## **2019 BILL**

### Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

# The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

JOINT LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL PREFATORY NOTE: This bill was prepared for the Joint Legislative Council's Study Committee on the Investment and Use of the School Trust Funds. Key provisions of the bill are summarized below.

#### Common School Fund

Current law identifies certain moneys as constituting the income of the Common School Fund (CSF), and provides that all CSF income is to be directed into the "School Library Aids" appropriation. Annually by January 10, the state superintendent must apportion the school library aids among the school districts, based on an estimate of the

amount of funds that will be available in the "School Library Aids" appropriation on the following April 15. The state superintendent must then certify the apportionment to the Department of Administration (DOA), and must notify each school district of the estimated distribution amounts. On or before May 1 of each year, DOA must distribute library aid in one payment to each school district, based on the amount of funds in the "School Library Aids" appropriation on April 15.

This bill repeals the provisions identifying certain moneys as constituting the income of the CSF, and it instead authorizes the Board of Commissioners of Public Lands (BCPL) to distribute, invest, or accumulate any moneys that are distributable. Annually by January 1, the BCPL must report to the state superintendent whether a distribution for the current year will be made, and, if so, the amount to be distributed. By January 10, the state superintendent must apportion the amount reported by the BCPL among the school districts, certify the apportionment to DOA, and notify each school district of the amounts. On or before May 1 of each year, DOA must distribute library aid in one payment to each school district, in the amounts that the state superintendent certified to DOA.

#### Normal School Fund

Current law provides that all income and interest of the Normal School Fund (NSF) is to be directed into the "Environmental Program Grants and Scholarships" appropriation for the University of Wisconsin System. From this appropriation, the Board of Regents must: (1) annually make need-based grants totaling \$100,000 to certain eligible students; (2) provide annual scholarships totaling \$100,000 to certain eligible students; (3) provide \$300,000 to UW-Stevens Point for environmental programs; and (4) use any remaining funds in the appropriation to merit award scholarships in the amount of \$5,000 each to certain eligible students.

The bill repeals the requirement that all income and interest of the NSF be directed into the "Environmental Program Grants and Scholarships" appropriation. Instead, it authorizes the BCPL to distribute, invest, or accumulate any NSF moneys that are distributable. The bill provides that, if the amount that the BCPL determines to distribute is insufficient for the Board of Regents to make the awards listed in categories one through three above, the Board of Regents may determine the total amount to be awarded in each category, up to the amounts specified above.

#### University Fund and Agricultural College Fund

The bill authorizes the BCPL to distribute, invest, or accumulate any moneys that are distributable out of the University and Agricultural College Funds.

## Standard of Prudence for Determining Whether to Distribute or Accumulate Fund Moneys

For each of the four funds, the bill requires that, in determining whether to distribute or accumulate moneys, the BCPL must act in good faith, with the care that an ordinarily prudent person in a like position would exercise under similar circumstances, and must consider, if relevant, the factors regarding distribution and accumulation set forth in the Uniform Prudent Management of Institutional Funds Act (UPMIFA). The factors are: (1) the duration and preservation of the fund; (2) the purposes of the fund; (3) general economic conditions; (4) the possible effect of inflation or deflation; (5) the expected total return from income and the appreciation of investments; (6) other resources of beneficiaries; and (7) the investment policy for the fund.

No later than January 1 of each year, the board shall report to the state superintendent of public instruction whether a distribution for the current school year will be made and, if so, the amount of the distribution. In making a determination to distribute or accumulate under this section, the board shall act in good faith, with the care that an ordinarily prudent person in a like position would exercise under similar circumstances, and shall consider, if relevant, the factors under s. 112.11 (4) (a) 1. to 7. **Section 5.** 24.80 of the statutes is renumbered 24.80 (1). **Section 6.** 24.80 (2) of the statutes is created to read: 24.80 (2) The board may distribute, invest, or accumulate distributable normal school fund moneys. No later than January 1 of each year, the board shall determine whether an annual distribution will be made and, if so, the amount of the

distribution. In making a determination to distribute or accumulate under this

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subsection, the board shall act in good faith, with the care that an ordinarily prudent person in a like position would exercise under similar circumstances, and shall consider, if relevant, the factors under s. 112.11 (4) (a) 1. to 7.

- **SECTION 7.** 24.81 of the statutes is renumbered 24.81 (1).
- **SECTION 8.** 24.81 (2) of the statutes is created to read:
  - 24.81 (2) The board may distribute, invest, or accumulate distributable university fund moneys. In making a determination to distribute or accumulate under this subsection, the board shall act in good faith, with the care that an ordinarily prudent person in a like position would exercise under similar circumstances, and shall consider, if relevant, the factors under s. 112.11 (4) (a) 1. to 7.
    - **Section 9.** 24.83 of the statutes is created to read:
  - **24.83 Agricultural college fund distributions.** The board may distribute, invest, or accumulate distributable agricultural college fund moneys. In making a determination to distribute or accumulate under this section, the board shall act in good faith, with the care that an ordinarily prudent person in a like position would exercise under similar circumstances, and shall consider, if relevant, the factors under s. 112.11 (4) (a) 1. to 7.
  - **Section 10.** 25.17 (1) (o) of the statutes is repealed.
- 20 **SECTION 11.** 36.49 of the statutes is renumbered 36.49 (1m), and 36.49 (1m) (d), as renumbered, is amended to read:
  - 36.49 (1m) (d) Award the balance in annual scholarships called "Wisconsin Merit scholarships," which shall be based only on merit, to students who are enrolled in an institution or college campus and who have either graduated from high school in this state or been granted a high school diploma by the administrator of a

(b) The department of administration shall distribute each school district's aid entitlement in one payment on or before May 1. The amount paid to each school district shall be based upon the amount in the appropriation account under s. 20.255 (2) (s) on April 15.

(c) Moneys distributed under this section may be expended only for the purchase of instructional materials from the state historical society for use in teaching Wisconsin history and for the purchase of library books and other instructional materials for school libraries, but not for public library facilities operated by school districts under s. 43.52, in accordance with rules promulgated by the state superintendent. In addition, a A school district may use the moneys received under this section to purchase school library computers and related software if the school board consults with the person who supervises the school district's libraries and the computers and software are housed in the school library. Appropriate records of all purchases under this section paragraph shall be kept and necessary reports thereon related to the purchases shall be made to the state superintendent.

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
