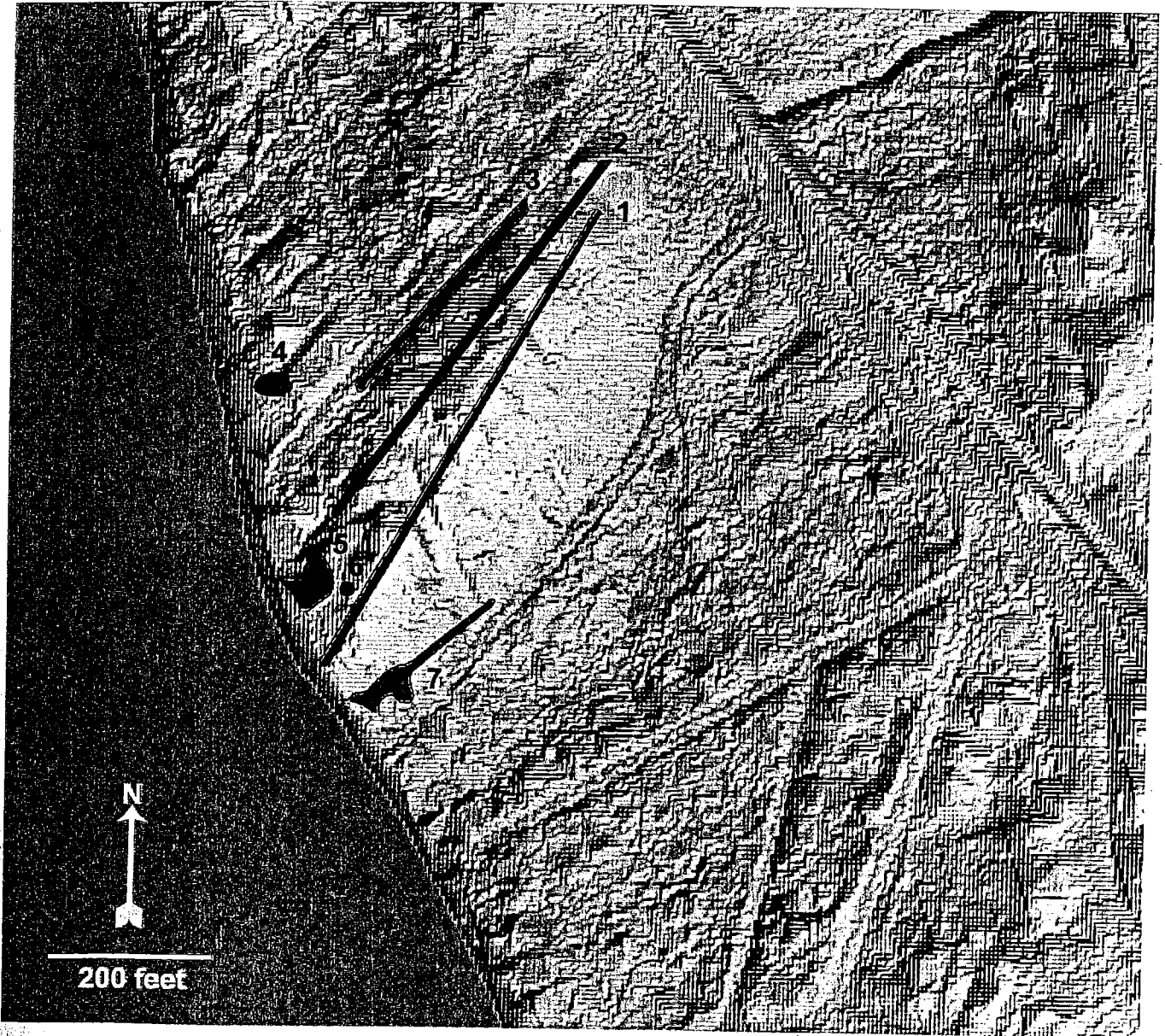


Figure Seven: LiDAR imagery of Edwards Park site area, with 1914 McLachlan map of mounds overlain. Compare to Figure Six.

In accordance with my responsibilities under s. 157.70(2)(a) Wis. Stats., on October 15, 1990 I added a burial site located on your property in the Village of McFarland, Dane County, Wisconsin into the state's catalog of burial sites.

This action is the result of a state-wide effort to inventory, catalog, and protect all known historic and prehistoric burial sites in Wisconsin.

I have enclosed a copy s. 157.70, Wis. Stats. which explains the State Historical Society's new responsibilities in protecting burial sites in this state. While I suggest that you examine all of the provisions in these statutes, as the owner of the property, you should be particularly interested in:

- The amendment of s. 70.11(13) (property tax exemption, p.3).
- Creation of s. 157.70(2) (director's duties, p. 4).
- S. 157.70(2r) (site disturbance prohibited, p. 5).
- S. 157.70(5) (procedure for cataloged burial site, pp. 5-6).
- S. 157.70(7-10) (action by Attorney General, remedies, preservation of rights, and penalties, p. 7).

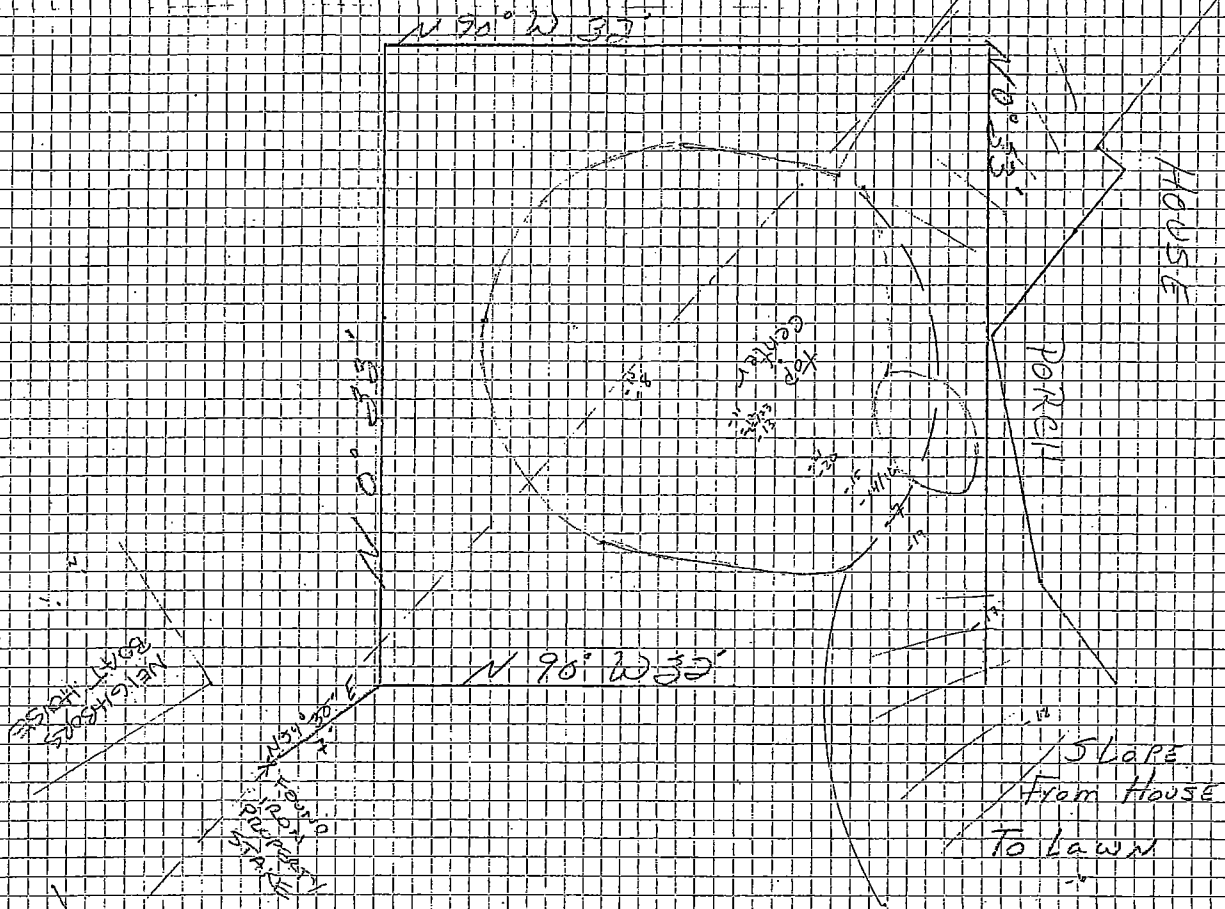

APPROXIMATE PROPERTY LINE

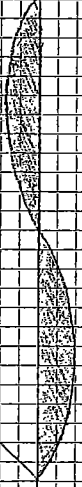

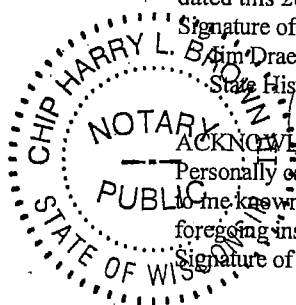

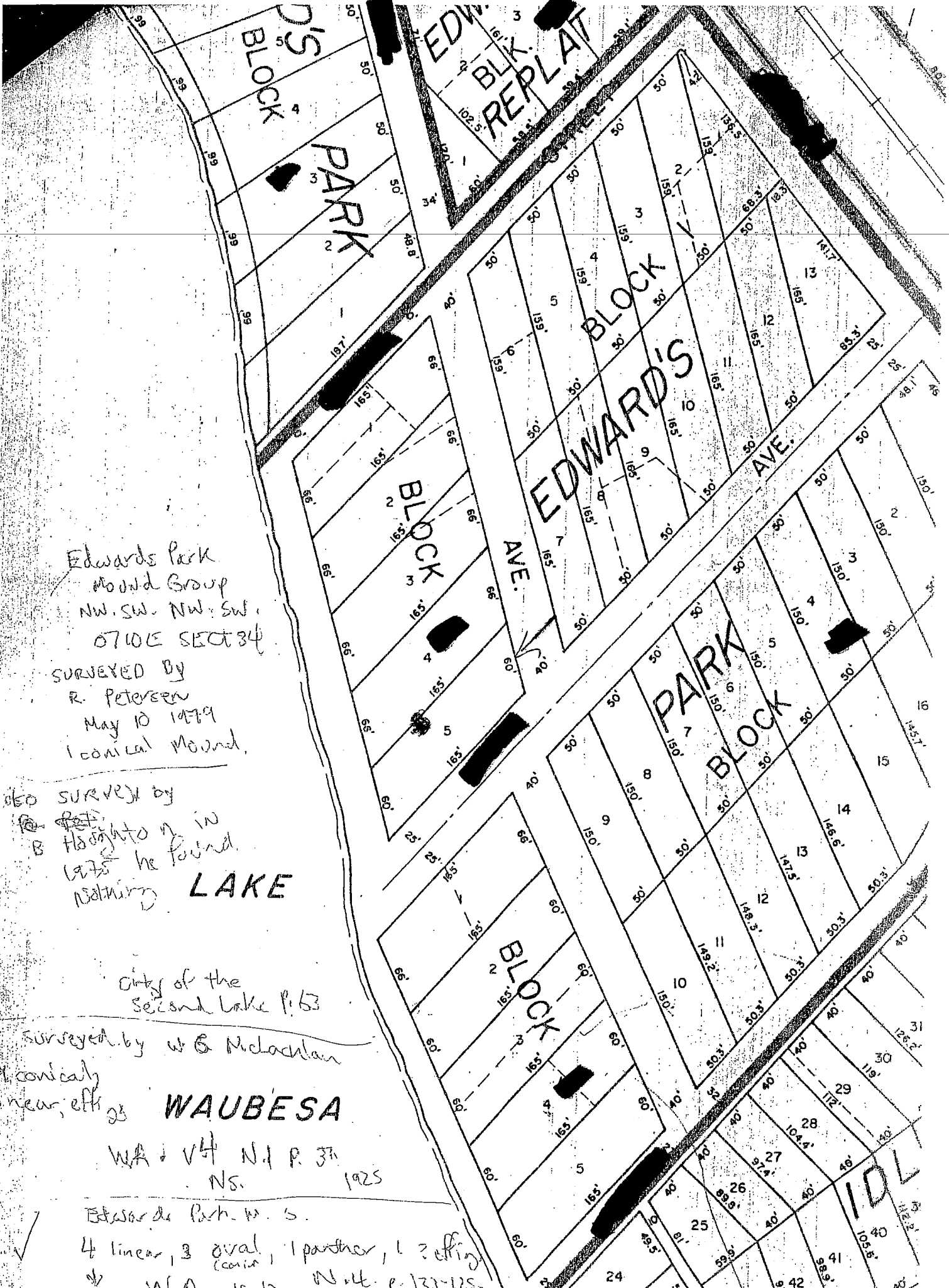
The mound is approximately 31 feet long, 2-3 feet high, and 20 feet wide. It seems to be shaped like a turtle shell.

The mound you are referring to is part of the original Edwards Park Mound Group first surveyed by W. G. McLachlan in 1906. The site, recorded with the State Historical Society as 47-Da-44, originally consisted of four linear mounds, three conical (oval) mounds, one panther mound, and one effigy mound of unknown shape. The site was surveyed again by McLachlan in 1925, and in 1975 by B. Houghton, who failed to locate any of the original nine mounds. The site was most recently surveyed in May of 1979 by R. Peterson, and this investigator located one conical mound. The turtle effigy you have reported could represent a previously unrecorded feature of the group. I have enclosed a section of McLachlan's 1912 Report on the mounds of the Lake Waubesa region for your perusal. There are two other references to investigations concerned with the Edwards Park Group that I cannot access at present, but I will send copies of these to you as soon as they are available. I have also enclosed an article which gives an overview of the Effigy Mound Culture in Wisconsin and a copy of Wisconsin's new burial law. Our office would also greatly appreciate any additional information you have concerning the mound's condition, etc., and if possible a photograph of the mound for our records.

The Burial Sites Preservation Board is now in the process of creating administrative rules for our program's procedures, and the process for cataloging burial sites. At present, a rough draft of the rules concerned with mounds allows for the cataloging of only those individual mounds or mound groups known to contain, or to have contained burials. For example: if one of the nine mounds of the Edwards Park Grove was known to have contained a burial, then any of the other mounds in the group could also be considered a burial site. All of the other mounds would be eligible for cataloging, even if the mound originally referenced as containing a burial, had since been destroyed.

Thank you for contacting us regarding possible construction work at [REDACTED], McFarland, WI. As you noted in your phone one conical Indian burial mound has been identified on the property. This mound is part of the Edward's Park Mound Group (DA-44). I have enclosed a sketch map of the mound and its relationship to the existing structures on the lot. As we discussed on the phone, there must be a 5.0 ft. buffer between the base of the mound and any ground disturbing activities. We would suggest that if possible you and the owner maintain a wider buffer simply because it makes it less likely the mound and buffer will be accidentally disturbed and makes it easier to do maintenance on the building.

We will be glad to visit the site and mark the base of the mound and the buffer.

Please note that you and the owner will have to keep us informed as your planning moves forward. No ground disturbing activities can occur on the lot without the Wisconsin Historical Society's involvement.

Under Wisconsin law, Native American burial mounds, unmarked burials, and all marked and unmarked cemeteries are protected from intentional disturbance. If anyone suspects that a Native American burial mound or an unmarked or marked burial is present in an area, the Wisconsin Historical Society should be notified.

If human bone is unearthed during any phase of a project, **all work must cease**, and the Wisconsin Historical Society **must be contacted** at 1-800-342-7834 to be in compliance with Wis. Stat. § 157.70 which provides for the protection of all human burial sites. **Work cannot resume until the Wisconsin Historical Society gives permission.** If you have any questions concerning the law, please contact the Wisconsin Historical Society at 1-800-342-7834.

I am attaching a draft of the report for my visit to your property. I've added a potential cataloging boundary to the map of the site. If you are OK with this boundary, I'll go ahead and begin the cataloging process. Please also note that it looks like you have an effigy mound! When I overlaid the old map of the site on the current imagery, a somewhat damaged effigy remnant fell directly over the mound in your back yard, so I was mistaken in identifying it as part of one of the linear mounds. The mound is still about 1000 years old and is still considered a burial mound, so there is still potential for a property tax reduction associated with the site.

While I was on site, I did notice that a 'for sale' sign had been installed in the mound by your realtor. As the report notes, this sign will need to be removed very, very carefully. Ideally, we'd ask to have it cut off flush with the ground surface so as to not disturb the mound any further. I'll also ask that you make the realtor aware that the mound shouldn't be disturbed by any future signage, etc.

Thank you for sending the photos. They were very helpful, and sped up the time it took to get the draft report completed.
