Roads – As managed for County business

These 4 counties have:

- well-established and highly regarded GIS,
- many business applications using this data,
- are on the same coordinate system, and
- are within the same RPC

They are considered better established in their GIS, and in their cross-jurisdictional coordination, than many other counties.

Notable in this representation:

- The information 'within' individual county boundaries is perfect and valid from an incounty business perspective.
- Gaps and overlaps exist at jurisdictional boundaries
 - Creates confusing (who owns what?) picture.
- Routing emergency vehicles into another jurisdiction will not work when road names differ and geometries are not connected.
- The image only shows roads
 - Compound the problem when adding flood zones, school districts, railroads and other emergency considerations to the picture.

The questions:

Do we put the burden of adjusting data items and spatial representation, for statewide NG911 use, on the county or on the state? Who and Where?
