

Notes about Emergency Detention Data

- Data source: Human Services Reporting System (HSRS).
- These are emergency detentions (ED's) recorded by the county public mental health system only.
- Some counties reported no ED's through the HSRS, but this does not mean that they didn't conduct any emergency detentions.
- The "% change" in Figures 2-3 is the difference in ED's between SFY2009 and SFY2010 divided by the SFY2009 ED's.

in Wisconsin**

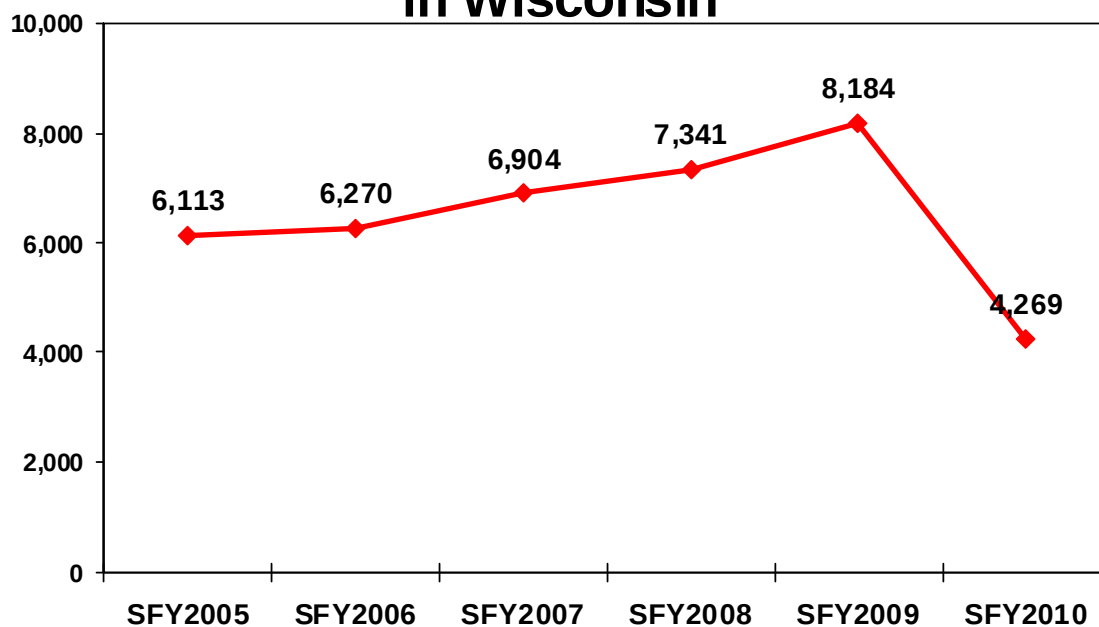
