2017 SENATE BILL 28

February 8, 2017 - Introduced by JOINT LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL. Referred to Committee on Health and Human Services.

1 **AN ACT to amend** 256.15 (10); and **to create** 256.15 (8) (cm) of the statutes;
2 **relating to:** licensure or certificate renewal for certain emergency medical
3 services personnel.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

JOINT LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL PREFATORY NOTE: This bill was prepared for the Joint Legislative Council's Study Committee on Volunteer Firefighter and Emergency Medical Technician (EMT) Shortages.

Under current law, a certified first responder or licensed EMT or paramedic must renew the credential every two years. The law directs the Department of Health Services (DHS) to promulgate rules specifying the continuing education, examination, and other administrative requirements for the renewal. Under those rules, the continuing education requirements vary based upon the certification and licensure level, and, for some licensure levels, may be satisfied through examination by the National Registry of Emergency Medical Technicians.
