People who ride ATVs are not welcome to ride their machines across my property any more than they are allowed to ride them into Miller Park or Lambeau Field. But everyone is welcome to walk across my property on the Ice Age Trail.

I understand that the Ice Age Trail has been designated by the legislature as a "State Trail". You need to understand that I oppose, with all the passion I feel for my land, any attempt by the legislature to open the Ice Age Trail to public motorized use.
