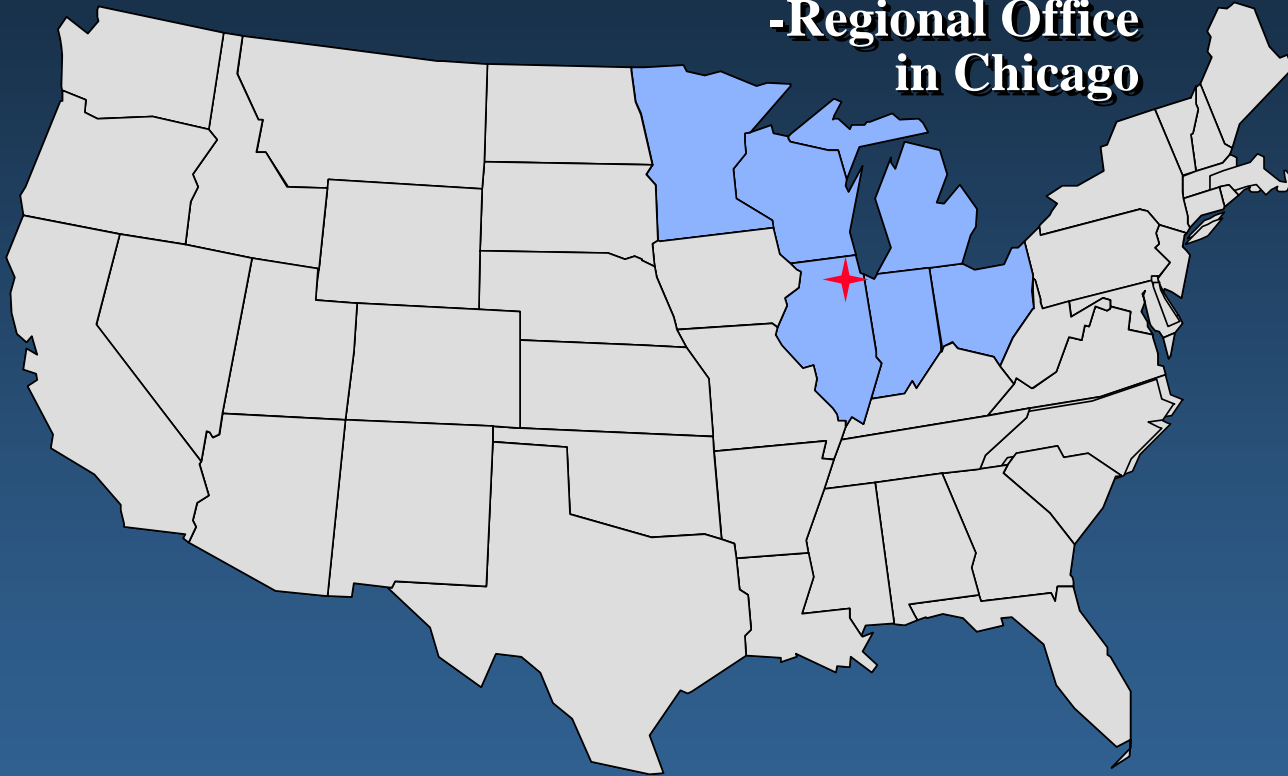

State of Wisconsin Statutes

Chapter 166: Replaced the Wisconsin Civil Defense Act of 1951, organized and defined the powers and duties of the Division of Emergency Management.

“To prepare the state and its subdivisions to cope with emergencies resulting from enemy action and natural or man-made disasters . . . conferring specified powers and duties . . .”

“To assist local units of government and local law enforcement agencies in responding to the emergency”

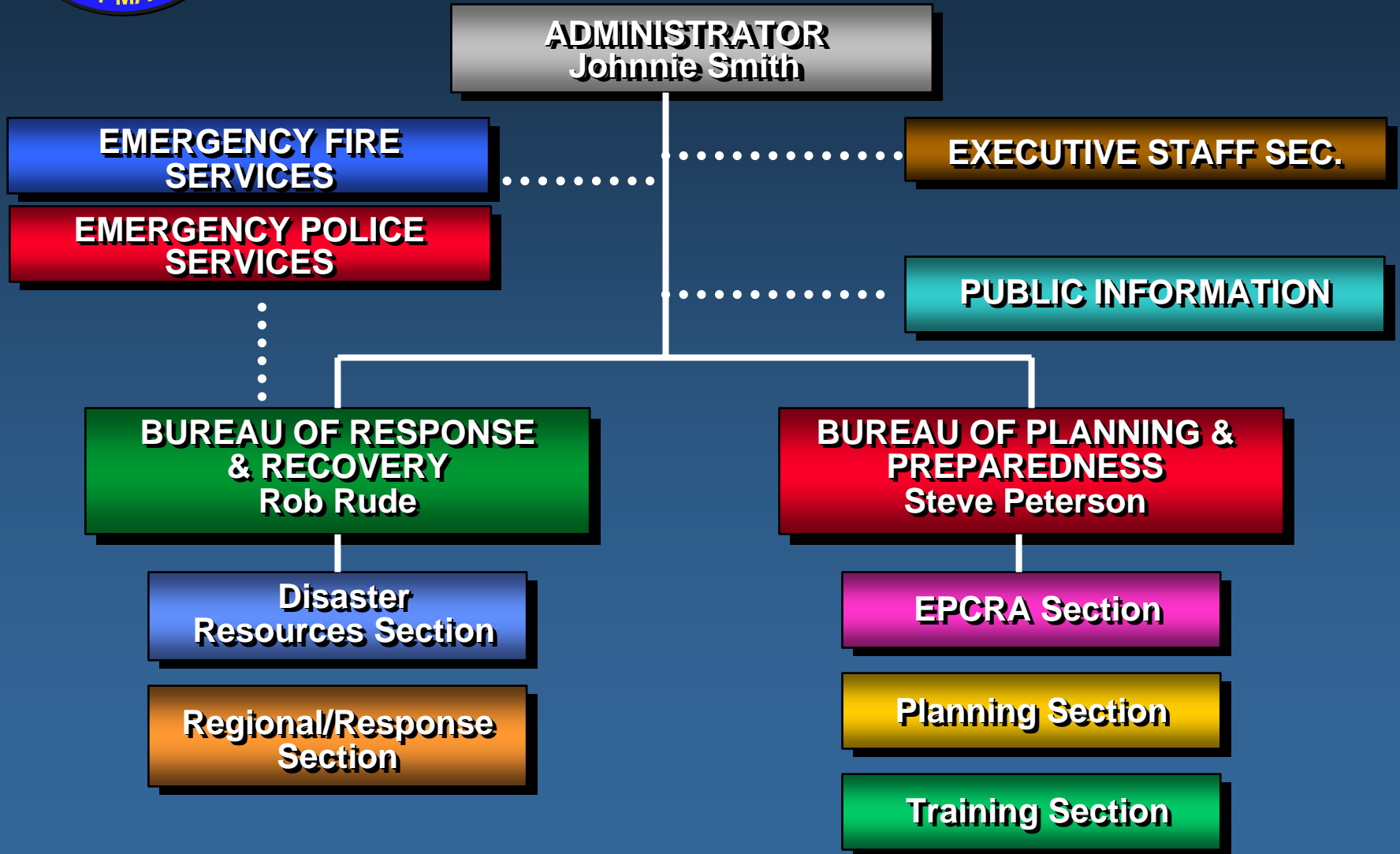

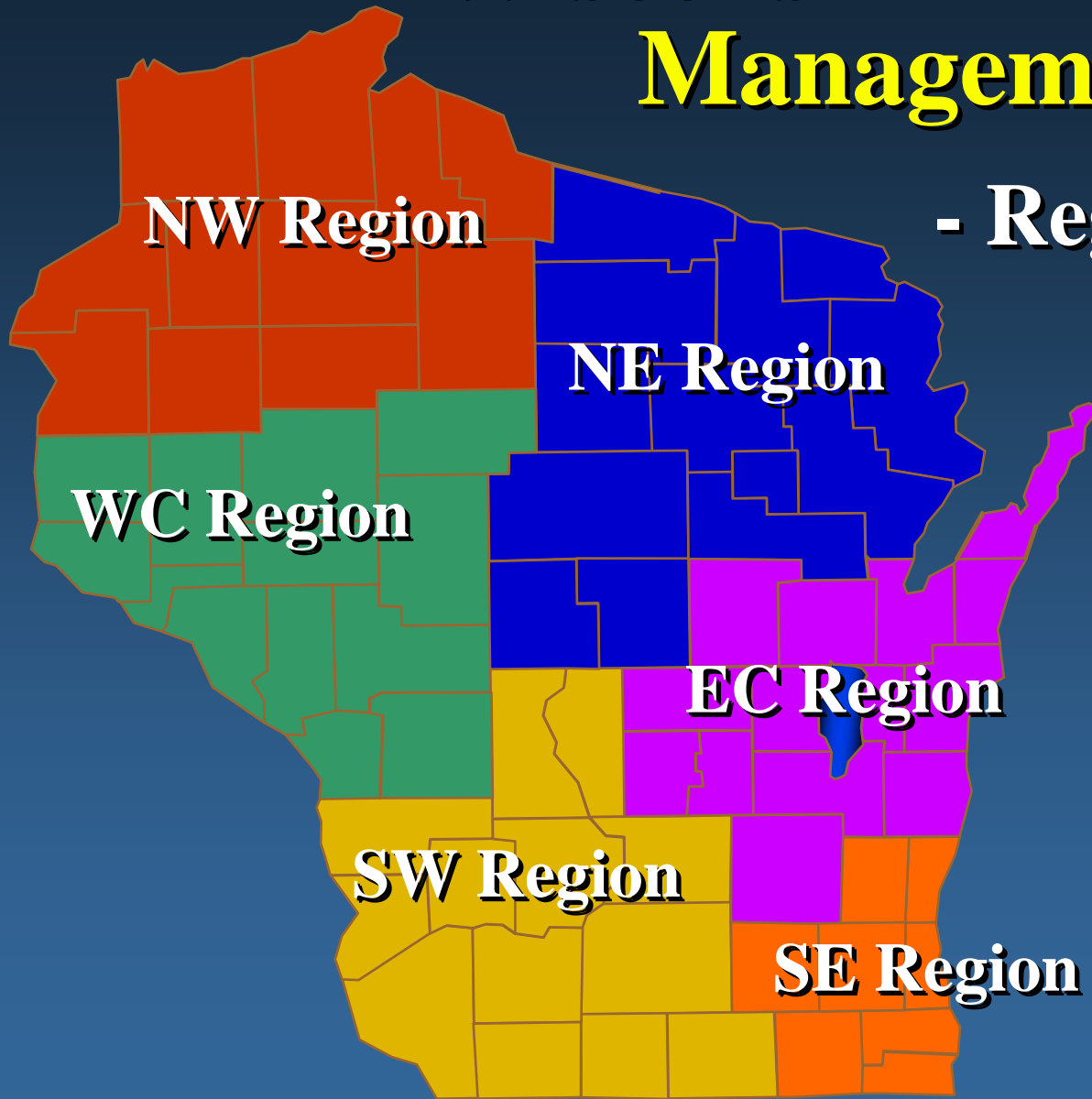




Wisconsin Emergency Management Organization

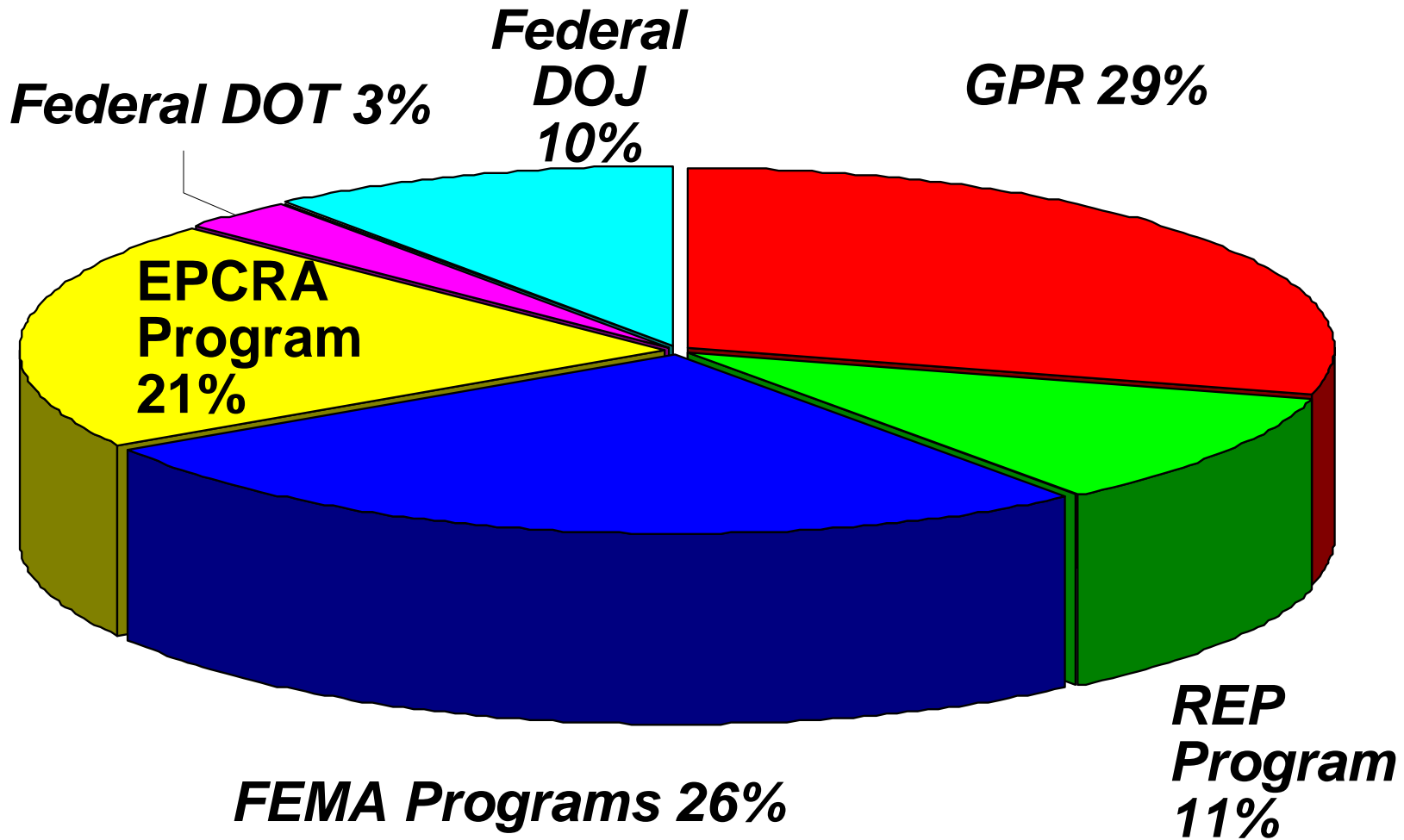

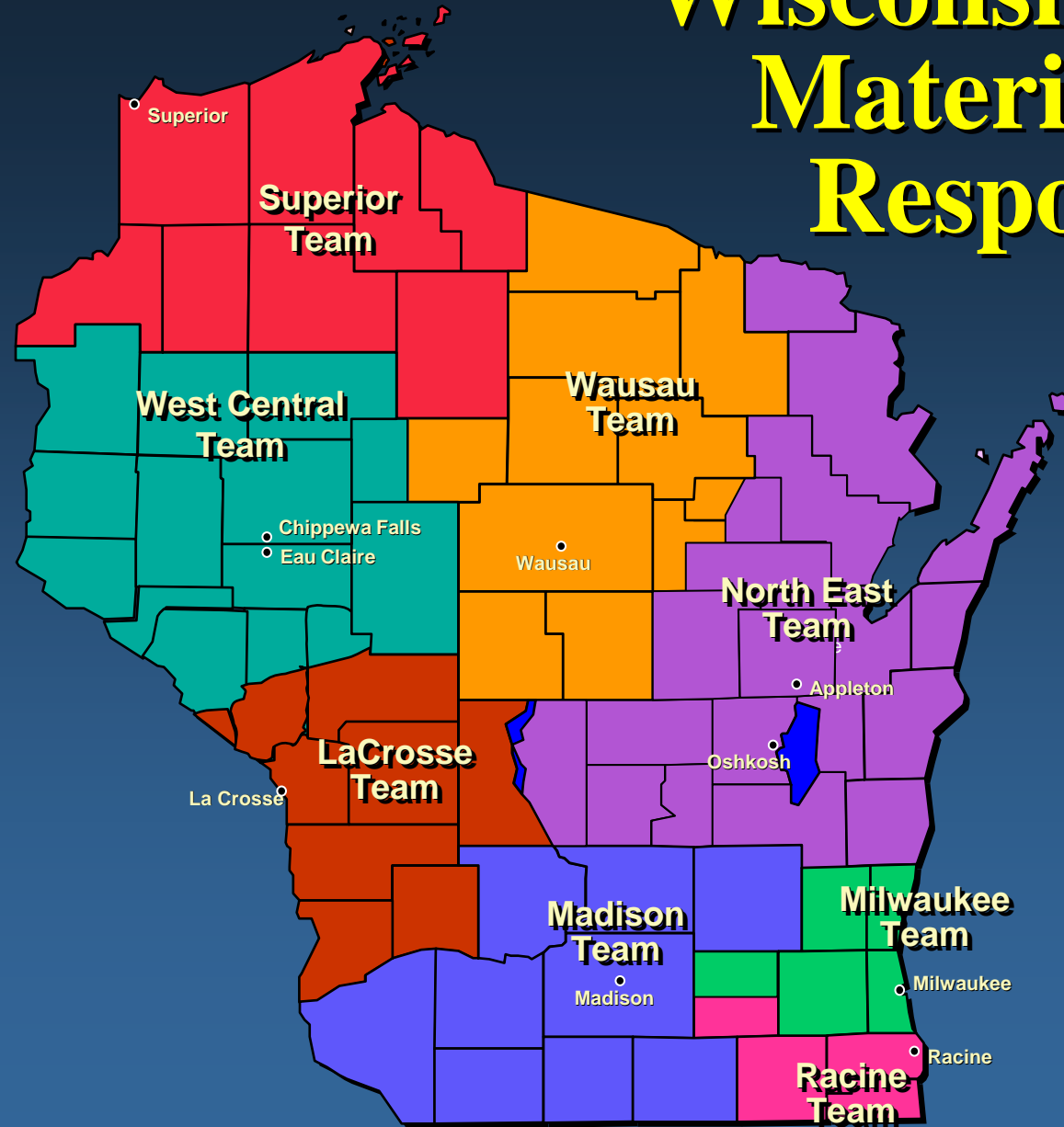

Regional Urban Search & Rescue Task Force Teams

- Four regional teams used for emergency response to catastrophic events
 - Task Force 1 – Milwaukee/Waukesha
 - Task Force 2 – Madison/Janesville/LaCrosse
 - Task Force 3 – Green Bay-Appleton
 - Task Force 4 – Eau Claire-Rhineland-Superior
- Multi-jurisdiction, multi-disciplinary specialty trained first responder team
- Specialties include collapse rescue, confined space, rope rescue, etc.

Mutual Aid Box Alarm System (MABAS)

- A mutual aid mechanism for fire, rescue and EMS
- Provides systematic deployment of personnel/equipment during a multi-jurisdictional or multi-agency emergency response
- Participation is voluntary
- Equipment, personnel or services provided under MABAS are at no charge between municipalities
 - Expenses recovered from responsible parties are equitably distributed

When Disaster Strikes

- Event Occurs - WEM Notified
- County Emergency Management Director Assesses Damage
- Local Governments Declare a State of Emergency & Request Assistance

State Disaster Assistance



- Governor Declares a State of Emergency
- WEM is Lead State Agency and Coordinates State Resources
- WEM contacts DHS/FEMA or other appropriate agencies

Request for Federal Assistance

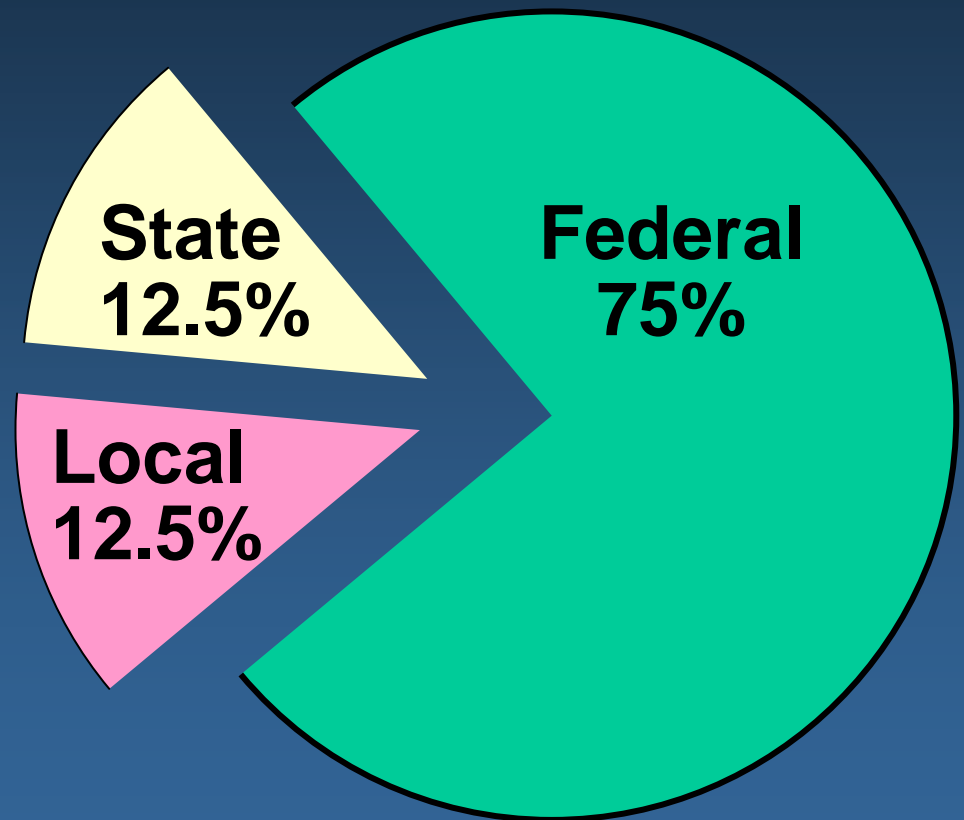
- FEMA, SBA, WEM and Local Officials Conduct a Preliminary Damage Assessment (PDA)
- Governor Requests Federal Disaster Assistance Through FEMA
- Assistance is Approved or Denied
- State Disaster Fund



Federal Disaster Funding

Local Governments

- Since 2000, Wisconsin has received 5 Presidential Disaster Declarations and 1 Snow Emergency
- More than \$70 Million in disaster aid distributed to local governments



State Disaster Fund

- Signed into law April 2006
- Provides up to \$3 Million Annually
- Disaster Assistance is for local governments to recover disaster related costs such as emergency protective measures, road damage and debris removal.
- Cost share is 70% State and 30% Local

Exercising & Training - 2005



- Training Courses Offered – 313 classes with 7,381 Students
- All-Hazards Exercises conducted – 84 with 4,276 participants

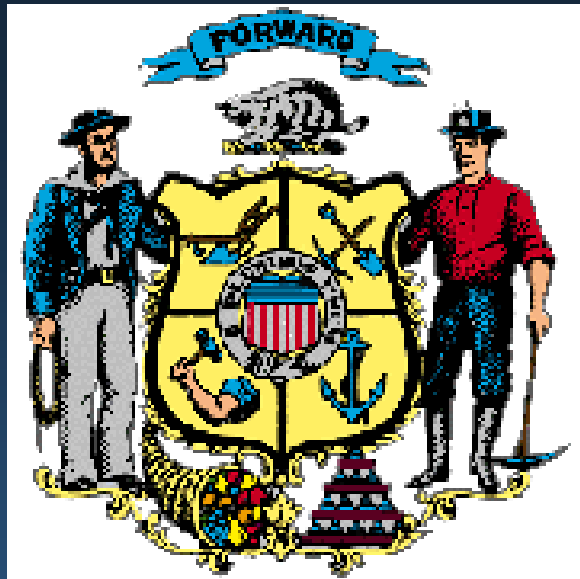
