Alcohol & Drug Review Unit (ADRU)

Assessments, driver safety plans and status reports are sent directly to the ADRU electronically via the Wisconsin Assessment Program (WASP).

Implementation activities of the WASP enhancement to date:

- April 16 A request was sent to WisDOT IT to enhance the WASP in order to accommodate additional assessment agencies
- May 8 Meeting with DHS to coordinate training and implementation dates
- July 17 Charter review for WASP enhancement with WisDOT IT
- July 18 WASP enhancement project detail meeting
- August 12 WASP enhancement testing begins
- August 28 Proposed WASP enhancement launch date

DSP Web Applications

The two web applications that were launched in January, 2013, were specifically designed for Wisconsin assessment agencies. Both applications are at no cost to authorized private and public Wisconsin assessment agencies. The DSP-BAC Inquiry Report is a driver's record that focuses only on alcohol/drug related entries. The WASP provides pre-populated forms, real-time validation of data and electronic submittal directly to ADRU.

Authorization Request and Training

A DMV Inquiry System Access Request (MV3751) and a WAMS ID will be needed to access both programs. Training for these programs is scheduled to be conducted on August 28th, the last day of the IDP-AT training being held in Keshena.

For those assessors and support staff not able to attend the training in Keshena, contact Dale Simon, ADRU Supervisor, to schedule training. Allow approximately 3 hours for training.
