



Recent Transfer Agreements and Options between Wisconsin Technical Colleges and University of Wisconsin System Institutions (August 2008 Update)

1. Associate of Arts and/or Associate of Science Degree

- Chippewa Valley Technical College/UW-Eau Claire/UW-Stout/UW-River Falls

This program is a collaborative associate of science (AS) degree between Chippewa Valley Technical College and three UW four-year institutions located in the region. Students complete two-thirds of the coursework at Chippewa Valley and the remaining one-third at a UW campus.

- Western Technical College/UW-La Crosse

This program (proposed for UW Board of Regent approval in August 2008) is a collaborative associate of science (AS) degree between Western Technical College at La Crosse and UW-La Crosse. Students will complete two-thirds of the coursework at Western and the remaining one-third at UW-La Crosse.

- Western Technical College/UW-Richland/UW-Baraboo

The Western Technical College district and the UW Colleges have developed 1+1 degree offerings between the Western campus in Viroqua and UW-Richland and the Western campus in Mauston and UW-Baraboo. Similar 1+1 agreements also exist between other Wisconsin Technical Colleges and the UW Colleges campus in the region.

2. Bachelor of Applied Studies Degrees

UW-Green Bay and UW-Oshkosh offer Bachelor of Applied Studies degrees. These degree programs enable students to transfer 60 credits from a WTCS applied associate degree program toward a UW bachelor's degree.

3. New Program Transfer Agreements

The Wisconsin Technical College System (WTCS) now offers a statewide applied associate degree (AAD) in early childhood education. UW-La Crosse, UW-Oshkosh, UW-River Falls, UW-Stevens Point, UW-Stout, and UW-Whitewater have implemented agreements enabling students with this AAD to transfer into an Early-Middle Childhood bachelor degree program with advanced standing.

4. UW-Madison Connections Program

Students in the Connections program are offered dual admission at certain partner institutions (e.g., UW Colleges, Madison Area Technical College) and transition to UW-Madison as a junior. In 2008-09, this program is expanding to include dual admission at UW-Green Bay, UW-Parkside, UW-River Falls, UW-Stevens Point, and UW-Stout.
