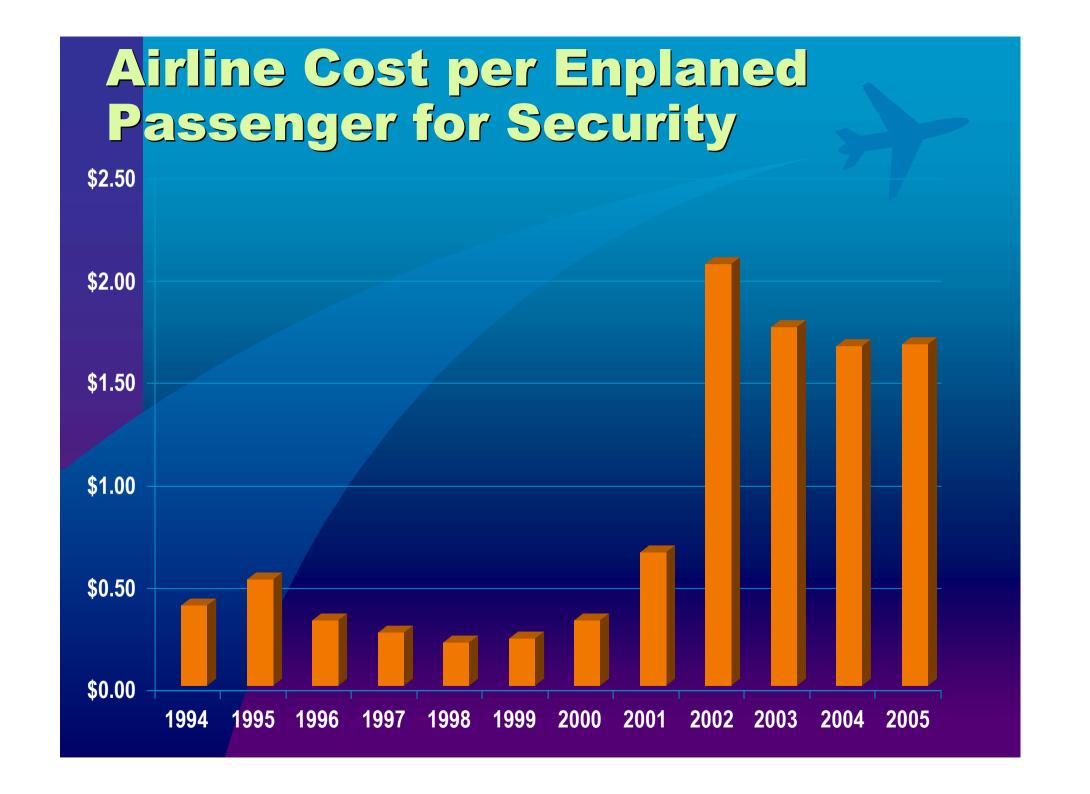




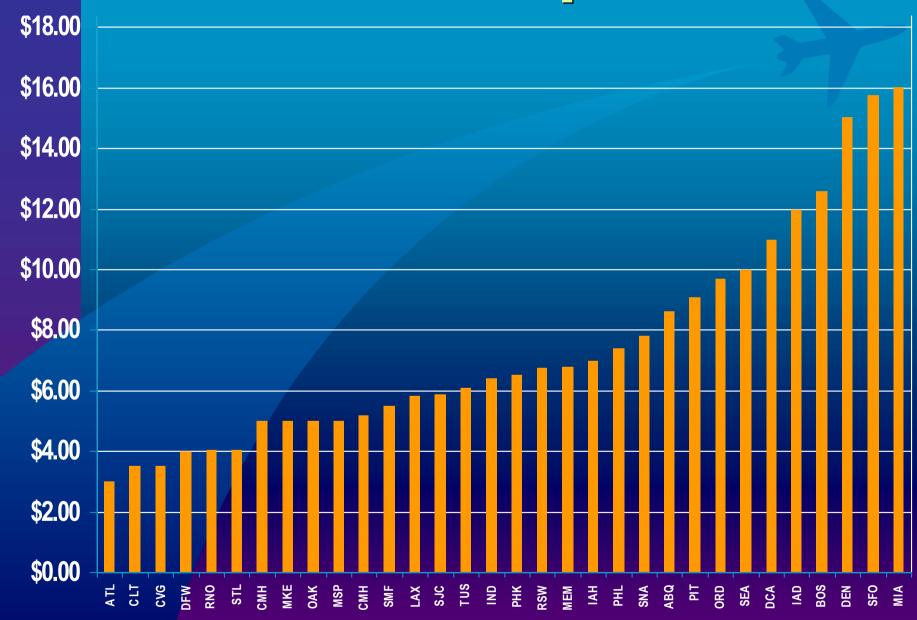
# 2005 Percentage of Airport Fees per Carrier USA 3000
